Subject and his wife were investigated by Bureau and CIA on basis that Mrs. Espinosa had been identified by Soviet defector Vladimir Petrov as a Soviet agent in Sweden during 1944-45 and a short time after her marriage to subject. The identification has not been definite as Petrov and his wife have changed their stories several times and there is doubt as to whether the identification is correct. CIA, however, states in its letter that Petrov's identification was positive. The information contained in CIA's letter is a summary of information developed on subject and his wife, and most of the information appears to have originated with CIA.
