Investigation at Everett, Pa., disclosed that THOMAS S. SMOUSE of RD #1, Everett, is a gasoline attendant at the Esso Service Station on the westbound lane of the Pennsylvania Turnpike near Bedford, Pa.

SMOUSE was contacted at his place of employment by SA JOHN S. HUCHES on 5/7/68, when his letter to the Bureau was orally acknowledged.

SMOUSE stated that at approximately 2:00 AM on 4/21/68, a man came into his service station and asked if he could sleep in his vehicle for approximately one-half hour. The man explained that he had to be in Chicago, Ill., on Sunday, 4/22/68, and that he did not desire to sleep too long. SMOUSE stated that the man went into the rest room in the gasoline station and then returned and made the comment to SMOUSE that he felt that he was much too tired to sleep for only one-half hour and decided that it would be better if SMOUSE would awake him at approximately 5:00 AM.

SMOUSE stated that he permitted the man to sleep in the car until 5:00 AM and then attempted to arouse him. At this point, two young Pennsylvania State Police officers came into the service station and SMOUSE explained the problem to them. He stated that they laughingly blew the siren on the State Police vehicle frightening the man badly. He stated they did not question him even though he, SMOUSE, noted to these officers that the man in his opinion looked very much like the man who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING.

SMOUSE advised that he was suspicious of the man because of his haggard looking condition and because of his dirty dress and, therefore, took the license number of the vehicle, a blue Mustang, which he described as having Georgia license

SMOUSE advised that shortly after the State Police blew the siren, the man departed in a westerly direction in the above-described vehicle.

On 5/2/38 RAY GAINES, Bartender, Dennis Care, located corner of Evans and Murphy Avenue, S. W., Atlanta, Ga., advised he could not recall anyone meeting the physical description of a person resembling JAMES EARL RAY who was reportedly in Dennis' Cafe on 4/29/38. GAINES viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and advised he could not recall anyone resembling these photographs having been in Dennis Cafe.

On 5/5/38 WALTER JONES, Assistant Manager, Atlanta Municipal Airport, advised the maintenance employees at the Atlanta Airport are employed by the City of Atlanta, Rawlings Cleaners, and the American Building Maintenance Company. JONES advised the maintenance employees wear their last names only on their shirts and their records fail to reflect anyone with the last name of GEONGE ever being employed by the City. We stated there is no person working on the late shift with the list name of GEONGE. He stated they did have a person by the name of GEONGE EDWARD MEEKS who has been employed by them since 1954 that works the first shift. JONES viewed photographs of JAMES EARL NAY and stated he is certain he has no one employed by them who resembles the photograph of RAY.

On 5/3/33 JOHN DALEY, kawlings Cleaners, Atlanta Airport Terminal, advised they had had no white male employed by them on the late shift. He advised they had no one employed by them with the last name of GEORGE nor did they have anyone employed by them who resembled the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY.

On 5/3/68 JERRY MOORE, American Building Maintenance Company, advised they have no white males employed by them.

On 5/3/68 JAMES H. VAUGHN, 3376 Brookfield Lane, Decatur, Ga., advised the individual he had seen at Dennis Cafe on 4/29/68 was wearing navy blue trousers with a white cloth block under the belt seam where he had observed the name GEORGE. He stated the man was 26 to 40 years of age and needed to shave. VAUGHN viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and was unable to definitely state that the individual he had seen at Dennis Cafe was identical to RAY. VAUGHN advised he had heard a story at Dennis Cafe to the effect that several days after KING was murdered an individual had been to Dennis Cafe and had several thousand dollars in his possession which he was flashing around and claimed to have several thousand more outside in his car. This individual reportedly was talking about the murderer of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING and appeared to be quite knowledgeable on this subject. VAUGHN stated everyone at Dennis Cafe felt this individual was involved in the murder of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING. VAUGHN advised he had heard this story from the bartender at Dennis Cafe. VAUGHN stated he had thereafter become suspicious of the man he had seen at Dennis Cafe on the night of 4/29/68. He stated this individual claimed he had previously worked as a carpet installation man.

VAUGHN advised LARRY, an upholster who frequents Dennis Cafe, had told him about the man having been in Dennis Cafe after KING was killed. LARRY claimed this man had come into the bar and had approximately \$5,000 spread out on the table, stating that he had \$8,000 more in his car and had talked about KING being killed. Besides LARRY, a wino named EDDIE who is retired from the Army had reportedly talked to this individual. RAY GAINES, the bartender, had told him that dayy that an FBI agent had showed him a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and he believed the individual who had been in the cafe with the money was identical to JAMES EARL RAY. RAY GAINES claimed that this individual had returned to the Dennis Cafe several times since then but was wearing glasses and had a bald spot in the back of his head.

