Anti-Fidel Castro activities

Leader. This group is reportedly contributing financially and intellectually to the anti-Castro movement. Reportedly, Dr. Antonio Lanza Parra, married to the niece of Batista and former director of a mental institution near Havana, Cuba, and Fernando del Puerto, a Cuban attorney, are connected with this group. Reportedly, Roberto Hernandez, another member of this group, gave \$50,000 on May 27, 1959, to Pino for General Pedraza.

A source with whom insufficient contact has been had to determine his reliability advised on May 26, 1959, that a group of Cuban exiled professional men including Lanza and Puerto met on May 25, 1959. According to this source, Lanza believes that Fidel Castro cannot last more than two months. Lanza reportedly was interested in legally chartering a plane to fly to the Dominican Republic in order to deliver a confidential report to General Pedraza. The source was of the opinion that this report related to organized plots against Castro. Reportedly, Lanza desired to depart for the Dominican Republic on June 5, 1959, and to return on June 7, 1959. According to the source Lanza is a Batista follower but is supporting Pedraza. The source learned that Pedraza reportedly had come to the United States three times since January 1, 1959, wearing the uniform of a Dominican naval officer.

On May 26, 1959, an informant who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that Cuban investigators have learned that a group of Batista exiles, under the leadership of Fernando del Puerto, had several boats, identity unknown to the informant, in the Mekong River. Reportedly, Manuel J. Diaz, a Cuban Air Force investigator, recently sent an agent to the Dominican Republic and learned that Batista gave \$25,000,000 to Pedraza who is in charge of training Cubans for an Invasion of Cuba. The informant reported that Castro will attack the Dominican Republic first if he learns that the Dominican Republic actually plans to attack Cuba. X(M)
