Enclosed for the Bureau are six copies of each of three letterhead memoranda and two copies of each for Miami. These memoranda are based on notes handwritten in Spanish by subject and translated by SA RICHARD J. These notes were turned over to SA MICHAEL H. FARRIN by subject on October 7, 1960.

The enclosed letterhead memoranda are classified confidential since the information set forth might possibly disclose the identity of source who may have continuing value and thus compromise his future effectiveness.

At the same time, subject furnished another note handwritten in Spanish which consisted of a brief account of his connection with the Cuban Office of Naval Intelligence and which, as translated by SA GILLETT is as follows:

"The OfNOT extrongral Intelligence, Cuban Navy, was 187 OCT e281186 September, 1952. Its first chief was Lt. Senor JUAN PONS GOIZUETA, who was discharged from his position in June, 1801 953, because, according to the Chief of Merchant Marine, some businessmen from Rio Almendares in Havana complained about having to pay him for favors. He was transferred to a Coast Guard boat named '20 of May,' then later to

RELEASE OF DIA INFORMATION IDIA MARGARITA THUERTA TYMENDOZA TO IN THIS DOCUMENT. 7-24-97 engaged in intelligence work for the Cuban Government prior to January, 1959, advised as follows: LIDIA MARGARITA HUERTA Y MENDOZA, also known as "Maggie," thirty-five years, 150 pounds, shrewd and business-like, is divorced from PEDEO DIAZ LANZ, by whom she had three children. She passes as a nurse and has been involved in smuggling of arms and many other such activities since 1953. In 1958 she married a Cuban Navy pilot named OSCAR PAGES She receives a salary from the Castro Government and associates with numerous Communist officials of the Castro Government. Her friendship with JUAN CASTINEIRAS helped her in having her husband, PAGES, released from prison and also arranged for her to obtain a permit authorizing her travel in Miami, where she asked for asylum for her husband, PAGES. She was in Miami in August, 1959, for about one month. While in Cuba she associates with followers of WILLIAM ALEXANDER MORGAN, former Toledo, Ohio character who was one of FIDEL CASTRO's leaders in the Cuban Revolution.
