Colorado. He knows him as a partner with JIMADI MARIA in the Tami-ami Bar in Huntington Park, California. He has had very little contact with ANTISTA and was introduced to him as a member by the former deceased Boss FRANK DESIMONE.

To the informants knowledge his partner JIM DI MARIA is not an LCN member.

The informant recalled that in early July, 1965, he received orders from his Capo JOE ADAMO of San Diego to proceed to the Tami-ami Bar and meet with member ANTISTA. At that time he had visiting with him, in San Diego, ION Capo FRANKIA PORTE of Chicago and LA PORTE's brother-in-law.

ANTISTA that he was to take informant to a winery in Cucamonga, California, where FRANK DESIMONE was waiting for him. Open orders from DESIMONE he had to leave LA PORTE and his brother-in-law waiting in the bar while ANTISTA took the informant to Cucamonga. He held a meeting with DESIMONE, JOE DIPOLITYO and NICK LICATA at which time DESIMONE gave him a murder contract on ANDY LOCOCO owner of the Cockatoo Inn in Hawthorne, California. DESIMONE claimed LOCOCO had "turned copper". The informant upon reflecting back believes DESIMONE attempted unsuccessfully to extort money from LOCOCO and for this reason wanted him killed.

He stated that with DES MONE now dead, no one an the family to his knowledge has any intention of going through with that contract.

He recalled ANTISTA as a nervous man, was always looking over his shoulder, and worried about being surveilled. He could not furnish any pertinent background knowledge on him at this time.
