The following is a summary of pertinent information
contained in Bufiles concerning the captioned individual:

An inquiry submitted by the Immigration and Naturaliza-
tion Service on December 21, 1961, indicated that subject was
born August 28, 1929, in Ciudad Trujillo, Dominican Republic.
At that time he gave his address as 171 West 71st Street
Apartment 8-B, New York City, and indicated that his address
prior to the one set out above was 11 Jonas E. Salk, Ciudad Trujillo,
Dominican Republic. Subject's father was identified as
Vicente Tolentino and his mother as Catherine Dipp. The inquiry
from the Immigration and Naturalization Service further indicated
that subject was admitted to the United States on August 25, 1961,
at New York as a visitor and that he was alleged to be a member
of the Executive Committee of the Frente Unido Dominicano (FUD)
of New York.

On March 8, 1961, Tobias Emilio Cabral Mejia, 536
West 136th Street, New York City, a self-admitted member of
the Central Executive Committee of the Movimiento de Liberacion
Dominicano (MLD), advised that an organization known as the
European Committee became affiliated with the MLD during the
latter part of 1960. He indicated the headquarters of the
organization was considered to be Paris, France, although it
had no official office. He also indicated that the reason
Paris, France, was considered the headquarters was that the
majority of members of the European Committee resided in that
area, particularly Hugo Tolentino. Cabral also advised that
Tolentino had, in the recent past, moved to London where he
was employed in some capacity at the University of London.

latter part of 1960. He indicated the headquarters of the
organization was considered to be Paris, France, although it
had no official office. He also indicated that the reason

area, particularly Hugo Tolentino. Cabral also advised that
Tolentino had, in the recent past, moved to London where he
was employed in some capacity at the University of London.

Information furnished by CIA dated August 3, 1961, (protect identity and classify "Secret") in September, 1961, disclosed that Hugo Tolentino, London leader of the 14th of June Dominican Liberation Movement (APCJ), was in London on a visit from Paris and that he planned to visit New York for discussion of affairs relating to the Dominican Republic with MLD members. (S)(U)

Information obtained by the Legal Attache, Paris, in January, 1962, (Direction De La Surveillance Du Territoire) indicated that subject arrived in France on September 2, 1958, bearing a special passport and that he enrolled in the faculty of law in Paris and continued his studies by means of a French Government scholarship. Subject left France for London on October 2, 1960, and no information has come to Legat's source regarding the subject since that time. (S)

On February 1, 1962, Tobias Emilio Cabral Mejia, 536 West 136th Street, New York City, a member of the Central Executive Committee of the MLD, advised that Hugo Tolentino Dipp had returned to the Dominican Republic and that he had left New York around the first part of January, 1962. In February, 1962, Ramon Ibert (protect identity), secretary of the 14th of June Movement, San Juan, Puerto Rico, advised that Tolentino had been deported from the Dominican Republic. On February 26, 1962, the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Miami, Florida, advised that seven individuals, including the subject, left Miami for New York City on that date and that arrangements had been made for the seven to leave New York for France on British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) Flight 510.

Information furnished by CIA in June, 1964, indicated that Rolando Javier Breton, a member of the Communist Party of the Dominican Republic, was released from prison on bail on 5/6/64, and that subject was one of the contributors to his bail bond of \$275. (S)(U)
