On January 30, 1960, DL-6-S, in person, furnished a handwritten report to SA W. HARLAN BROWN, which report is dated 1/28/61, and serialized as 134-1A-570.

That report reflected that on Saturday, 1/28/61, MRS. ELMORE advised JOE LANDIN that the meeting (Forum) had been postponed because of the weather.

On Sunday night, 1/29/61, ALBERT OROZCO telephoned JOE LANDIN and informed him that the meeting of the Forum would take place on Monday, 1/30/61. OROZCO, the Forum's Chairman, explained to LANDIN that they were about to organize a Junior Forum and asked LANDIN to bring with him printed matter dealing with racial discrimination. He specified the article dealing with the Daughters of the American Revolution. LANDIN said he would comply, and asked OROZCO what kind of propaganda was the Forum giving to its coming scholarship dance. OROZCO said they had 10 or 12 spots on the radio. LANDIN suggested the Forum write a letter and put it up at Stone's barber shop, et cetera. OROZCO liked the idea and asked JOE LANDIN to draw up an example. JOE said he would.
