SUBJECT: Hearing before the Senate Select Committee on  
Improper Activities in the Labor or Management Field

The testimony given before the above-described Committee on August 21 and August 27, 1958 indicates possible violation of 29 U.S.C. 186 by George F. Callahan, President, Exhibitors Service Company, Inc., and Esco Motor Company, McKees Rocks, Pennsylvania; Edward P. Weinheimer, 1656 University Avenue, The Bronx, New York, and Robert Benjamin Baker.

Information reflected by the transcript of the hearings indicates that Callahan, either directly or through Weinheimer, paid Baker substantial sums of money in order to obtain his assistance in settling certain labor difficulties encountered by Callahan's companies.

Accordingly, it is requested that an investigation be conducted to determine whether sufficient evidence is available to warrant the institution of criminal proceedings. In addition to such other investigation as may be necessary, it is suggested that the investigation should cover the following factors:

1. The nature of Callahan's labor difficulties.
2. The unions representing Callahan's employees.
3. Baker's union affiliation, assignments and duties.
4. The nature of Weinheimer's duties with Callahan's companies and some estimate of his effectiveness.
5. Weinheimer's affiliation, if any, with any of the unions representing Callahan's employees.
6. A review of the books of Callahan's companies.
7. Details regarding the delivery of money to Weinheimer or Baker.

It is also requested that Baker, Callahan and Weinheimer be interviewed to obtain their statements regarding the alleged violations. Mr. and Mrs. Virgil Smith, operators of the Rambler Motel, 2701 South East 14th Street, Des Moines, Iowa, may also be able to furnish pertinent information regarding these matters.
