EDGAR H. ROSSBACH had spoken to him about the matter. It was noted that Mr. ROSSBACH personally appeared for the government on this latter day. Judge WEANEY told Mr. GEORGE and Mr. PEARSE that they should get together with Mr. ROSSBACH in order that a new trial date might be set.

It was noted during the course of this discussion that ACCARDI did not enter the court room but remained in the corridor outside and was informed of developments by COLLANDRA.

WILLIAM GEORGE is a former Assistant Prosecutor for Hudson County, having been appointed by Mayor FRANK HAGUE of Jersey City, New Jersey. He drives a 1941 Cadillac, New Jersey License HA25U.

The following list of telephone calls were made from Livingston 6-1711, which telephone is listed to A. TAPORE but is in the home of the ACCARDIS at 49 Hillside Avenue, Livingston. The source of the telephone number was NK-1327. The Newark indices are negative as to the holders of the numbers called except where otherwise designated.

April 12, 1946 - CIRCLE 5-9697 Ace Avenue, Hat Shop, 818 Eighth Avenue, New York City.

- BIGELOW 3-8453 Mrs. GRACE LAPLACA, 678 South 11th Street, Newark. This number was also called on April 13, 1946 and is the telephone used by PAUL MARIO LOMBARDINO, the son of Mrs. LAPLACA and also a subject of the Newark Field Division in this case from a jewel theft standpoint.

- BLOOMFIELD 2-3276 ACCARDI, 188 Franklin Street, Bloomfield. This is the home telephone of SAM ACCARDI and the listings reflect that numerous calls were made from the Livingston phone to the Bloomfield phone during the period of observation.

April 14, 1946 - MANHATTAN 6-3606 SOL SASS, 1302 Newark Avenue, Brooklyn.

April 15, 1946 - PLAZA 8-2125 Italy-America Corporation, 40 East 50th Street, New York City. Information in the files of

The Newark Field Division indicates this firm was formed on December 16, 1946 under New York laws to engage in a general foreign exchange business. The company was dormant until January 3, 1939 at which time GIOVANNI GIRARDON became Vice President and Secretary and subsequently was elevated to the Presidency. It has been located at the indicated address since January of 1942. Other officers appear to be FLOYD X SISTO and JOSEPH X FOA. On March 3, 1944 GIRARDON and FOA advised Informant NYC-77 that a trade style, Vatican Studio of Mosaics, American Delegation, was being used in connection with the sale of works of art which were being held by the Italy-America Corporation on consignment from the Vatican Studio of Mosaics, Vatican City, Rome, Italy. This number was also called on May 4, 7 and 10 and June 13 and 28 (2).

April 16, 1946 -- BIGELOW 2-8990 D. X LORITO, 252 14th Avenue, Newark, also called on April 22 and May 3, 7 and 8. This is a service station.

April 19, 1946 -- BIGELOW 3-3673 PHILIP X PASALAGUA, 242 Hunterdon Street, Newark. There is a SALVATORE X PASALAGUA, FBI #630588, who is described as one of MARCO X ECENELLI's gang in Camden, New Jersey.

April 20, 1946 -- GRAMERCY 5-7080 New York Post Graduate Medical School and Hospital, 303 East 20th Street, New York City. A large number of calls were made to this number during the period of observation.

April 27, 1946 -- BIGELOW 3-2905 B. V. X PIZZOLATO, DDS, 588 South 10th Street, Newark.

April 30, 1946 -- MITCHELL 2-2799 X JOSEPHINE Dress Shop, phone listed to Miss J. X ACCARDI, 77 Richmond Street, Newark. It has been previously pointed out that ACCARDI is the proprietor of the Josephine Dress Shop.
