RAMIREZ now expects that he will be called to Havana to explain about his resignation and hopes that he will, as he will now, be able to say that he will continue working but must have sufficient money on which to live. He stated that he estimated that he would need about \$400. and that if the question comes up in any disucssion, that is the figure that he will name. He said that he had just driven the father of his good friend, FERNANDO FERNANDEZ. (It to the airport in Miami and had told him to tell FERNANDO the whole story about himself and LEON. Also, he told him to tell RAUL KOA, Cuban State Department head.

RAMIREZ stated that FERNANDEZ is a high official in the Cuban State Department and was the person who obtained RAMIREZ' job for him. FERNANDEZ has charge of all the consulates in the world and serves as an inspector. RAMIREZ feels that FERNANDEZ will take his part in any trouble which may arise.

RAMIREZ stated that LEON received a reprimand from RAUL ROA, Cuban head of the State Department because recently LEON has refused to validate the certificate which those Cuban pensioners living in the United States have signed in order to receive their pensions. One of these which he refused to sign was that of a Mrs. ALEMAN, the mother of JOSE ALEMAN. JOSE ALEMAN was the former owner of the Tradewinds Motel on Miami Beach and at one time head of the Cuban Revolutionary Organization, "Cuba Rebelde," and a pro-revolutionary figure. Also, the ALEMAN family had control of Aero Postal Airlines and were prominent figures. When the signing of her paper was refused, she went to Cuba and made a complaint and it resulted in a cablegram asking LEON what was the matter with him for refusing to sign. This caused more trouble in the consulate.
