During the Spring of 1965, date not recalled, he delivered a speech at St. Mary's Dominican College, New Orleans, Louisiana, the theme of which was the "Ku Klux Klan". During this speech he was questioned extensively by a white male, approximately 55 to 60 years of age, 5'8" to 5'9", 150 pounds, thin face, high cheek bones with receding gray hair which was combed straight back. He recalls that this individual was dressed in a suit and tie and appeared to be alone. He does not recall that this individual at any point identified himself as a member of the Ku Klux Klan, however, he had the impression that the individual definitely was conservative in his political thinking. BOTNICK denies advising anyone following the speech that this heckler was known to him or that the ADL had an extensive file on him. He might have said that the ADL maintained extensive files on klan members.

Since the time of this speech, BOTNICK has seen and conversed with the aforementioned white male on approximately eight occasions, the most recent one being during Mardi Gras (February, 1968) when the individual approached him at the K & B Cafeteria, 200 St. Charles Street, New Orleans, while he, BOTNICK, was eating lunch. On other occasions he has observed this individual at the Holsum Cafeteria on Gravier Street in New Orleans. During the conversations which he has had with this individual the individual has continually asked BOTNICK what the ADL has against patriotism. The individual has not on any occasion introduced himself to BOTNICK nor has he indicated background information.

BOTNICK was unable to furnish the identity of any individuals who might have witnessed his confrontation with this individual at St. Mary's Dominican College other than Stanley MARY LOUISE, past president of that institution.

Sister MARY RAPHAEL, O.P., an instructor at St. Mary's Dominican College, New Orleans, Louisiana, was interviewed and advised as follows:

On April 27, 1965, she attended a speech by ADOLPH I. BOTNICK, Regional Director, Anti-Defamation League (ADL), at St. Mary's Dominican College in New Orleans. The subject of Mr. BOTNICK's speech was the Ku Klux Klan, following which there was a short question and answer period. During the question and answer period a white male in his 50s, approximately 5'9", 150 pounds, with a lined weathered face asked a pointed question of BOTNICK, the text of which is not recalled. Subsequently BOTNICK answered this individual in such a manner as to make him appear the fool. The manner in which Mr. BOTNICK answered this question caused the nuns present to feel a degree of sympathy towards the white male questioner. Immediately following BOTNICK's presentation, Sister RAPHAEL approached the questioner, who introduced himself to her as Mr. GUZMAN and indicated to her that he was affiliated with law enforcement in the State of Louisiana and displayed a card or badge to her. She recalls the last name GUZMAN because it is the name of St. DOMINIC.

She is unable to recall any companion or any individual who accompanied Mr. GUZMAN and she is certain that she was the first individual to talk to him following the termination of Mr. BOTNICK's speech. She has not seen or heard from Mr. GUZMAN since their meeting at Mr. BOTNICK's speech. She recalls that Mr. GUZMAN was dressed in a suit and tie.

The files of the New Orleans Office reveal that on February 19, 1967, a confidential source of the New Orleans Office advised that investigators of District Attorney JIM GARRISON were attempting to locate a BOB GUZMAN, a former private investigator for GUY BANNISTER. BANNISTER, who is deceased, was Special Agent in Charge and also Private Detective in New Orleans.

On March 1, 1967, BOB GUZMAN, 727 First Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, appeared at the New Orleans Office, where he advised he was currently employed by FRANK MANNING, of the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Louisiana. GUZMAN advised he had worked as an investigator for BANNISTER and this was the reason that District Attorney GARRISON was seeking him. GUZMAN was described as a white male, in his 50's, 5'8", 150 pounds, swarthy complexion, gray hair.

In view of GUZMAN's involvement in GARRISON's investigation, no attempt is being made by the New Orleans Office to interview him.

MARIAN de GRASSE, eighteen year old daughter of MARIE MARTIN, and granddaughter of LORRAINE CALLOWAY, was interviewed at the residence and in the presence of LORRAINE CALLOWAY, 609 Bartholomew Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. de GRASSE advised as follows:

de GRASSE lived with her mother on Delongpre Street, Los Angeles, California, from a period of July, 1966, to August, 1966, and again from a period of February 16, 1967, to late April, 1967. During this last period of residence in Los Angeles, she lived with her mother on Fargo Street, Los Angeles. de GRASSE has no recollection of exact addresses, but does recall that she and her mother lived in the first floor of an apartment house on Delongpre Street, located near Fontain Avenue, and that they occupied a house on Fargo Street, during the last visit.

de GRASSE, who had intended to attend high school in Los Angeles, and did attend Marshall High School in Los Angeles, for one or two days, discovered that she did not like the high school or Los Angeles as a city, and thus the reason for her return to New Orleans.

de GRASSE has, since her last return from Los Angeles, received two boxes of clothing and personal effects from her mother and which clothing and personal effects she had left behind when she departed for New Orleans. The first box was received by de GRASSE about two weeks after December 11, 1967, which date MARIAN reentered high school in New Orleans, and thus the reason why she remembers the approximate time that she received the first box of clothing.

