SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: Subject and wife arrived Grand Central Terminal, NYC, 10/26/49. While in NY LAWSON spoke at meetings sponsored by ASP and the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship. At one of the aforementioned meetings, LAWSON in his remarks said that while Russia wants peace, Wall St. and the American monopolists want war. In another address LAWSON said that in the Soviet Union and countries of "other peoples' democracies", they have real democracy and the forces of progress there and in the rest of the world can win the fight for peace.
