Synopsis: The Act established the Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB) to oversee the governments' production and compliance with the Act. The ARRB reviews the proposed postponements in documents sent by each agency to the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) and decides what postponements the Act allows or opens the document in full. The ARRB's responsibilities include having agencies search other subjects and areas to find any additional material not already identified as assassination records. The establishment of the ARRB by the Act also limited the time for their duties to be accomplished. The ARRB must complete their tasks by September 1997. With this deadline in mind, the ARRB sent a letter requesting additional information.

Details: On March 10, 1997, the ARRB sent a letter to the FBI setting forth a formal request to receive and review additional records. The ARRB's goal is to research every possible subject that may have a bearing on assassination theories and to assure Congress and the American public that all was done to accomplish the intentions of the Act.

New Orleans should conduct a search of its office for the listed items. If New Orleans is aware of any administrative records they may have maintained outside the normal index system, they should include those areas in the search. If any documents related to the matter are found, please forward the documents to the JFK Task Force.

Pursuant to the Act, any material categorized as an assassination record must be sent to the NARA in its original form. The Act established the process of handling the documents and the FBI must follow the Act. If New Orleans believes their office needs a copy, they should copy the document or material
