Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are eight copies of a letterhead memo captioned and dated as above.

The source of the information is [WF 568-S*] (S)

For additional information to the Bureau, [the full text of the conversation between] DAVIDSON and YARIV [could not be determined, however, it appears that YARIV will take steps to see that an invitation to General GERHART and his wife is extended to visit Israel] through SHIMON PEREZ, Israeli Chief of Staff. Further DAVIDSON, inquiring what had transpired between YARIV and GERHART, asked if GERHART mentioned anything about TOM WEBB going. (This may be former SA TOM WEBB, who is associated with the Clint Murchison Enterprises at WDC.) It is also to be noted that DAVIDSON used the term "kinderschlinger" on two occasions; however, its significance is not known. In referring to his trip in Miami, DAVIDSON stated "There was a lot of kinderschlinger here." On the other occasion after referring to the Martin Company publicity, DAVIDSON stated "Wait until they find out about taking kinderschlinger on the planes." EX 109

On December 7, 1959, an informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, learned that I. Irving Davidson, a well-known Washington, D.C., businessman who is registered with the United States Department of Justice as an agent for the Governments of Nicaragua and Israel, had just returned from a trip to Miami, Florida. (u)

The informant learned that Colonel Aharon Yariv, Military, Naval, and Air Attache at the Israeli Embassy, reported to Davidson, upon the latter's return to Washington, D.C., of having attended a party during the past week which had been given by the United States Air Force for all the Attaches. Yariv advised he had received a big greeting from General Gerhart (phonetic) (possibly Lieutenant General John K. Gerhart, who is listed in the June, 1959, Department of Defense telephone directory as being attached to the Air Force in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Plans and Programs.)

D.C. According to Yariv, he sat and talked with General Gerhart and found that the General and his wife were both eager to go to Israel and Gerhart wants a formal invitation. The Gerharts were said to be so eager that Yariv believes if he is not invited he will bear a grudge. Yariv noted that Gerhart would travel by his personal plane and the only expense would be the hotel bills for one week. In connection with this invitation there were things (not further identified) with which General Gerhart could help and Davidson and Yariv planned to meet later at Yariv's office to discuss this.
