INVESTIGATION AT ST. FRANCIS
HOTEL, HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA,
WHERE GALT RESIDED
JANUARY 21, 1968 TO MARCH 17, 1968

Mr. W. C. BAKER, Los Feliz Branch, United States Post Office, 4633 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, advised on April 15, 1968, that ERIC S. GALT furnished a change of address card on January 22, 1968, showing a change of address from 1535 North Serrano Avenue, Los Angeles, to the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles.

Date 4/14/68

ALLAN O. THOMPSON advised that he was the manager of the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. THOMPSON said that he lives at the hotel. He said that this hotel was primarily a resident hotel and did not cater to transient type people. He said that he has been the manager of the St. Francis Hotel for approximately two years. THOMPSON said that he did, in fact, recall a former tenant ERIC GALT. He produced a registration card, which showed the name ERIC GALT as a tenant from January 21, 1968 until March 17, 1968. He advised that GALT paid a monthly rental rate of \$85. He said that GALT occupied Room 403 in the hotel. Concerning GALT's tenancy, THOMPSON said that he did not recall GALT having an automobile. He said he was certain that he did not obtain a parking ticket as provided by the hotel for occupancy of their automobile parking space. He said that GALT had no telephone in his room. THOMPSON said that on occasion he did receive telephone calls but they were irregular and not of any large number, perhaps six telephone calls per week. THOMPSON advised that the St. Francis Hotel maintains no record of local telephone calls received by tenants and that there is no record of any long distance calls received by GALT. THOMPSON said there was no record of any long distance telephone calls reflected on the registration card. He said that GALT received few letters, perhaps one or two personal letter per week. He advised that GALT received no magazines. THOMPSON did say that GALT watched for these letters and usually came to the desk for his mail at 10:00 A.M. THOMPSON said that he cannot recollect from where the mail came.

THOMPSON said that GALT maintained irregular hours and because of this, he did not appear to have any employment. THOMPSON stated that he did not recall cashing any check for GALT. THOMPSON said that GALT remained alone during his tenancy and had no visitors as to his recollection.

THOMPSON stated that when GALT arrived, he had two regular size brown leather suitcases and when he departed, he left with the same number. He said that the apartment which

GALT occupied was subsequently rented after his departure. He said there were no items left in the room by GALT and that the room was very orderly upon his departure.

THOMPSON described GALT as follows:

THOMPSON stated that he believes that he could identify GALT if shown a photograph of him. Upon review of the registration card by THOMPSON, he stated that the card was not completed and all entries on the card appeared to be written by hotel employees.

THOMPSON produced a Change of Address Order signed by ERIC S. GALT and dated March 17, 1968, advising that his old address of 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California, 90028, has been changed and that his new address is General Delivery, Main Post Office, Atlanta, Georgia. This Change of Address Order further showed that this change of address is temporary until April 25, 1968.

BURTON DAVIDSON advised that he was the owner of Arkay Realty Corporation, which operates the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. He stated that he deposits all receipts of the St. Francis Hotel at the Security First National Bank, Vermont - Hollywood Branch, Los Angeles, California. He said that on February 23, 1968, the receipts of the hotel from February 18, 19, 20 and 21 were deposited. He advised that the total amount of the deposit was \$925.99. He said that his account number is [REDACTED] at the bank.

Mr. DAVIDSON advised that he had no objection for Bureau Agents to review his deposits at the Vermont - Hollywood Branch of the Security First National Bank in locating a check which was negotiated at the bank by ERIC GALT.

Mr. DAVIDSON stated that his home address was 4111 Cromwell, Los Angeles, California.

Mr. ROBERT HAROLD GRAY, house father, Child Guidance Center of Sun Valley, 11582 Sheldon Street, Sun Valley, California, was interviewed at the above address on April 16, 1968, at which time he furnished the following information:

Prior to moving to his present location, Mr. GRAY resided in Room 514 at the Saint Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles (Hollywood), California. He was at the Saint Francis Hotel from approximately the last of June 1967 to March 27, 1968.

