Copies of this LHM are being furnished locally to ONI, OSI, G-2, Ft. McPherson; INTC, Orlando; INS, SECRET SERVICE, U. S. CUSTOMS and U. S. COAST GUARD, Tampa.

For the information of all offices, the press release set forth in Tampa LHM dated 10-14-65, under the title of MIRR was received in Tampa, according to TP T-1, for publication and indicated that Miami Headquarters of MIRR had issued the statement to the press and radio, quoting Dr. ORLANDO BOSCH as set forth in the quoted statement, however, TP T-1 advised that he subsequently had learned that this statement was not published in Miami in the full context but there had been some publicity given to the bombing of the Spanish ship, "Satrustegui" at San Juan, Puerto Rico.

TP T-1 further advised that ENRIQUE SOMEILLAN, delegate of the MIRR in Tampa, Fla., who originally planned to publish the statement as directed by the headquarters in Miami, considered this statement unduly harsh and did not seek the publicity requested.

On 10-27-65, SA WILLIAM E. OGLESBY contacted Commander JOHN D. ROBERTS, U. S. Coast Guard, who is in charge of the security of the Tampa Port. Commander ROBERTS stated that he had received a communication from the District Headquarters of Miami warning of an anticipated attack on a merchant vessel in the U. S. Port by a Cuban exile group, containing substantially the same information as that in San Juan Rad to Bureau, 10-26-65.

Commander ROBERTS stated that he had immediately contacted the U. S. Coast Guard Commander at St. Petersburg, Fla., who had received the same communication and was taking all precautions to protect the shipping in that Port. Commander ROBERTS obtained a 30 foot boat, which he is now using to patrol the Tampa Port.

On 10-27-65, there were no ships in Tampa of Spanish or United Kingdom Registry. He plans to furnish expected arrival of such ships to the FBI and immediately advise of any attempts to sabotage these ships.

He is co-ordinating his work with ONI and U.S. Customs, Tampa.

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On 10-27-65, JACK DE LA LLANA, Intelligence Unit, Tampa PD, was alerted to the possibility of sabotage by a Cuban exile group and stated he would alert the Police Patrol Boat and Police Squad Units patroling the Bay front.

On the same date, Sheriff MALCOLM BEARD, Tampa, was also alerted to the possibility of sabotage to ships in the Tampa Bay area.
