MM T-1, who has been active in Cuban revolutionary matters for the past six years and has furnished reliable information in the past, on July 29, 1963, advised that the ALIANZA PARA LA LIBERTAD DE CUBA recently formed a military group and bought a Japanese light machinegun from JOE GARMAN for about \$85.00.

MM T-1 explained that GARMAN is a member of a small group of American adventurers and mercenaries in Miami, Florida, under the leadership of GERALD PATRICK HEMMING, a would-be soldier of fortune who is involved in Cuban revolutionary activities.

MM T-1 said that MARIO (Last Name Unknown) works in the office of the ALIANZA PARA IA LIBERTAD DE CUBA, 3460 N. W. 17th Avenue. MARIO recently obtained an old automobile "U" joint and an automobile axle and is trying to make a gun mount in the office of the ALIANZA PARA LA LIBERTAD DE CUBA. This office serves as a hang-out for the older Cuban exiles who formerly held lesser positions in the Cuban government during the regime of FULGENCIO BATISTA, President of Cuba, prior to January 1, 1959.

The organization uses General GENEROSO CAMPOS MARQUETTI as a figurehead. CAMPOS has a good name, has a good reputation and was a hero in the war of liberty against Spain. He is a very old man, over 80 years of age, a Negro, uneducated, and has no political experience. The majority of the members of this organization are "Batistianos" and

there are very few members under the age of 50.

MM T-l advised on August 8, 1963, that on the previous day CAMPOS MARQUETTI stated the organization is going to Nicaragua for future participation in the training camps reportedly promised to them by LUIS SOMOZA, former President of Nicaragua. CAMPOS said the organization would be interested in obtaining boats of forty to fifty feet in length for use in transporting volunteers of the organization to Nicaragua.

MM T-1 explained that during July 1963, LUIS SOMO ZA was in Miami, Florida, conferred with the majority of the Cuban exile leaders and was promising to give each group their own military training camp in Nicaragua for future military action against Cuba.

On September 24, 1963, MM T-1 advised that GERALD PATRICK HEMMING and an unidentified Cuban exile returned to Miami from Chicago, Illinois, September 22, 1963. While in Chicago HEMMING and the Cuban exile visited RICHYLAUCHLI of Collinsville, Illinois, who is an American arms dealer who has visited in Miami previously and has sold arms to Cuban exiles.

MM T-l explained that it is believed this Cuban exile is a member of the ALIANZA PARA LA LIBERTAD DE CUBA and may have bought some arms from LAUCHLI. MM T-l said it is not known if this unidentified exile was acting on his own or was representing the ALIANZA PARA LA LIBERTAD DE CUBA.

On September 27, 1963, General GENEROSO CAMPOS MARQUETTI, 3460 N. W. 17th Avenue, Miami, advised that he continues as the head of the ALIANZA PARA LA LIBERTAD DE CUBA, which organization is a unity group of 55 independent organizations. CAMPOS explained he does not know how many
