Dear Mr. Attorney General:

By a letter dated April 12, 1978, the Committee requested that staff be provided access to the "informant files of all informants within the Invaders during 1968 . . .".

It is now requested that the Memphis Field Office files for these same informants be prepared for access by the staff.

While the Committee feels that the procedure by which I was permitted access to the first set of files was unacceptable and contrary to the Memorandum of Understanding, pending future discussions to arrange to broaden access, this procedure may again be utilized.

It is my understanding that these files will be sanitized only to the extent necessary to protect the identity of the informants.

Again, the Committee reserves the right to request the production of the identity of the informants involved if such is deemed necessary to complete our investigation.

As time is extremely crucial in this matter, your prompt attention in seeing that these files are prepared on a priority basis is greatly appreciated.


