WF T-1 advised on June 15, 1959, that PAUL LAZAR, an American pibt in Miami, was going to fly to Costa F/A Rica and Nicaragua, for some unknown reason. When DAVIDSON heard of this he offered to pay LAZAR the same amount of money to not fly the trip. When RAFAEL DEL PINO heard of this, he called DAVIDSON and said he knew of other pilots that were to fly to Nicaragua and wanted DAVIDSON to give him money to pay these pilots not to make these other trips. DAVIDSON came to Miami to handle the matter personally, but DEL PINO was unable to produce the pilots.

WF T-1 said that LAZAR did not make the trip to Costa Rica or Nicaragua, but that it was unknown if this was because he received or did not receive any money from DAVIDSON.

WF T-2 advised on July 24, 1959, that DAVIDSON made it known to MARIO RODRIGUEZ, First Secretary, Embassy of the D. R. Sthat Colonel MARIANO FAGET was in Washington, D. C., and DAVIDSON advised that it would be a godd idea if FAGET had a talk with the Dominican Ambassador, LUIS THOMEN 15 This meeting, according to the informant, was arranged for 5:00 p.m. on July 24, 1959, but the informant was unable to determine the reason for this meeting
