Department of Justice advised that it had been advised by the Federal Aviation Agency that subject's pilot's certificate had been revoked by order dated May 26, 1960, by reason of the leaflet-dropping flight over Cuba in which subject was engaged in October, 1959.

On August 4, 1960, JOSEPH THURMAN, Investigator, Immigration and Naturalization Service, MINS)
