1. Name Marcos Diaz Lora
2. Date and Place of Birth May 20, 1928, Cuba
3. Claims Political refugee from Cuba because of opposition to Castro Government. Subject is a brother of former Chief of Cuban Air Force, Pedro Diaz Lora.
4. Subject departed from United States December 29, 1959, and applied for an immigrant visa in Mexico City. After consideration of all factors it was decided that subject would be permitted to return under parole and arrangements were made for his reentry under referred inspection at Brownsville, Texas. Upon reentry at Brownsville subject proceeded to Washington, D. C. where he was further inspected and paroled to proceed to 7951 Southwest 36th Terrace, Miami, Florida, where he will remain with his wife and three children.