On 5/6/68 RAY GAINES, bartender, Dennis Care, home address $1185\frac{1}{2}$ Regent Street, S. W., advised he recalled the individual who reportedly had a great sum of money that had stopped in at Dennis Cafe shortly after KING was killed.

He stated he had not personally observed this money but was told about this by LARRY HUMPHRIES. He stated this individual has been back at least two times, the last time being approximately 4/26/68. He advised that the first time this individual had been at the bar he had stayed three or four hours and had set up the house on two occasions to drinks. He advised this individual had come into the care alone and had left the same way. GAINES pointed out EDDIE LASSETER as a person who had sat with this individual.

EDDIE LASSETER, 1485 Langston Avenue, S. W., Atlanta, Ga., advised he recalled the evening the man had come to Dennis Cafe and had purchased him several drinks. He stated he had never seen this individual before and has not seen him since that time. He stated he has no idea as to the identity of the individual. He viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and was unable to positively identify the man who had been at the cafe as being identical to JAMES EARL RAY.

On 5/6/68 LARRY HUMPHRIES, 1391 Kenelworth Drive, was interviewed at his place of employment, Lane's Funniture Company, College Park, Ga. HUMPHRIES stated that several days after KING was murdered a white male had come into Dennis Cafe having approximately \$4,000 in his pocket. HUMPHRIES stated although he had not counted the money he is fairly certain that this individual had a large sum of money. He stated that this person advised he had \$8,000 more in his car. He advised that this person had stated that he had to leave to go back to He stated this individual wore glasses and Birmingham. talked intoxicated. He stated this individual mentioned something about the first gun the assassin bought was not the right gun. He stated this individual also appeared to know a great deal about the KING murder that was not commonly HUMPHRIES advised he did not believe the individual was identical to the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY which were He stated this man talked in the third person shown to him. and never made any statement that he had killed KING. advised this individual had dark hair and wore glasses and had also talked to Sgt. JENKINS who is assigned Ft. McPherson, Ga.

On 5/7/68 Sgt. HAROLD JENKINS, Ft. McPherson, Ga., advised he had heard the story concerning the person with a lot of money who had been to the Dennis Cafe but that he, JENKINS, had not been present at Dennis Cafe on this particular evening. JENKINS stated that at that time he had just gotten out of the Post Stockade and was out of town. JENKINS could furnish no information which would assist in identifying this individual.

On 5/7/68 GEORGE EDWARD MEEKS was interviewed at the Atlanta Municipal Airport. MEEKS was determined not to be identical with JAMES EARL RAY. MEEKS stated one MARVIN F. GERALD, was formerly employed for Sears Roebuck and Company as a carpet installation man, and that this is the only person working the third shift who had formerly been employed as a carpet installer. MEEKS, and WALTER JONES, Assistant Manger, Atlanta Municipal Airport, advised MARVIN F. GERALD has been known to them for more than a year and they are certain he is not identical to JAMES EARL RAY. They advised GERALD did not resemble photograph of JAMES EARL RAY.

On 5/14/68 RAY GAINES, bartender, Dennis Cafe, advised the person who had been at Dennis Cafe shortly after KING's murder and who had displayed a great deal of money at Dennis Cafe had been seen by him sitting on the porch at 1715 Evans Drive. GAINES drove by the address, 1715 Evans Drive, and pointed out the individual to whom he had referred.

On 5/14/68 JESS LEE CANIDA, 1715 Evans Drive, S. W., Atlanta, Ga., was interviewed and was determined not to be identical to JAMES EARL RAY. CANIDA has been residing on Evans Street for the past four years. He is employed at McLain Manufacturing Company and was born at Haleyville, Ala. He stated he normally tells people he is from Birmingham, Ala. CANIDA and CANIDA's wife, DOT CANIDA, advised JESS CANIDA has been on a "drunk" for over a month. CANIDA advised that he could not recall having been in Dennis Cafe, but is an alcoholic and cannot recall

all of his activities for the past month. CANIDA advised he has no information concerning the murder of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and the only information that he had had was what he had read in the newspaper concerning KING's death prior to going on a drunk. It is noted that CANIDA wore glasses, has black hair with bald spot in the back and closely fit the description of the individual who had been at Dennis Cafe. It is further noted that the bartender, RAY GAINES, had positively identified CANIDA as being the person who had been at the cafe.

HAROLD G. ANDERSON resided at 113 14th St., Room #2, from approximately 4/7-9/68. That was the room formerly occupied by JAMES EARL RAY, and apparently ANDERSON was the first individual to occupy that room after RAY left that address on approximately 4/5/68.

