1970, obtained by FGJ subpoena. Records of Passport Office, Department of State, Washington, D.C., reflect subject issued Passport No. A-1400222 at New Orleans, Louisiana, 7/20/70, for travel to Italy. Investigation continuing.

DETAILS: AT WASHINGTON, D.C.

The files of the Passport Office, Department of State, reviewed by SA KENNETH J. HASER on November 4, 1970, disclosed that SAM CAMPISI was last issued Passport A-1400222 at New Orleans, Louisiana, on July 20, 1970, for proposed three weeks' pleasure travel to Italy. In his application dated July 16, 1970, at Dallas, he stated his intention to depart by air about September 1, 1970. This passport was valid for five years' travel to all countries except Cuba, Mainland China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

Under passport regulations, subject may use this passport for lawful travel within the period of its validity whenever and as often as desired without further notification to the Department of State or other government agency. The Passport Office does not receive information as to whether or when a passport is used for foreign travel.