Mr. GRAY said the name of ERIC STARVO GALT was entirely unfamiliar to him. He did recall that an adult male Caucasian resided in Room 403 at the Saint Francis Hotel during a portion of the period that he himself resided there. He said that he was employed for a few months, exact dates not recalled, as a desk clerk at the hotel, while he was also a resident of the hotel, so he thus became acquainted with some of the tenants at the hotel. Mr. GRAY said he never became well acquainted with the resident of Room 403, as they resided on different floors in the hotel.

According to Mr. GRAY, the resident of Room 403, "was very average." He said that he would not be able to describe that individual, other than to say that he had the impression the man from Room 403 was, "husky, with an athletic build." He said that man was quiet, did not mingle much with the other guests of the hotel; but did spend quiet a bit of time in the television room, off the hotel lobby. It was GRAY's impression, that the unidentified male from Room 403 particularly enjoyed watching the Thursday night prize fights on the hotel television set. GRAY said that he himself was not interested in the fights so did not spend time in the television room on Thursday evenings.

GRAY was unable to describe the unidentified person's height, weight, color of hair or eyes; nor did he know what kind of a car he might drive. He had no idea whether or not the man was employed.

ROBERT KEELEY, Room 409, St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California advised that he was the desk clerk of the St. Francis Hotel and normally worked the day shift. He said that he did, in fact, recall ERIC S. GALT. KEELEY said that GALT resided at the St. Francis Hotel from January 21, 1968 until March 17, 1968. KEELEY advised that GALT paid his rent to him on February 21, 1968. He said that included in the total payment was a business check, the nature of which he could not recall. KEELEY said that he believes that this check was received by GALT in the mail the same date of the rent payment. He said that the check perhaps was for an amount of \$40.00. KEELEY said the balance of the rent payment was in cash. He advised that other than the check, he could recall nothing unusual about the manner of payment.

KEELEY said that GALT had no telephone. He said that due to the irregular hours that GALT maintained, he believed him to be unemployed. KEELEY said he had no knowledge as to whether GALT owned or operated an automobile.

KEELEY said that each desk clerk utilizes the same procedure in handling rental payments at the St. Francis Hotel. He advised that at the end of each shift, the money and checks are placed in a plain white envelope and sealed. This envelope is then date stamped and then placed into a safe through a mail slot. KEELEY said that the owner of the hotel, Mr. DAVIDSON, periodically opens the safe and deposits the receipts at a bank with whom he does business.

On April 12, 1968, DONALD LOUDENBACK was interviewed at his place of employment and residence the Stanley Hotel, 1755 Wilcox Street, Los Angeles, California. LOUDENBACK advised that he is the occupant of Room 221 in the Stanley Hotel. He stated that he has occupied that room since November, 1967. LOUDENBACK advised that he does not recall ever meeting any person by the name of ERIC GALT and he was unable to explain how a Stanley Hotel card bearing the notation Room 221 would have been in the possession of GALT or in GALT's records at the St. Francis Hotel in Los Angeles. LOUDENBACK was shown artist conceptions received from both Birmingham and Memphis with negative results. LOUDENBACK advised that he has not done any painting jobs other than for the hotel for the entire year of 1968 to date. He stated that he may have given out one of the hotel cards with his room number on it to any person he might have met in a bar or on the street. LOUDENBACK was unable to furnish any information pertaining to any person by the name of GALT.

During the course of the investigation to determine background on one ERIC S. GALT, it was ascertained that he probably attended some dance school in the Los Angeles area. Through a telephonic survey of the various dance schools throughout the Los Angeles area it was determined from Mr. RODNEY ARVIDSON, owner, National Dance Studio, 2026 Pacific Avenue, Long Beach, California, that ERIC GALT enrolled at this school during the first week of December, 1967, and took lessons until approximately February 12, 1968.

Mr. RODNEY ARVIDSON, owner - operator, National Dance Studio, 2026 Pacific Avenue, Long Beach, California, telephone 591-5651, advised as follows:

He recalled ERIC GALT as a dancing student who enrolled at National Dance Studio during the first week of December 1967, and who subsequently quit taking lessons quite abruptly on approximately February 12, 1968.

