[Denmark] (S)

T-1, a ~~confidential~~ source abroad, advised on November 21, 1960, that VLADYSLAV MIKHAILOVITCH ABARCHALINE, a member of the Soviet Embassy in Copenhagen, is suspected of being a cadre-worker of the KGB in Denmark. (S)

On October 29, 1959, ABARCHALINE contacted REMBERT CAVEN ALLEY, JR., and made an appointment to meet him that evening. ABARCHALINE indicated that they would go to "a quiet spot" where they might talk in peace. These two individuals met at the Town Hall Square in Copenhagen shortly before 8:00 p.m. on October 29, 1959. ABARCHALINE was carrying two books and a periodical. They proceeded to a small cafe and while there it was apparent that ABARCHALINE gave ALLEY the books and the periodicals. (S)

T-1 further advised that on November 5, 1959, ABARCHALINE and ALLEY agreed to meet again and ALLEY indicated he would bring "Marvin" with him. According to T-1, "Marvin" was identified as a U. S. citizen, MARVIN KANTOR, born May 9, 1939 at New York City. This meeting was held at approximately 8:00 p.m. on November 5, at which time, ABARCHALINE had a book with him. The three, ABARCHALINE, ALLEY and KANTOR, then went to KANTOR's lodgings. Shortly thereafter, ALLEY and ABARCHALINE went to a restaurant, after which they proceeded toward ALLEY's home. When these two departed, ABARCHALINE was no longer carrying the book and it was apparent to T-1 that he had given it to ALLEY. (S)

On November 16, 1959, ABARCHALINE again met ALLEY and KANTOR in a restaurant in Copenhagen. In the restaurant, the three of them conversed with two unknown individuals. Later in the evening, ABARCHALINE and ALLEY left the restaurant together. ALLEY was carrying a newspaper at the time. One of the unidentified individuals was later determined to be MORRAY BROWN, a United States citizen, born March 23, 1934 in New York. The other individual was later identified as AHMED EL BADAWI MOHAMED ABDEL SALOM, an Egyptian national, born August 30, 1932, in Egypt. (S)

T-1 was not aware of any subsequent meetings between ALLEY and ABARCHALINE but did comment that other meetings would have been possible. (X)(S)

T-1 said that subject worked for Danish Artic Contractors in Copenhagen from September 20, 1959 until October 31, 1959. He later became employed by NEILS KOPPEL, an architect in Copenhagen. T-1 felt that ALLEY obtained the position with Danish Artic Contractors through the firm of Jespersen and Son, Copenhagen. An official of this firm has an acquaintance named Østergaard who is now residing in Eire, Pennsylvania. ØSTERGAARD had asked a contact in Jespersen and Son to find a job for ALLEY. (X)(S)

According to T-1, this firm cooperates with American contractors in constructing buildings in Greenland. There are no classified plans handled by this firm and the work performed by ALLEY consisted mainly of plans for stores and other commercial type buildings. (X)(S)

The subject obtained the position with ~~NEILS KOPPEL~~ on November 1, 1959 and, at that time, indicated he wished to remain in Denmark for one year. T-1 advised that ALLEY left Denmark on February 13, 1960. (X)(S)
