On 4/6/60 DL-7-S, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available to SA W. HARLAN BROWN in person a typewritten report dated 4/6/60 concerning a regular Dallas CP meeting held at 2230 Roanoke Street, Dallas, Texas. The original report is filed as 134-4A-320.

Those present at the meeting were MARGARET and JOE LANDIN, BILL LOWERY and AUGUSTIN ESTRADA.

The results of the Dallas school board meeting were discussed and the group concluded that the Negro vote did not get out and vote. ESTRADA showed JOE and BILL a hand bill that he had received from JOHN STANFORD of San Antonio which announced that a meeting had taken place and which was sponsored by influential people, among them a GI Forum officer, a priest HARRY KOGER and others.

JOE LANDIN reported that he had attended a NAACP Youth Council meeting on 4/3/60 where he determined that Attorney W.J. DURHAM had met with the city officers. JOE reported that the city officials did not want sit-in protests in Dallas and indicated to the attorney that they were willing to make some concessions. Among the concessions were that "for colored" signs would be taken off water fountains at the union bus terminal; certain department stores were said to change their policy in serving Negroes at lunch counters.