ARVIDSON stated that during this period of time he had several occasions to talk with GALT and on at least one occasion he interviewed GALT for approximately two hours, in an attempt to benefit him socially through his dance lessons at the studio.

Through his conversations with GALT, ARVIDSON stated that he was told by GALT that he had been in Mexico and as he, ARVIDSON, recalled he believed it was in the early part of 1967. ARVIDSON stated that he believed GALT informed him that he owned a restaurant in Mexico City. ARVIDSON stated that he spoke Spanish fluently and when he conversed with GALT in Spanish, GALT did not reply, leading ARVIDSON to believe that GALT was not conversant to any degree in that language. ARVIDSON stated that GALT used rather poor language, leading him, ARVIDSON, to believe that he had achieved education no higher than high school.

ARVIDSON recalled that he never saw GALT in any attire other than shirt and tie. He often wore a very expensive pair of alligator shoes which ARVIDSON believed were loafer cut. GALT told him sometime during their conversations that he was a merchant seaman and that he very much desired to return to the sea.

Upon terminating his dance instructions, GALT stated that he wanted to attend bartending school in order

that he may open his own restaurant, and his dance instructions were conflicting with his desires to attend bartending school.

ARVIDSON stated that GALT was somewhat backward socially and was a poor dancing student because he was ill at ease with others. GALT could never seem to relax while in a mixed group or around other people. ARVIDSON recalled that GALT was driving a white automobile, make and model unrecalled by ARVIDSON.

ARVIDSON stated since GALT was a student for such a short period of time he did not obtain a photograph of him, which was customary for all students enrolled in the dance studio.

GALT did not smile readily, was pleasant but very evasive. He would not talk about himself at all and would not look the individual he was conversing with in the eye. He was bashful and a true introvert and smiled with a crooked smile. To ARVIDSON's recollection, GALT never appeared at the dance studio with any associates, male or female.

ARVIDSON stated that he was of the opinion that GALT was a complete loner, was transient, although he seemed to have money. ARVIDSON recalled that in each instance when GALT paid for dance instruction as agreed, he removed a roll of bills from his trouser pocket and paid his account as agreed.

ARVIDSON stated that ARDELLE, a part-time dancing employee, instructed GALT more than any other of the National Dance Studio employees. ARVIDSON stated that ARDELLE was the nickname of SHARON RHOADS, 5411 Don Ricardo Drive, Los Angeles, residence telephone 293-2616. ARVIDSON stated that RHOADS was employed by Charter Title Company, located on Wilshire Boulevard, Beverly Hills, California, business telephone O F 9-0326.

ARVIDSON was shown three photographs, a composite drawing of the KING assailant furnished from Memphis, Tennessee, a description of the assailant of KING from Birmingham, Alabama, and a photograph of JEROME WALLACE VERNON. He was asked by SA GEORGE E. AIKEN, JR., if any of the above three photographs appeared to be similar in facial characteristics to ERIC GALT. After viewing the photographs, Mr. ARVIDSON chose the photograph submitted from Memphis, Tennessee, as being very similar in facial characteristics to GALT. He stated that the eye region, the nose region, and ears look very similar to GALT; however, the hair line and chin line were a little bit different. When he looked at the photograph, he stated the above mentioned photograph furnished from Memphis, reminded him of GALT very much.

Mr. RODNEY ARVIDSON, owner - operator, National Dance Studio, 2026 Pacific Avenue, Long Beach, California, telephone 591-5651, was interviewed at his place of business, at which time he provided the following official National Dance Studio records for review by SA GEORGE E. AIKEN, JR.:

A National Dance Studio "Enrollment Agreement and Contract for Dancing Instruction", reflected that ERIC GALT, residence 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California, telephone 469-8096, on December 14, 1967, executed an enrollment agreement, agreeing to take a course of 50 hour lessons for the total amount of \$499. The course consisted of 25 private hour lessons and 25 party or group technique hour lessons.

