Sancsto aragon, 233 leat 69th Streot, NYC, who is seezetary to Dr. JOSE LIRO CARDONA, Head of the Revolutionary Council, advised on 1/4/62, that he end FIRD CARDONA were in Kashington, D.C. from 12/26/61 until 12/30/61. ARAGON advised that on 12/26/61, Dr. WIRO CARDONA appeared before the Creanization of American States (CAS) and set forth the chronological takecour of Cuba by the Jamualote. This is a longing document in Spanish, which has not been rade public. ARACON officer the VS Department of State in in poncession of one comp of this document and also OAS Ambessedors from other Latin American countries are in pesession of it. adviced on 1/4/62 that on his past trip to Washington, D.C., which would be around 1/11 or 12/62, he would obtain a copy of this document and furnish it to the NYO.

During the week of 12/25 to 12/30/61, ARAGON Edvised that MIRO (ANDERA and he conferred with the State Deportment on two occasions. ARACON stated that they spoke with ROBERT HUNDIEGT, Chief, Cuben Doel: and with ROBERT ROOMARD, Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affulre

PICHAEL J. P. MALONE, Vice President, Czarnikow-Rionda Co., 106 Wall Street, NYC, advised on 1/8/62, that he had been in Washington, D.C. on 1/4 and 1/5/62. MALONE stated that while in Washington, D.C., he met with CIA contact, JANES BOWDIN, and with ROBERT HURWITCH of the US State Department. (4)

MALONE advised that when he met with BOWDIN, BOWDIN brought with him one [CHARLES MACHEN] and instructed(5) MALONE to contact [MACHEN] in the future as BOWDIN was (5) going to leave on a special assignment and would be gone for 60 to 90 days. During the convergation with BOWDIN and [MACHEN] MALONE stated that [MACHEN] told him that he had (5) previously worked in Egypt and Guatemala. MALONE advised that he gathered from his conversation that [MACHEN] was a (5) superior of JANES BOWDIN as [MACHEN] carried the entire (6) conversation and that at previous meetings with BOWDIN when someone was present, BOWDIN always carried the major portion of the conversation.

MALONE advised that from talking with BOWDIN and (5) [MACHEN] he learned that CIA would like to have more specific authorities in matters dealing with Cuba. MALONE said that

(5) [MACHEN]told him that CIA has broad general authority to see to it that the sabotage and harassment is carried out in Cuba, but they would like to have specific authority to initiate certain particular programs.

MALONE advised that from his conversation with BOWDIN and [MACHEN] he definitely received the impression that (5) there were differences between the CIA and State Department officials relative to future Cubon plans. MALONE stated that (5) [MACHEN] had indicated that the State Department believes that the Government of FIDEL CASTRO can be overthrown by creating an uprising from within without the use of an outside force, whereas CIA believes that it is necessary to have an internal uprising coupled with an outside armed force.

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
