BARBARA HELENE FLISKOW
CRIME ABOARD AIRCRAFT

Captioned individual, a 38-year-old former psychology professor, reportedly a member of the White Panther Party, and associate of Black Panther Party members, was taken into custody by FBI Agents at Detroit Metropolitan Airport this morning after local authorities received a tip that an attempt would be made to hijack American Airlines Flight 124 from Detroit, Michigan, to New York City.

A bomb fashioned from several sticks of dynamite and a pistol were found in her handbag. In addition, her handbag contained a drawn portrayal of Fliskow sitting in an aircraft, as well as two notes, one of them signed "Black Liberation Army" indicating a plan to hijack the aircraft after demanding two Black Panther Party members, presently incarcerated in the Wayne County Jail, Detroit, Michigan, be escorted to the airport and turned over to Fliskow. One of the notes described this as a "new chapter" in the liberation of black people. It was indicated that she would detonate the dynamite by gunfire if the crew was not cooperative. Fliskow will be charged today, according to the U. S. Attorney's Office in Detroit, Michigan, with violation of the Crime Aboard Aircraft Statute.

Our files show that Fliskow was born September 14, 1933, in Detroit, Michigan, and was a former psychology professor at Wayne Community College, Detroit. It is reported she is an admitted member of the White Panther Party; and she has acted in close association with the Black Panther Party. Fliskow is reported to have advocated anarchy in the United States as the only solution for the problems of the world, stating people should take up the gun and fight the establishment.

Investigation in this matter is continuing.

Dear Sir:

The information furnished herewith concerns an individual who is believed to be covered by the agreement between the FBI and Secret Service concerning Presidential-protection, and to fall within the category or categories checked.

1. Has attempted or threatened bodily harm to any government official or employee, including foreign government officials residing in or planning an imminent visit to the U. S., because of his official status.
2. Has attempted or threatened to redress a grievance against any public official by other than legal means.
3. Because of background is potentially dangerous; or has been identified as member or participant in communist movement; or has been under active investigation as member of other group or organization inimical to U. S.
4. U. S. citizens or residents who defect from the U. S. to countries in the Soviet or Chinese Communist blocs and return.
5. Subversives, ultrarightists, racists and fascists who meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - (a) Evidence of emotional instability (including unstable residence and employment record) or irrational or suicidal behavior;
 - (b) Expressions of strong or violent anti-U. S. sentiment;
 - (c) Prior acts (including arrests or convictions) or conduct or statements indicating a propensity for violence and antipathy toward good order and government.
6. Individuals involved in illegal bombing or illegal bomb-making.

DETAILS

The following report of investigation was initiated upon receipt of information from a source, DE T-2 on September 4, 1970 to the effect that BARBARA PLISKOW was associated or a member of the White Panther Party. (WPP).

A source advised that the WPP is a national white, hippie oriented revolutionary organization which was found essentially to afford support to the BPP. It has

advocated the published 10 point program of the BPP and to this has added a 10 point program of its own; all of which points call for the unbridled personal freedom of the individual.

C. Arrest History

On January 4, 1971 the Identification Division of the FBI advised that their records failed to locate any record of arrest for subject.

On February 3, 1971, Detective PAUL CHAMBERS, Detroit Police Department advised that subject was arrested on November 25, 1970, and charged with shoplifting. Subject was arrested in the Wrigley's Drug Store, 10010 West Seven Mile, Detroit, Michigan. CHAMBERS further advised that in the course of placing subject under arrest she resisted arrest and refused to be put in a Detroit Police scout car. CHAMBERS also advised that she tried to flee from the police car and while being apprehended scuffled with the patrolmen. CHAMBERS also advised that subject hit a private guard who was working in the Wrigley Drug Store.

Subject works as a psychology teacher at Wayne Community College, Detroit, Michigan.

A source advised that subject was connected with the New University Conference and was listed as the secretary on a newsletter.

A source advised that subject at one time was connected with the New University Conference and has helped raise money for the WPP defense fund. Source advised that the subject is not officially connected with the WPP because she is uncontrollable.

A source advised that BARBARA PLISKOW has been eliminated from all WPP functions.

B. History of Subject's Activities

1. WPP

A source advised that subject will attend the WPP National Convention held at Circle Pine, Michigan on September 23-25, 1970. Source also advised that people attending this convention from Canada are being lodged at subject's residence prior to their transport to the convention site.

A source advised that subject appeared at a fund raising rally supporting White Panthers held at Wayne State University on December 3, 1970. After this rally subject was selling t-shirts that had on the back an M-16 carbine with the words "Political Power Grows Out Of A Barrel Of A Gun".

2. BPP

A source advised that subject pawned her wedding band in order to raise bail money for imprisoned NCCF/BPP member.

Subject attended a meeting at 12847 14th Street, on October 26, 1970 at which meeting means to raise bail money for imprisoned BPP/NCCF member was discussed. At this meeting subject was designated head of a committee to receive reports on fund raising projects.

Subject attended a benefit sponsored by the NCCF/BPP held at University Center Building, Wayne State University, on November 10, 1970, the purpose of which was to raise money.

On December 14, 1970 arrangements were made for female members of the NCCF to function out of PLISKOW's residence.

On January 17, 1971 subject was at a meeting at 611 Continental, Detroit and got into an argument with BPP/NCCF members. She was told to leave and a struggle ensued. Subject subdued four BPP female members and then casually left the meeting.
