THE STATEMENT BY THE ALL-UNION CENTRAL COUNCIL
OF TRADE UNIONS OF THE USSR

Radio and press have reported another crime committed by American racists - authorities resorted to brutal violence as regards freedom march participants, Negro population in Selma, Alabama State.

Bestial violence of mounted police done to the marchers among whom there were many women and children is an act of flagrant violation of basic democratic rights and liberties of the American citizens. It has justly aroused the feelings of indignation and wrath among the workers in the USSR who demand that an end be put to the inhuman chase of Negroes in the USA.

The Soviet working people denounce these cruel arbitrary actions committed by the Alabama State authorities led by Governor Wallace, a racist and obscurantist, under whose orders police has resorted to clubbing, whipping and tear-gassing of the Negroes.

On behalf of the Soviet factory and office workers the All-Union Central Council of Trade Unions resolutely protest against the reprisal of freedom marchers in Selma.

The Soviet organized workers, all our citizens express their fraternal solidarity with Negro working people in the USA who are courageously fighting, backed by progressive American public opinion, for equality in political, economic and social field, for elimination of racial discrimination.

American racists must answer for their crimes. The Soviet workers resolutely demand that all those involved in committing this bestial violence to American Negroes should be severely punished and Negro people be ensured democratic liberties and genuine equality.



Радио и печать приносят сообщения о новом преступлении американских расистов — жестокой расправе властей с участниками массового "похода свободы" негритянского населения города Селма, штат Алабама.

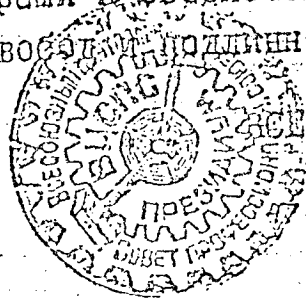
Кровавая расправа конной полиции над демонстрантами, среди которых было много женщин и детей, является вопиющим нарушением элементарных демократических прав и свобод американских граждан. Она вызывает чувство законного возмущения и негодования советских трудящихся, требующих положить конец бесчеловечному преследованию негров в США.

Трудящиеся Советского Союза клеймят позором этот грубый акт произвола со стороны властей штата Алабама во главе с расистом и мракобесом губернатором Уоллесом, по указанию которого полиция пустила в ход дубинки, нагайки и бомбы со слезоточивым газом.

От имени советских рабочих и служащих Всесоюзный Центральный Совет Профессиональных Союзов решительно протестует против расправы с участниками "похода свободы" города Селма.

Члены профессиональных союзов, все советские люди выражают свою братскую солидарность с трудящимися неграми США, которые при поддержке прогрессивной американской общественности ведут мужественную борьбу за свое равноправие в политической, экономической и социальной областях жизни, за ликвидацию позорной расовой дискриминации.

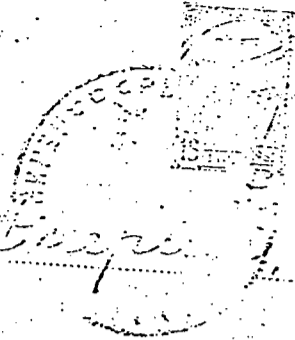
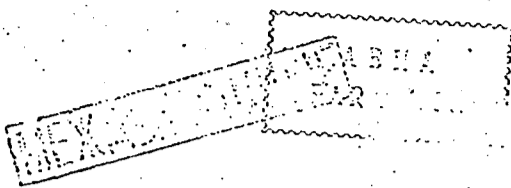

RC 21/Apr68 Writer, a 26 year old Soviet locksmith, writes to the family of Martin Luther KING expressing his personal condolences to them. He writes M.L.KING is known and respected in the USSR for/courage in speaking for the betterment of mankind in his lifetime. Writer particularly admired M.L.KING for his constant searching of the truth and he gave his life for mankind while trying to eliminate discrimination. Writer is reminded of the Russian revolutionary, one Kondraty RILYEV who wrote before the uprising of 14 December 1825, " Where was freedom ever won with sacrifices." He compares M.L.KING with John Brown, Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglas (Douglass?), and that his name will be forever remembered in the history of the US. His followers will carry out what M.L.KING was not able to do. (TN: Our records do not reveal any previous correspondence by writer.)