Extensive investigation has been conducted to locate ANDERSON inasmuch as he left Atlanta on about 4/9/68, in the company of WILLIAM JENNINGS BRYAN LEE, and went to the Detroit, Michigan, area.

JAMES R. WILLOUGHBY, currently residing at 44 14th Street, N.E., Atlanta, resided in Room 8, 113 14th Street, from 4/1-12/68. He claims that on two occasions he saw an individual at 113 14th Street whom he believed to be identical with RAY. He stated he saw this individual on approximately 4/2 and 4/11/68.

WILLOUGHBY furnished this information on 5/18/68. Since that time, WILLOUGHBY has telephonically contacted the writer on the night of 5/15/68, at which time he stated he thought the FBI was looking for the wrong individual in this case, but did not state why, and admitted he had been drinking heavily that evening. WILLOUGHBY again contacted the writer on the evening of 5/16/68, stating he was at Lum's which was a hotdog and beer parlor at Spring and 14th St., N.E. He stated he had been talking to an individual whom he believed was connected with this case and wanted the writer to meet him. I did meet WILLOUGHBY at Lum's at approximately 10:30 p.m., 5/16/68, and he furnished the name ANDERSON, residing at 1315 Stillwood Drive, Apartment 2. He stated ANDERSON was then sitting at the bar at Lum's and I observed the individual he pointed out as being ANDERSON. ANDERSON left Lum's while 🏤 was talking with WILLOUGHBY and spoke to WILLOUGHBY and observed me. ANDERSON fits the description of HAROLD G. ANDERSON.

2 - Atlanta ORH:met Lead

When contacted on the evening of 5/16/68, WILLOUGH-BY was drinking beer and stated he had been drinking for an hour that evening. He was obviously intoxicated, however, he stated that ANDERSON and another individual wanted him to go somewhere with them when he saw ANDERSON at 113 14th Street. WILLOUGHBY was very vague and indicated he thought there was a connection between ANDERSON and RAY, although he refused to specify why he thought there was a connection. In view of being at Lum's and WILLOUGHBY's condition, it was not advisable to press him for details at that time. However, ANDERSON should be interviewed to determine if he is familiar with the subject and specifically what items he might have noted in Room 2 at 113 14th Street when he occupied that room. This lead should be assigned to an agent other than the writer inasmuch as ANDERSON observed the writer with WILLOUGHBY and in view of the possibility that ANDERSON might have more knowledge of this matter than is presently suspected.

On 4/26/68, Deputy Sheriff ALBERT LINGERFELT, Cobb County Sheriff's Office, Marietta, Ga., telephonically advised that they had been contacted by a Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER, who resides in Austell, Ga., and was employed at the Pittman's Self-Service Laundry, 1014 Bankhead Highway, Mableton, Ga. Deputy Sheriff LINGERFELT advised that Mrs. LANCASTER indicated she had some information concerning JAMES EARL RAY.

On 4/26/68, Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER, Jefferson Street, Austell, Ga., who is employed at the Pittman's Self-Service Laundry, 1014 Bankhead Highway, Mableton, Ga., was interviewed by SAs JOSEPH G. SHEA and JAMES RICHARD FLICK.

Mrs. LANCASTER advised that she first saw an individual whom she believes to be JAMES EARL RAY during the middle of the 1967 summer, when he came to the laundromat to wash his clothes. Mrs. LANCASTER stated that on occasions she ironed his clothing for him. She stated that on some occasions, the individual she believed to be RAY was accompanied by two other men, one approximately 6' and the other 5'6" to 5'7" approximately of the same age. She stated that the other two men who accompanied RAY had jumped ship in New Orleans in 1963, and were supposed to return to their ship on 6/5/68. The other two men also indicated that they were Seabees.

Mrs. LANCASTER stated that she observed RAY driving a white Mustang which variously had a Texas license, an Alabama license, and an Illinois license. 44-2386 ··

She further stated that she saw a sticker on the windshielf of the Mustang which said something about Mexico.

Mrs. LANCASTER advised that it was possible that RAY had obtained a room in which to live at the home of Mrs. ARMOUR COUEY, who has remarried, and is now known as Mrs. JAMES FRANKLIN, Gordon Road, Mableton, Ga. Mrs. LANCASTER further advised that during conversations with RAY, she learned that he had been to Calif. to learn bartending at a school there. She indicated this was in about March of 1968 that he would have attended the bartending school. She further indicated that RAY had told her he had been in prison in Missouri or Kansas and in Ill.

