Mr. SCOTT said that PENNINGTON told him that columnist DREW FEARSON had suggested SCOTT's name to him and PENNINGTON then made inquiries of SCOTT concerning the activities in Havana of NORMAN ROTHAN. FBI No. 152585B It will be recalled that for the past several years ROTHAN, Pol of this office, has been the front man at the Sans Souci night club in Havana During at least a part of this time ROTHAN was reliably reported to be bankrolled by the SAMITANARINO interests of New Kensington, Pa. It is thought possible that Mr. PENNINGION's interest may have grown out of some Pennsylvania political problem involving MANNARINO. Mr. SCOTT advised that he told PENNINGTON nothing on the telephon about ROTHMAN but suggested that PENNINGTON write him a letter suggesting what he desired to know. SCOTT has subsequently advised that he never received the letter. On October 20, 1954 SCOTT advised that ROTHMAN had inquired of him concerning a good bank to deposit \$25,000. ROTHAN intimated to SCOTT that he wanted this to be more or less a hideout bank account and SCOTT recommended him to the Bank of Nova Scotia and believes that ROTHMAN made the deposit there. It is rather doubted that this twenty-five thousand dollar despoint has any special significance as it has come to the attention of this of the that ROTHMAN, since closing the Sans Souciain April 1954, has been considerately in debt and owes money all over Havana, and it is thought that he was tooking for a new bank in which to make a deposit in order that his creditors would not be aware of the fact that he gow has money. ROTHAN on October 25, 1954 advised Agents of this office that he hopes to be able to open the Sans Souci in late December 1954 and indicated that he would be Prequired to pay a \$25,000 Thrense fee " to be permitted to operate.
