On 11/20/61 SA W. HARLAN BROWN received in person a handwritten report dated 11/16/61 from DL-6-S. This report has been serialized as 134-1A-641.

Informant determined on 11/16/61 that RAYMOND CARVAJAL, chairman of the local American G. I. Forum, contacted JOE LANDIN and invited him to attend the forum meetings. The next meeting of the forum, CARVAJAL said, would be on Tuesday, 11/21/61. LANDIN told him that on that particular Tuesday he had to attend a PTA meeting. After that he assured him he would attend.

Informant further determined on 11/17/61 that on that date JOE LANDIN contacted JOE MOLINA who had been a G. I. Forum member for a number of years. He warned Mr. MOLINA of ALBERT GONZALEZ. GONZALEZ, LANDIN pointed out, was dishonest and untrustworthy. He had tried under false pretenses to secure money from liberal and labor people. He had identified himself as authorized to collect funds for an organization. The organization of which he had been a vice chairman was at that time defunct and ALBERT had no such authorization. GONZALEZ, LANDIN added, had shifted from a Democrat to Republican and had supported TOWER. He had offered to work with either party, Republican or Democrat, if he was paid \$100 a week. When ALBERT worked with Dr. ANDREW and JESSE PRICE to split the Young Democrats Club, he had been paid \$200. In short, JOE added, GONZALEZ was a dangerous man and it would be to the forum's advantage, as well as any other organization, not to allow him to handle any funds. Now that he had moved to Oak Cliff, he was no longer Precinct Chairman and sought to identify himself with some organization.

Informant determined that MOLINA said he would keep an eye on him and had wondered why ALBERT GONZALEZ, Attorney FELIMON VALDEZ, J.O. GARCIA and JIMMY TRUJILLO had shown up at the forum's last meeting. He recalled that ALBERT GONZALEZ had mailed him a handbill supporting TOWER. The above mentioned individuals, MOLINA said, had not attended a forum meeting in ages, then all of a sudden they showed up.
