The Haitian Vice-Consul in Miami, Florida, advised our Miami Office on August 28, 1958, an unnamed informant had given him fragmentary information concerning a reported expedition of people and arms to Haiti. According to the source a revolutionary attempt might be made over the Labor Day week and sometime in September, 1958. He claimed twenty-seven Americans including the captioned individuals are involved.

The informant of the vice-consul advised the Haitian revolutionaries have a depot of arms and ammunition which is located near Miami and have \$70,000 worth of arms stored on an island between Florida and Haiti. The source stated that an individual named Billiard, who is engaged in the lumber business in Miami and who has been trying to obtain a contract through the Haitian Government, has a cousin who is married to a pilot who has been offered \$10,000 by the revolutionaries to fly arms to Haiti.

The vice-consul advised his source asked for \$10,000 for information he had and could obtain concerning this matter. The identity of the source is unknown to this Bureau and accordingly his reliability is unknown.

The United States Customs Service in Miami has been furnished the substance of the above information. You will be furnished any additional pertinent information received.
