On 5/10/65, [redacted], 750 Northwest 15th Street, Apartment #18, Miami, Florida, was reinterviewed. OTHER 4  
[redacted] had no information concerning this matter, other than that which he had previously furnished. He was unable to be more specific on any matter mentioned.

On 5/12/65, SERGIO MARTIN VIDAL, 244 Southwest 9th Street, Apartment #20, Miami, Florida, was reinterviewed, at which time he furnished the following information: *Cuba*

MARTIN VIDAL stated he furnished all the information he deemed pertinent the first time he was interviewed; however, stated he imagined subject to be in New York City as a Merchant Seaman, because the subject was a Merchant Seaman in Cuba and Honduras, and had always been one. It is natural, he stated, that he would be a Merchant Seaman. *[Signature]*

MARTIN VIDAL believes subject is a communist because of the following circumstances:

- 1) When he arrested subject in Cuba in about 6/59, after searching subject's home, the subject was released on the orders of "CHE" GUEVARA, a known communist leader.