GALT paid \$100 on account and agreed to pay the balance of \$399 under the following terms:

\$149 due December 18, 1967;

\$50 per week until the contract was paid in full.

The National Dance Studio agreed to give the above stated 50 hour lessons within four months from the date of execution and stipulated that this course of 50 hours of dance instructions expired on March 14, 1968. The contract was signed by ERIC S. GALT and A.S. JORGENSEN, Dance Instructor.

National Dance Studio Card Number 66429, a dance analysis card used by instructors, in the name of ERIC GALT, 1535 Serrano, reflected that the dance student had previously had dance lessons in the State of Alabama, had taken fox trot and cha cha dancing. It was dated December 5, 1967, and reflected that GALT's dancing counselor was Miss LIPTON and instructor was ARDELLE.

The card also reflected that a box adjacent to the letter "S" had been checked indicating that GALT was single.

CATHRYN NORTON, Dance Instructor, National Dance Studio, 2026 Pacific Boulevard, advised that she frequently gave dancing lessons to a Mr. ERIC GALT from December 1967 to February 1968. GALT told her he was a merchant seaman but was not presently working. He said he was attending bartenders school but did not say where. He said he was unemployed at the present time. GALT was not known to be friendly with any of the other students or instructors. GALT was never observed in an automobile. On one occasion GALT attended a party at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. PAUL CARLSON, 260 St. Joseph Avenue, Long Beach, telephone number GE 9-8289, during latter part of December 1967. NORTON also attended the party but did not accompany GALT to the party. The party was arranged through the dance studio and GALT was no friend or close associate of the CARLSONs. About 20 other people attended this party. GALT arrived and left the party alone. He stayed pretty much to himself during the party and was generally uncommunicative. While at the party he drank some punch containing alcohol. NORTON said her conversations with GALT were limited almost exclusively to dancing. GALT was rather withdrawn and furnished very little background detail concerning himself and was often evasive. GALT said he liked to travel. GALT was a fair dancer. His car was never seen by NORTON. She described GALT as follows:

ANDREAS JORGENSEN, Instructor, National Dance Studio, 2026 Pacific Boulevard, advised that ERIC GALT was a student at the studio from approximately December 1967 to mid February 1968. GALT attended only one group dance session and was very unsociable in the sense that he communicated in no substantial manner with the other students or instructors. He was very evasive concerning his background. He took general recreational type dance instruction in courses including the Cha-Cha, Fox Trot and Swing. He was a pretty good dancer. He paid \$465 in cash for the entire course. He took the money from a roll of bills from his pocket and there was nothing unusual about the currency or denominations. On one occasion, JORGENSEN observed GALT's car parked near the studio. It was a late model white car, make and license unknown. He never observed GALT smoking and does not know if he is right or left handed. GALT appeared in good health and he claimed to be single. He described GALT as follows:

himself as 175 pounds, 5'10" and as having no physical defects. This application was signed by ERIC S. GALT.

LAU made available the above application, indicating he observed GALT complete and sign this application in his office on January 19, 1968. LAU also made available the Installment Notice dated January 19, 1968 at Los Angeles, California, payable to International School of Bartending in the amount of \$125 for a six week bartending course and signed ERIC S. GALT and TOMAS REYES LAU. LAU stated he also observed GALT sign this document on January 19, 1968.

LAU also made available a color photograph and negative dated March 2, 1968 depicting GALT and LAU together in LAU's office on March 2, 1968, the date of GALT's graduation from the International School of Bartending.

LAU recalls GALT driving a dark, possibly black, late and small model Ford having red interior bearing out of state license plates, possibly black and white in color.

LAU recalls that approximately one week after GALT's graduation on March 2, 1968, GALT telephonically contacted him (LAU) at which time LAU advised him that he had a possible job opportunity for him as a bartender. GALT advised LAU that he was leaving town within two weeks for an undisclosed destination to visit his brother and did not wish to take a job at this time. GALT stated that he would return to Los Angeles and check with LAU regarding employment at that time.

