COMANDOS L INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA NEUTRALITY MATTERS

On July 13, 1965, SJ T-1, a Cuban exile in Puerto Rico with contacts among the members of Comandos L, a Cuban exile anti-Castro group, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that one ROBERTOX MARTINEZ RUBIO, a Cuban exile Cubb living at 68 Venus Street, Santa Teresità, Santurce, Puerto Rico, was one of the active supporters of Comandos L. Source further stated that another Cuban exile, (first name unknown); ARANA SANCHEZ, who lives across the street from MARTINEZ RUBIG at 161 Venus Street, was storing a boat for the Comandos L. Tills boat is in the carport at 161 Venus. It is described as about twenty feet with twin inboard-outboard engines, and bearing Puerto Rico registration number 1702A SANTURCE; PUBRIO RICO

On July 14, 1965, Mrs. LILLIAN LETCHER, Clerk, Marine Inspection Office, United States Coast Guard, San Juan, Puerto Rico, advised that her records reflected that Puerto Rico number 1702A was registered to OCTAVIO G. DE MOLINA, General Patton Street 2139, Ocean Park, Santurce, Puerto Rico. boat was described as twenty-three feet with an inboard-out board engine, Deaco Craft, registered September 4, 1964. 4/6

On July 21, 1965, SJ T-2, a Cuban exile in Puerto Rico with contact among the members of Comandos, I in Puerto Rico, but with whom insufficient contact has been had to determine his reliability, advised that RODOLFO GONZALEZ of Comandos L lived at 2319 Cacique Street, Ocean Park, Santurce, Puerto Rico. Comandos L has two launches in Puerto Rico, one stored near Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, and the other stored at a house about three blocks away from the home of GONZALEZ in Santurce. Source further stated that Comandos L had recently purchased a "mother ship" of about seventy feet with two disel engines in New Orleans, Louisiana. The goup plans to move their base of operations into the Bahamas since the recent Dominican revolution prevented their setting up a base on that island.

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