During the time that Mrs. LANCASTER knew RAY, she said he used the name JOHN DILLARD. She stated that individuals who had been at the self-service laundry and who also had had conversations with the individual she believes to be RAY would be a Mrs. W. J. COKER, Gordon Road, Mableton, Ga., a Mrs. DONALD G. YEARWOOD, 323 Mount Pisgah Road, Mableton, Ga., a Mr. J. W. MC CRICKARD, Old Austell Road, Mableton, Ga., and a Mrs. ESTELLE H. LEVENS, 4613 Hicks Road, Mableton, Ga.

Mrs. LANCASTER stated that she recalls that RAY at one time was attempting to obtain a room in which to live and made a telephone call from the home of Mrs. G. W. CHRISTOPHER, 138 Felton Lane, Mableton, Ga., to the home of Mrs. AMMER COUEY FRANKLIN, 489 Gordon Road, Mableton, Ga., in an attempt to obtain a room at the home of Mrs. FRANKLIN.

Mrs. LANCASTER advised that she last saw the individual she believes to be RAY on the Friday after the funeral of Rev. KING, at which time he was by himself.

AT 44-2386 Mrs. LANCASTER is a woman in her middle 50s and resides at Austell, Ga., with her husband, who has a serious heart condition. In an effort to corroborate the statements of Mrs. LANCASTER, the following individuals whom she had mentioned who would have knowledge of RAY and who were alleged to have talked to him at the self-service laundry, were contacted: Mrs. AMMER COUEY FRANKLIN. 489 Gordon Road, Mableton, Ga., was contacted on 4/26/68, at which time she advised that a man had called her some months ago regarding a private room and indicated he would call her back. Mrs. FRANKLIN said she believed the call was placed from the home of a Mrs. STURDEVANT, who is now deceased, and did reside on Felton Lane, Mableton, Ga. Mrs. FRANKLIN stated that the relatives of Mrs. STURDEVANT have sold the home and it is no longer in use as a rooming house. In regards to Mrs. LANCASTER. Mrs. FRANKLIN stated that she thinks that Mrs. LANCASTER has an overactive imagination and puts a lot of things together which she images and believes them to be facts. On 4/29/68, Mr. G. W. CHRISTOPHER, 138 Felton Lane, Mableton, Ga., was displayed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, at which time he advised that he had never seen this individual and was certain that he had never roomed at the CHRISTOPHER home. CHRISTOPHER stated he still has roomers at his home and that none of them in any way resembled RAY. On 4/29/68, Mrs. W. J. COKER, Gordon Road, Mableton, Ga., advised that she knows Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER, who is employed at the laundromat where Mrs. COKER washes her clothes. She emphatically denied that she had ever heard any statements made by any men in her presence that would indicate that he was JAMES EARL RAY.

She advised that Mrs. LANCASTER appears to be a peculiar individual who is constantly making up stories and attempting to interest the customers at the self-service laundry, in some imagined incident that took place at the laundry. Mrs. COKER concluded by saying that Mrs. LANCASTER is "all wet".

On 4/29/68, Mrs. DONALD G. YEARWOOD, 323
Mount Pisgah Road, Mableton, Ga., advised that she does know Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER who is employed at the Pittman's Self-Service Laundry on Bankhead Highway, Mableton, Ga., but advised that she never entered into any conversation with an individual who might have been JAMES EARL RAY, together with Mrs. LANCASTER. She stated that on one occasion, she observed two men sitting on a table in the laundromat, at which time Mrs. LANCASTER said something to her about an automobile license; however, Mrs. YEARWOOD paid no attention to it, since it meant nothing to her. Mrs. YEARWOOD advised she could not identify the man, since she did not pay any attention to him.

On 4/29/68, Mr. J. W. MC CRICKARD, Old Austell Road, Mableton, Ga., advised that he goes to the Pittman's Self-Service Laundry only infrequently and on occasions has talked to Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER. He described Mrs. LANCASTER as a person who has "mighty peculiar ideas." He stated that she has, on occasions, let her imagination run away with her and is constantly entering into conversations with the customers of the laundry concerning conversations she has had with persons believed to have committed violations of the law.

Mr. MC CRICKARD advised that he is quite sure he would have recalled if he had seen JAMES EARL RAY, especially since RAY's picture has been in the paper

recently. MC CRICKARD advised that he has not entered into any conversations with a man at Pittman's Self-Service Laundry, Mableton, Ga., whom he believes might have been JAMES EARL RAY.

