On 9/6/61, CIA furnished a list of Unidad Revolucionaria (97-4524) (UR) members known as Los Halcones Negroes (Black Falcons). This list contained the name of Ramon Font Saumel, 35 SW 21st Ave., Miami, Fla., FR 3-7016 and various code names assigned to him by the UR.

INS advised on 4/23/62 that the status of Ramon F. Font Saumell had been changed to that of refugee and was no longer considered to be under the Project Zenith Program. (No further information)

MM 639-S advised that Ramon Font, a Cuban who formerly participated in CIA operations, was among individuals who met in the office of William Baggs, editor of the "Miami Daily News", Miami, Fla., on 7/1/62. Baggs was reportedly conducting an investigation for the White House of CIA operations in regard to Cuban matters. Font furnished information to Baggs concerning weapons and walkie-talkie batteries given to Cubans.

Antonio Cuesta Del Valle, 2155 Southwest Fifth St., Miami, military leader of C-L, advised that he had received an anonymous letter postmarked Arlington, Texas, 4/18/63. The name of Ramon Font, Miami, Fla., also appeared on the address of the envelope. This letter stated that if Cuban Patriots were ever to live again in their homeland as free men, President Kennedy would have to be