On March 16, 1968, de GRASSE received a telephone call from her mother in Los Angeles, at which time her mother advised her that she was sending, with a friend, a second box of clothing and that the name of this friend is ERIC. The mother stated that the box probably would arrive in a couple of days. de GRASSE remembers the exact date of this

phone call because she recalls mentioning to her mother that her grandmother, LORRAINE CALLOWAY, would be coming to dinner on St. Patrick's Day. de GRASSE, at this time, and also at the present time, is residing with friends at 2529 Cambronne Street, New Orleans, and this is the location where she received the telephone call from her mother.

de GRASSE actually received the second box on March 24, 1968, and further that she received this box from LORRAINE CALLOWAY, and that LORRAINE CALLOWAY had indicated that the box had been delivered to the residence of THERESA STONE and then subsequently brought to the CALLOWAY residence by DALE RODRIGUEZ. de GRASSE remembers the date March 24, 1968, because she made a note in her diary under this date that she had received a box of clothing from her grandmother.

de GRASSE recalls that both boxes had been wrapped in brown wrapping paper which she says has now been thrown away and that she seems to recall that the second box had been open, with the brown wrapping paper torn when she received it. The boxes were both cardboard and have since been disposed of.

de GRASSE recalls that the first box contained a picture album of photographs that she had taken of scenic views and of friends in the Los Angeles area, as well as dresses, shoes, and perfumes.

de GRASSE recalls that the second box, which she thinks was perhaps a box originally utilized for cartons of Kent cigarettes, contained some of her phonograph records, skirts, blouses, shoes, boots, and some old hair dressing which she said she threw away because it was not sufficiently fresh.

de GRASSE, while residing with her mother in Los Angeles, never heard the name ERIC GALT mentioned and upon viewing photographs of JAMES EARL RAY stated that she had never before seen this individual.

She stated that this car, after it had passed her residence, turned around in a driveway and then parked directly in front of her residence. CALLOWAY recognized the driver of this car to be her nephew, CHARLES STEIN, whom she had not seen for approximately three years, and who, for the past several years, has been a resident of Los Angeles, California. CALLOWAY is unable to furnish a description of the individual who remained in the car, other than his being a white male with dark hair. CALLOWAY recalled that this individual was sort of hunched up in the seat and looked as though he were somewhat cramped from a long drive. CALLOWAY did not observe this individual to turn his face in her direction.

STEIN advised that his companion was tired after a long trip and wanted to take a bath and that therefore he and his friend would go on, but that he, STEIN, would drop back. Some time in February, or March, 1968, during the early evening hours, her husband accepted a telephone call from a male individual who stated that he would deliver that evening a box of clothing from MARIE MARTIN in Los Angeles, California. Mrs. DALE RODRIGUEZ, wife of HERBERT RODRIGUEZ, 4019 Royal Street, stated that upon further recollection from her previous interview the night before, stated that both she and her husband, after receiving a telephone call from an unknown male, who advised he was bringing a box, stayed up until approximately 10:00 or 10:30 p.m. that evening and thereafter went to bed. Approximately one-half hour later she recalls someone knocking at the door and that her husband stated he did not wish to be bothered by any visitors and that thereafter she answered the door, accepted the box, which she described as an opened box similar to a canned goods box one would receive from a grocery store to carry home purchases. She stated she recalled asking the individual how MIMI was and could recall no further conversation. She stated she did not let him in the house or turn on any lights. She further recalled that at this time it was raining and windy. She stated that she felt the individual was approximately 5'7" to 5'8" tall and could not identify any photographs of RAY.

She further recalled that Mrs. LORRAINE CALLOWAY, mother of her husband, HERBERT RODRIGUEZ, came by their residence approximately two days later when she was bringing THERESA STONE's daughter, DENISE, home from school; and, at this time, picked up the box and took it back to her, MRS. CALLOWAY's residence. Mrs. RODRIGUEZ stated she had no knowledge of RAY's previous trip to New Orleans with STEIN in December, 1967. She stated she did not see STEIN and if she knew of the trip it would have been by word of mouth from her sister-in-law, THERESA STONE.

THERESA STONE, residing 4019 Royal Street, and employed at the 500 Back Stage in the French Quarter, advised that she recalls approximately one month ago seeing a box sitting in the living room of her residence with some clothes and other items which she could not recall. She stated that she subsequently learned from her brother or sister-in-law that these were items of clothes for MIMI's daughter, MARIAN DEGRASSE.

Mrs. STONE stated that this is the only box of clothing she saw or knew about. However, she recalls that in the middle or latter part of December, 1967, and places the date as December 18 because she does not work on Sundays or Tuesdays, which would be December 17 and 19 respectively, being at her cousin, MARIE LEE's residence in the 1400 block of Burgundy Street. She stated at this time she was there to see her other cousin, CHARLIE STEIN and recalls STEIN receiving a phone call from an unnamed individual which resulted in STEIN asking her the direction for this person to reach the Burgundy Street address. She does not recall now where STEIN stated this individual was located at the time of the call. She further recalls that this was in the vicinity of 9:00 p.m. or shortly thereafter, and that she was anxious to leave for work. She stated she left the residence and while standing by the street in front of the residence a white male individual approached them and was introduced to her by CHARLIE STEIN. She recalled that she immediately left for her place of employment and did not take notice of the name of the individual or any particular descriptive data concerning him. Mrs. STONE was unable to recognize any of the photographs of RAY as the individual to whom she was introduced by STEIN. She further recalled that her cousin, MARIE LEE, was still at the residence when she, STONE, left.