On 4/29/68, Mrs. ESTELLE H. LEVENS, 4613 Hicks Road, Mableton, Ga., advised that she has been going to the Pittman's Self-Service Laundry for years and has, recently as last week, talked to Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER, who is employed there. At that time Mrs. LANCASTER talked to Mrs. LEVENS concerning three men who were alleged to have been at the laundry on different occasions and attempted to convince Mrs. LEVENS that she had been present during a conversation between Mrs. LANCASTER, the three men, and Mrs. LEVENS. Mrs. LEVENS stated she is confused and thinks that Mrs. LANCASTER had the wrong person in mind when she indicated Mrs. LEVENS was present. Mrs. LEVENS stated she has never discussed bartending with any man or had any conversation with a man in the Pittman's Self-Service Laundry whom she would believe is JAMES EARL RAY.

Mrs. LEVENS described Mrs. LANCASTER as an erratic person who may be a little mentally unbalanced due to the recent loss of her mother on top of the fact that she has to take care of her invalid husband.

On 5/2/68, Deputy Sheriff EARL LEE, Douglas County Sheriff's Office, Douglasville, Ga., advised SA JAMES RICHARD FLICK that he is well acquainted with Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER, Jefferson Street, Austell, Ga., and believed her to be mentally unbalanced. Deputh Sheriff LEE advised that during the investigation surrounding the abduction of MARY SHOTWELL LITTLE, a missing person in Atlanta, Ga., he was contacted by Mrs. LANCASTER, who indicated she had direct knowledge that MARY SHOTWELL LITTLE was buried near the Etowah Indian Mounds, North of Acworth, Ga. Based on this information, Deputy Sheriff

LEE and other deputies, went to the area described by Mrs. LANCASTER and dug into the ground in various places at the Etowah Indian Mounds in search of Mrs. LITTLE's body. Deputy Sheriff LEE advised that they found no trace of her body and even after that, Mrs. LANCASTER indicated she had knowledge concerning the location of Mrs. LITTLE's body. Deputy Sheriff LEE advised that he believed that no credence should be placed in any information furnished by Mrs. LANCASTER and he believed she is mentally unbalanced.

It should be noted that the Atlanta Office indices carry a reference to Mrs. EDNA M. LANCASTER, Jefferson Street, Austell, Ga., Atlanta File 62-0-7792, which contains voluntary information from Mrs. LANCASTER to the effect that she burned her own personal automobile in order to collect insurance for that car.

It is believed that Mrs. LANCASTER has taken numerous facts which she has obtained from newspaper articles concerning the murder of Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING and has invented a story similar to the one in which she indicated to Deputy Sheriff EARL LEE of Douglasville, that she knew the whereabouts of the body of Mrs. MARY SHOTWELL LITTLE.

The individuals who were contacted and whom Mrs. LANCASTER indicated would corroborate her story have, in all instances, indicated that they knew nothing about what she was talking about and were not present at the time the three men alleged by Mrs. LANCASTER had entered into conversations with them.

Each office should bear in mind that as a result of investigation conducted in Los Angeles, there was obtained the photograph of subject showing him in business suit, seated, which has been described as an excellent likeness.

On April 18, 1968, the Atlanta Office advised as follows:

BETTY CHAMBERS, United Airlines Ticket Counter, In-Town Motor Hotel, Atlanta, advised individual named GENE HUDSON checked into the above motel on April 12, 1968, and departed April 15, 1968. She stated he had no home address or employment. She advised the hotel records indicated HUDSON had checked into the hotel previously on March 28 and March 29, 1968, listing address as Dogwood Drive, Charleston, South Carolina. CHAMBERS described HUDSON as a white male, 27 to 34 years of age, 5'll", 175 pounds, brown hair, who appeared similar to pictures of JAMES EARL RAY shown on local television stations at Atlanta, Georgia, on April 15, 1968.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WARDLAW E. SKINNER:

A review of the current Charleston, South Carolina, telephone directory, and the Charleston, South Carolina, City Directory on April 18, 1968, disclosed no listing for GENE HUDSON.

It was also noted that current maps of the City of Charleston, South Carolina, and the City Directory contain no listing for a Dogwood Drive, Charleston, South Carolina.

FRANCIS OLIVER, Credit Bureau of Greater Charleston, Charleston, South Carolina, advised on April 18, 1968, that the records of the Bureau contain no record identifiable with GENE HUDSON.

Sergeant J. S. MINOR, Record Division, Charleston County Police Department, North Charleston, South Carolina, advised on April 18, 1968, that the records of the Department contain no record for GENE HUDSON.

Mrs. JULIA BEATTIE, Clerk, Record Rosente Modern Department, Charleston, South Carolina, advised Rosente Mariente Printer, 1968, that the records of the Department are negative If 6ri963 GENE HUDSON.
