Dear Mr. Rumig:

On 10/26/92, President George Bush signed "The John F. Kennedy (JFK) Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992." This Act requires that Government records related to the assassination of President Kennedy be sent to the National Archives for public release. It was passed because of the renewed public interest in the release of all JFK records and it facilitates the release of information normally exempt from disclosure under Executive Order and/or the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

While the Act contemplates maximum disclosure of JFK records, information can be withheld if certain requirements are Withholding information is referred to as "postponement" because the Act provides that in 25 years, all information must be released unless the President of the United States certifies that particular information should never be released. Attached is a copy of the Act which specifies the bases for any postponements and describes the Review Board which will determine the validity of such postponements claimed for JFK assassination records.

The FBI has established a task force to process the JFK assassination records. The FBI's goal is to maximize release of information. Postponements will only be requested where there is compelling justification for doing so. letter serves to inform you that pursuant to the Act the FBI will be required, in the absence of such justification for postponements, to release all information received from agencies such as yours that relates to the JFK Assassination and to identify the source agency. This requirement is limited to the JFK investigation and the documents defined by the 1992 Act and should not affect any future handling of your agency's information concerning other subjects.