LAU stated he had no information which would indicate that GALT has held a position as a bartender in the Los Angeles area. LAU stated that while GALT was a student at this school, he did not observe him to associate closely with any other student. LAU continued that GALT did not talk about himself, his past experiences or any associates.

DONALD J. JACOBS, 320 North Ardmore, Apartment 310, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed at his residence at which time he furnished the following information:

Mr. JACOBS related that he attended the International School of Bartending, 2125 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, during January and February, 1968. While attending the International School of Bartending, he became acquainted with an individual known only to him as ERIC. A photograph of ERIC GALT was exhibited to Mr. JACOBS and he related the individual depicted in the photograph was identical to the person he knew as ERIC.

GALT's station at the bartending school was along side of JACOBS' station. During the time that they were attending bartending school, ERIC stayed to himself and was very quiet. He never mentioned where he was from or anything about his family. He did not sound like an educated person and never talked about politics, women, or his past. He had no close associates at school and the only person who talked much with him was a person known as DICK VAN.

ERIC would answer only direct questions and never elaborated on answers. He did state he had been a cook in the Merchant Marines and worked in that capacity on river boats and barges on the Mississippi River, occasionally mentioning New Orleans, Louisiana. He said that for long periods of time he did not get to spend money, due to the type of work he had been doing, and so it did not take much money to live. He never mentioned going out with women and gave the impression that he was quite serious-minded. He, in answer to a direct question as to why he was attending bartending school, stated that the work of a cook was too difficult and a bartender had it much easier.

ERIC seemed quite deliberate in his actions, was slow in catching on to the courses at the bartending school, but was very diligent. He did not have an accent of any type. On arriving at school each day, he immediately went to work. He seldom took breaks and he could not recall that ERIC used profanity to any large degree. He could recall no conversation with ERIC which indicated that ERIC had been in the military and ERIC never said anything which caused JACOBS to doubt his background. JACOBS did recall that ERIC was absent from school on a few occasions and could not recall that ERIC ever mentioned the reasons for this absence. He stated that he, JACOBS, was at school every day and so was aware when ERIC was absent. JACOBS did not know what type of transportation ERIC used to get to and from school.

He stated that he could remember no one in the school at that time by the name of ERIC GALT, but stated that he did not know everyone who was in school at that time.

ROBERTS was asked specific questions concerning GALT and was unable to furnish any information.

He stated that should he remember anything having to do with this individual he would immediately contact the FBI Office in Los Angeles.

GERALD BONGIORNO was interviewed at his residence, 412 El Dorado, Arcadia, California by SA E. RHEAD RICHARDS, JR. and SA GEORGE E. AIKEN, JR. at which time he furnished the following information:

BONGIORNO stated that he had been a student at the International School of Bartending, 2125 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, California from January 19, 1968 until March, 1968. He stated that he knew that a person named ERIC GALT was in the class during this same period of time but that he had very little contact with him. He stated further that he only spoke to GALT on one or two occasions and that they always spoke about things pertaining to their schooling as bartenders.

BONGIORNO was asked specific questions concerning the habits, disposition, clothing and other characteristics of GALT and he stated that he could remember nothing which would be pertinent. He advised that if something came to his mind in the future concerning GALT that he would immediately contact the Los Angeles Office of the FBI.

CHARLES J. STEIN, 5666 Franklin Avenue, Los Angeles, California, advised that he first met an individual named ERIC S. GALT on December 14, 1967, at a bar known as the Sultan Room in the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. STEIN advised that his sister, RITA STEIN, also of 5666 Franklin Avenue, was present, along with his cousin, MARIE MARTIN, #201, St. Francis Hotel.

STEIN advised that GALT offered to drive himself and STEIN to New Orleans, Louisiana, for the purpose of picking up RITA's two children and returning these two children to Los Angeles. STEIN advised that GALT stipulated he would make the trip on the condition that he (STEIN), RITA and MARIE register for GEORGE WALLACE. STEIN advised that GALT made the statement that WALLACE needs so many registrations to get on the ticket in California.

