OSTICCO stated that he and DOMINIC ALAIMO are close personal friends and were raised together in Pittston, Pa. In addition, he described ALAIMO as his compare (phonetic), explaining that this meant that ALAIMO had been a godparent for one or more of his, OSTICCO's, children.

ANGELO JOSEPH SCIANDRA was interviewed by SAs HOULI-HAN and BOYLAN on July 1, 1958, and advised that he has known DOMINIC ALAIMO all his life, but has never actually been in business with him, nor did he recall ever having ALAIMO on his pay roll at Ann-Lee.

When interviewed on July 1, 1958, by SAs HOULIHAN and BOYLAN, it should be noted SCIANDRA claimed that he did not see ALAIMO at Apalachin, N. Y., on November 14, 1957.

In March 1958, PH T-2 advised that ALAIMO, ANGELO SCIANDRA, and DAVE OSTICCO traveled to New York together in January 1958.

On May 14, 1958, PH T-3 advised SA FREDERICK T. HOULIHAN that he had last seen OSTICCO with DOMINIC ALAIMO during the time that the dress strike was in progress. At that time, OSTICCO did not want ALAIMO to sign with the union and he told him to hold out and sign as one of a group and not individually. During this strike, OSTICCO took part in a meeting held at the Gramercy Restaurant, Pittston, Pa., at which were present RUSSELL BUFALINO, DOMINIC ALAIMO, and MAX At this meeting, BUFALINO asked that Jane Hogan not join in the signing of an individual contract with the International Ladies! Garment Workers Union and that if an agreement was reached it should be done as a group. formant was of the opinion that BUFALINO wanted Jane Hogan to remain as part of the Pennsylvania Garment Manufacturers Association and sign with the union only if Pennsylvania Garment Manufacturers Association signed.

On June 4, 1958, PH T-3 advised SA HOULIHAN that he had observed no current association of ALAIMO with DAVE OSTICCO, RUSSELL BUFALINO, and ANGELO SCIANDRA; however, he stated he believed ALAIMO still associates with these individuals.

On April 24, 1958, PH T-1 furnished the following information:
