On July 16, 1957, DN 110-C informed SA PAUL E. BUSH that BACCARELLA had been back in Denver and was again associating with JOSEPH SALARDINO, CLARENCE SMALDONE, and PAUL VILLANO, principal representatives of the SMALDONE group, and reportedly has patched up his differences with them. He stated that BACCARELLA has recently been attending the races at Centennial Park, near Littleton, Colorado, and had been handling some bookmaking action with Denver gambler MIKE TATE. He stated that BACCARELLA and TATE were rumored to have swindled BLACKIE FLOYD, an Aurora, Colorado, businessman, out of several thousand dollars in connection with wagers FLOYD had placed with them on horse races at Centennial.

On September 12, 1957, DN 143-C informed SA BRENDAN P. WALSH that BACCARELLA had left Denver and was reported to have returned to the State of Nevada.

Colorado On October 2, 1957, DN 110-C informed SA BUSH that PHIL BACCARELLA and Denver gamblers MIKE TATE, MIKE PAULDINO, and JESS BRIDWELL, had recently attended the Golden Jubilee celebration in Grand Junction, Colorado, and that TATE and BACCARELLA had reportedly continued from Grand Junction to the State of Nevada. Nev. On January 26, 1961, DN 110-C informed SA BUSH that ANTHONY COLOSACCO, a former Denver Hoodlum and member of the SMALDONE group, had recently been released on parole from the Colorado State Penitentiary at Canon City, Colorado, and had reportedly received permission from the Colorado Board of Parole to have their parole supervision transferred to the State of Nevada, where he was to work for former Pueblo, Colorado, gambler PHIL BACCARELLA in one of the casinos at Lake Tahoe, Nevada.