STEIN advised that the following morning, December 15, 1967, GALT picked him up, along with RITA and MARIE, at the St. Francis Hotel and transported them in a white Mustang to a voter's registration place on Lankershim Boulevard in the Los Angeles area. STEIN stated GALT let the three of them out of the Mustang at the front door of the registration building, and they went inside to begin registering. STEIN advised that the three of them were in the process of registering for WALLACE when GALT came in. STEIN stated that it was his impression that GALT was known by the people in the building recording the registrations. STEIN advised that GALT sat down behind them and observed their registrations.

STEIN stated that after completing the registration, he, RITA, MARIE and GALT returned to 5666 Franklin Avenue, where RITA and MARIE departed. STEIN stated that he picked up some clothing at this residence and then went to GALT's residence on North Serrano. STEIN stated GALT went inside to obtain clothing while he waited in the car. STEIN advised that he and GALT then departed for New Orleans, traveling on a

southern route through the cities of Yuma, Tucson and El Paso.

STEIN advised that while en route to New Orleans, GALT made several telephone calls. STEIN stated that most of these calls were made while traveling through Texas. STEIN advised that these calls were made from pay phones, and he did not know to whom they were being made. STEIN stated that during the trip GALT told him he was from Alabama and planned to return to Alabama.

STEIN stated GALT told him that he had recently returned from Mexico, where he formerly had part ownership of a bar. STEIN stated GALT mentioned that his former partner had been Mexican, and the bar was located near a seaport or boats. STEIN stated GALT told him he had sold his interest in the bar to the Mexican partner.

STEIN stated that during the trip to New Orleans it became his impression through conversation with GALT that GALT was involved in the campaign to nominate GEORGE WALLACE in California. STEIN also advised that prior to their reaching New Orleans, GALT told him he had to contact some people in New Orleans. STEIN advised it was his recollection that GALT had to contact an engineering or contracting firm in New Orleans, but he could not be sure. STEIN advised that during the trip to New Orleans he took some photographs of the countryside. STEIN advised he could not remember whether or not GALT was in any of the snapshots but furnished the undeveloped roll of film to the FBI.

STEIN advised that upon reaching New Orleans, GALT expressed the desire to stay at a motel instead of at STEIN's mother's residence. STEIN stated that he directed GALT to a motel in the 1000 block of Charter Street, name unknown, between Ursuline and St. Phillip Streets, New Orleans. STEIN advised that they had driven straight through from Los Angeles to New Orleans, arriving in New Orleans on December 17, 1967.

STEIN advised that after GALT registered at the motel, he and GALT proceeded to the residence of his (STEIN's) mother, CLOVINA ALONZO, 1907½ Royal Street, New Orleans. STEIN advised that GALT left him there.

STEIN stated that the following day, December 18, 1967, he met GALT on a street near the Royal Street residence. STEIN advised that GALT had become lost and was proceeding to STEIN's mother's residence for directions. STEIN stated that at this time GALT told him he had contacted the individuals he needed to contact and wanted to begin the trip back to Los Angeles. STEIN advised that GALT later telephoned him and told him he had ascertained that a storm was presently blocking their return route, and that they would begin the return trip on the following day.

STEIN advised that he, GALT and RITA's two children departed for Los Angeles on December 19, 1967. STEIN stated that once again they drove straight through, stopping only for food and gasoline. STEIN advised that GALT paid cash for all expenses incurred on the trip. STEIN also advised that GALT did not make any personal contacts with anyone during the entire time he was with GALT.

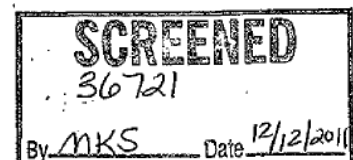
STEIN advised that during the course of the trip, both to and from New Orleans, GALT expressed the view that if the Negro wants to be a free man, he should go to the north or west, and if the Negro wants to be a slave, he should remain in the south.

STEIN advised that they returned to Los Angeles on December 21, 1967, and GALT drove them to 5666 Franklin Avenue. STEIN advised that GALT left them there, and he has not seen GALT again.

STEIN described GALT as follows:
