

On April 24, 1968, SAs JOSEPH G. SHEA and JACK T. BEVERSTEIN interviewed SAMUEL WEHUNT, 185 W. Dixie Street, Marietta, Georgia, former brother-in-law of LEWIS RAYMOND DOWDA. WEHUNT advised as follows:

DOWDA is presently in Cobb County Jail serving a twoyear sentence for robbery of Wilkeson Jewelers, Mableton, Georgia. WEHUNT advised photograph of JAMES EARL RAY did not resemble any person he had ever seen. He stated DOWDA's wife is presently residing with her father, RALPH J. GRAHAM. 65 Woodridge Drive. Marietta. WEHUNT advised during the latter part of November, 1967. DOWDA and his wife had left the Marietta, Georgia, area and traveled to California and returned. He did not know any details concerning this trip other than DOWDA and his wife were traveling in their Volkswagen and knew of no one who accompanied them. He stated he had learned from an Individual known to him only as "Junior" that a man from Florida with his wife and child had visited DOWDA, staying for approximately two weeks. He stated this individual had left Marietta, Georgia, the first part of March, 1968. He stated "Junior" resides at 186 W. Dixie Street, also. WEHUNT advised DOWDA's parents had returned to Deland, Florida.


Referenced memo instructed that BERNARD LEE, SCLC, be located and interviewed.

DORA MC DONALD, former Secretary to MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was recontacted 5/28/68 in an effort to locate LEE. MC BONALD advised LEE is in a travel status in connection with the Poor Peoples Campaign and she has given him the message that interview with him is desired, but he has not been in town long enough to contact the FBI for interview.

MC DONALD will be recontacted in a further effort to locate LEE.

Reference telephone call from SUPERVISOR CHARLES HARDING 5/23/68.

Reference call revealed one THOMAS E. CARLISLE, a self-admitted alcoholic, contacted the Atlanta Office several times by telephone 5/23/68 and declared that JAMES EARL RAY was now in The Harbor, an institution for reclaimation of alboholics, at LaGrange, Georgia, under the name WILLIS DAVIS.

CARLISIE was being treated for alcoholism at The Harbor having been referred to the institution by a similar institution at Albany, Georgia, known as The Anchorage.

SA Jimmy E. Hayes immediately contacted Sheriff L.W.BAILEY and together with BAILEY proceeded to The Harbor on 5/23/68.

The Reverend GEORGE SMITH, manager of The Harbor, made DAVIS available for interview. SMITH was not told that DAVIS was suspected of being identical with RAY. He was told DAVIS was suspected of being identical with a Bureau fugitive and had been seen in an area in which the fugitive may have frequented.

DAVIS has a striking resemblance to RAY even to having his left ear protruding further than his right one. He was cooperative and furnished background information concerning himself and allowed himself to be fingerprinted. He was not told that he was suspected of being RAY, he was merely told that he was suspected of being identical with a Bureau fugitive.

Comparison of DAVIS's fingerprints with fingerprints of RAY as shown on the 10#4182, reveals DAVIS could not be RAY. It is noted that RAY's right thumb is a loop whereas DAVIS's right thumb is a whorl. RAY's right index finger is a loop, whereas DAVIS's right index finger is a whorl pattern.

In order to further verify this comparison, the fingerprint card bearing DAVISS fingerprints are being forwarded to the HQ office for examination by SA CARL CLATBORNE.

ROBERT EVANS, 591 Parkway Drive, N.E., Atlanta, Georgia, was interviewed at the Crown Filling Station, directly across from the SCLC Headquarters on Auburn Avenue in Atlanta, and he advised he recalls seeing two white men using a phone booth at the station on the day before Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was killed in Memphis, Tennessee. Mr. EVANS said that he would place the time that he witnessed these individuals in the phone booth at between 3:00 and 4:00 p.m. He stated he was playing checkers at the station, sitting almost in front of the phone booths used by the men, but that he cannot remember the identity of the person with whom he was playing checkers. He said he recalls seeing these men at the phone booth and one man seemed to be writing something on a pad and the other man was making one or more telephone calls. and the second s

EVANS said that during the time these men were in the phone booth, someone in the group around the station stated, "There goes Dr. KING." He said that the two men in the booth came out, walked across the driveway to nearly the center of the driveway, and looked at Dr. KING as he was walking down Hilliard Street from the South side of Auburn Avenue, where he apparently had parked his car across Auburn Avenue. KING entered the most westerly entrance of the SCLC Headquarters.

EVANS said that as he observed these men watching Dr. KING, the thought crossed his mind that they must not know Dr. KING, since his appearance in that area would not have created much interest because most of the people in the area knew who he was. He said he also thought to himself as he saw Dr. KING walking across the street that Dr. KING was probably getting ready to go to Memphis, because he knew Dr. KING was to be in Memphis the following day.

EVANS said that he would attempt to try to recall who was in the group at the filling station when this incident took place, but that he did not think he would be able to remember their identities.

EVANS added he believes ALDEN ALLEN is one of the persons who were at the station at the time of this incident, but he is not sure.

EVANS furnished the following description of the two individuals:

- (1) A white male, age 30, 5 feet 10 inches to 6 feet tall, 140 to 150 pounds, wore a hat. EVANS said he could furnish no additional information concerning this individual.
- (2) A white male, 5 feet 8 inches tall, to 5 feet 9 inches tall, 140 pounds, hair light brown. EVANS said he could furnish no additional information concerning this individual.

EVANS said he noted that when the men left the station they walked first in an easterly direction which would be toward downtown, and then turned at about the edge of the filling station lot at Auburn Avenue and went in a westerly direction on Auburn Avenue, walking out of sight. EVANS was sure he did not see these individuals get into a car or see a car in the filling station parking lot appearing to be connected with them.

On April 18, 1968, THERON C. TERRELL, 3296 North Embry Circle, Chamblee, Georgia, business address Terrell Agency, Inc., 806 Stewart Avenue, SW, Atlanta, was interviewed by SA'S THOMAS J. BARRETT and THOMAS C. RENAGHAN, JR. Also present during the interview was TERRELL's wife, Mrs. EDNA TERRELL.

At this point in the interview, Mr. TERRELL stated that everything he said must be considered on a strictly confidential basis and that he did not wish to be identified in any way as being the source of this information. He stated he did not wish to testify to this information.

TERRELL stated that on the evening of April 17, 1968, he viewed a photograph on a television news broadcast. This photograph was said to be that of ERIC STARVO GALT, presently being sought by the FBI in connection with the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. TERRELL stated that at that point he recognized this photograph as being identical to an individual known to him as JOHN WILLARD, who was employed by him as a telephone sales solicitor at his office on Stewart Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia, for approximately a two week period during May or June, 1967.

April or the early part of May, 1967, he received a telephone call from an unrecalled individual in Louisiana who is in the same line of work, that being advertising, public relations, and show business promotions. He stated this caller claimed that he was cutting back on his operation and would have to let one of his salesmen go. He stated this caller inquired if he, TERRELL, could use a good telephone salesman in his operation of Atlanta. TERRELL stated that at this point he told this caller that he could use such a person. This caller stated that the salesman's name was JOHN WILLARD, and that he had been employed by the caller in Louisiana for approximately one year. The caller highly recommended WILLARD as being a very capable telephone solicitor. The

caller mentioned that WILLARD was without funds and would require an advance of money in order to travel to Atlanta, Georgia.

TERRELL stated that at this point the caller indicated where the advance of funds should be sent and TERRELL arranged for \$20.00 to be forwarded via Western Union Money Order from Atlanta on same date. TERRELL could not recall the name, place, and location where the funds were sent; however, he believes it possibly was sent to Lake Charles, Shreveport, or Monroe, Louisiana. TERRELL stated that he personally knows twenty to thirty individuals in the State of Louisiana who operate agencies similar to his and that it could have been any one of these individuals who contacted him regarding the employment of WILLARD. TERRELL stated that this is a common practice in this industry, that of arranging for the continued employment of telephone solicitors by referring them to agencies in other cities.

TERRELL stated that JOHN WILLARD arrived at his office at 806 Stewart Avenue on the day after the money was wired. He stated that WILLARD reported personally to him and volunteered that he was ready to go to work immediately. TERRELL stated that he did not recall WILLARD having any luggage with him at this time. He stated that he remembers WILLARD commenting that he had traveled to Atlanta via Greyhound Bus, but he did not know WILLARD's mode of transportation from the Bus Depot to the office. At this point, TERRELL stated WILLARD indicated that his name was JOHN WILLARD. However, at this time there were four other individuals employed in the office with the first name of JOHN and TERRELL for the sake of the operation asked if WILLARD was known by any other name. WILLARD volunteered that he was known to his friends as BILL and that he would sign his telephone sales cards W. WILLARD. TERRELL stated that he believes that the payroll records which are maintained by his accountant in Birmingham will reflect the name JOHN WILLARD and will also give the exact dates of employment. stated that they would not be likely to have any additional background information recorded due to the fact that his general practice is to give these individuals a two or three week trial in the operation before he considers them as permanent employees and obtains Social Security Numbers and any pertinent background information. He stated that he believes all that would be

contained in the records of his accountant would be WILLARD's name and number of sales he made along with the amount paid to him as commission. TERRELL stated that the usual commission was 25% of the sale involved.

At this point, TERRELL furnished a 3  $\times$  5 cream-colored index card, which he alleged was the handwriting of JOHN WILLARD. This writing was as follows:

Thurs Anytime

"#72 W. Willard

"H.T1X"

On the reverse side of this card was writing which had been scratched out and TERRELL stated that this had no relation to WILLARD.

TERRELL stated that at the time WILLARD was employed by him, they were involved in a project to promote a dance being held by a local Elks Club in Atlanta. He stated WILLARD went to work on the telephones to solicit advertising for the program announcing the dance. TERRELL stated that as his solicitors made a sale over the phone, they would record the information on these 3 x 5 cards and that the "#72" indicated that this was the 72nd sale made by WILLARD.

He stated that the day following the sales, a woman from his organization would go around to the individuals placing the advertisements and make collections. He stated that WILLARD never personally contacted any of the accounts and that all of his sales were made on the telephone.

TERRELL stated that WILLARD was employed for approximately two weeks and that he, TERRELL, was personally in the office for the first week of this employment. He stated that that time he had to travel to Alabama and he left

his wife in charge of the office as was his common practice. WILLARD worked for approximately one more week under the direct supervision of Mrs. TERRELL. TERRELL considered WILLARD to be a very capable salesman and good employee.

at his place of business on Stewart Avenue, WILLARD impressed him as a "sharp individual", noting his attractive personal appearance. TERRELL stated that upon arrival WILLARD was wearing a sport jacket, dark slacks, dress shoes, a white shirt, and a red or black bow tie and appeared particularly well groomed. TERRELL noted that the red or black bow tie was characteristic of WILLARD's dress in that he invariably wore one of these ties.

TERRELL was exhibited photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT, one with eyes closed, the other with eyes opened, and positively identified both as JOHN WILLARD, who was employed by him. TERRELL stated that the photographs were an excellent likeness of WILLARD but noted that WILLARD's hair was not a crewcut, but rather tight, way hair of a medium-brown shade, which gave a crewcut appearance from a distance. TERRELL also noted that WILLARD was very conscious of the grooming of his hair, noting that WILLARD was often observed to touch his hair with his hands to check on its grooming.

TERRELL advised that WILLARD was a white male, between 30 and 35 years of age, 5'9", 165-170 pounds, medium build, noting trim appearance with apparent good muscle tone. TERRELL noted that WILLARD was "a country boy", yet was aggressive and sure of himself.

TERRELL stated that he got the impression that WILLARD was a "glib" talker, who projected well. TERRELL stated that he detected a general rural Southern accent in WILLARD's speech. In addition to this, he noted that WILLARD had a peculiar dialect noticeable in certain words he used. TERRELL stated that he himself has traveled in Louisiana and was of the opinion that these peculiarities in WILLARD's speech may be somehow connected with a Cajun dialect.

TERRELL stated that he could not recall any specific information regarding WILLARD's background; however, he was of the general impression that WILLARD was originally from Louisiana. He stated that he could not recall WILLARD mentioning his family or his marital status nor could he recall any mention being made of military service.

TERRELL stated that he received the impression that WILLARD was new in Atlanta and quite possibly had never been in this town before. He stated that he believes that when WILLARD arrived at his office he did not have a specific address here in Atlanta. However, TERRELL said he seems to recall mention made of the Jefferson Hotel in Atlanta in connection with a residence of WILLARD. TERRELL stated that even though WILLARD appeared to be new to town, he seemed to make quite a few contacts in a short period of time. Along these lines, TERRELL stated that he got the impression WILLARD was interested in seeing what the "action" was in Atlanta. He stated that WILLARD mentioned several night clubs he had visited in Atlanta. The only one TERRELL could remember was the Kitten's Korner.

TERRELL stated that he received the impression that WILLARD also had an inordinate desire for money. He stated that along these lines, WILLARD mentioned he was going to obtain a part-time job in the evening as a bartender. TERRELL claimed that WILLARD requested permission to use TERRELL's name as a reference when he applied for these bartending jobs and TERRELL agreed to this. TERRELL stated he recalls WILLARD mentioning he was applying for a job as a bartender in the Regency-Hyatt House Hotel in Atlanta and the Red Barn Lounge on Roswell Road in Atlanta.

TERRELL also stated that he recalls that WILLARD mentioned that he had registered with some organization or agency that was placing him on temporary bartending jobs in the Atlanta area. WILLARD mentioned to TERRELL on several occasions that he had worked as a temporary bartender at a private party on the previous night.

TERRELL could not remember anything further along these lines. TERRELL stated that it was apparent that WILLARD's ambition was to work full time as a bartender and that he, TERRELL, could not understand this, inasmuch as WILLARD was such a capable salesman and could earn a far greater salary in sales.

TERRELL stated that he considered WILLARD to be a vain person in that he was exceptionally concerned with his appearance. WILLARD was always very neatly dressed and TERRELL estimated that he had four or five suits which TERRELL would place in the \$80 to \$90 price range. TERRELL stated that WILLARD also were a white dress shirt and that his shoes were always well shined and of good quality.

TERRELL stated that the only other employee presently working for him who was also employed during the time WILLARD worked there is a MYRON GRIFFITH, a white male, approximately 55 to 60 years of age. TERRELL stated that on the morning of April 18, 1968, GRIFFITH mentioned that he thought the individual whose picture was being displayed on television and newscast as ERIC STARVO GALT was identical to a JOHN WILLARD who worked with him at the Terrell Agency in the late Spring of 1967. TERRELL stated that at this point he, his wife, and GRIFFITH discussed this matter and that all concluded that the picture on the newscast was indeed identical to JOHN WILLARD.

TERRELL stated that GRIFFITH worked in the same room with JOHN WILLARD and had daily person to person contact with WILLARD; however, TERRELL characterized GRIFFITH by saying that he was "not quite as sharp as he used to be and a little shakey." For this reason, TERRELL stated that he thought it would be inadvisable for FBI Agents to contact GRIFFITH in the interest of discretion and maintaining the confidential nature of this information. TERRELL stated that he, himself, would engage GRIFFITH in conversation in an attempt to determine any further information GRIFFITH may be able to recall regarding WILLARD. TERRELL stated that GRIFFITH mentioned one particular incident that occurred several days after WILLARD started his employment at the agency.

According to GRIFFITH, WILLARD came to work one morning unshaven and proceeded to shave with an electim razor at the office. While he was shaving, he mentioned to GRIFFITH, "I am STARVO." At this point, GRIFFITH stated he queried WILLARD as to whether he meant he was starving and offered to lend him money for a meal. WILLARD retorted "I am starving in more ways than one but STARVO is one of my names."

TERRELL emphasized that neither he nor his wife have any personal knowledge of this comment made by WILLARD and it was strictly secondhand information he had gathered in conversation with GRIFFITH.

TERRELL stated that he is presently on the staff of former Governor GEORGE WALLACE of Alabama in a public relations capacity and that he has worked extensively for Governor WALLACE in the public relations capacity for the past four or five years. He stated that he had also handled the public relations account of Alabama State Police which he recently terminated due to his poor health. TERRELL emphasized due to his relationship with Governor WALLACE, it was mandatory this information not be attributed to him as he did not wish to have it known that WILLARD was a former employee of his.

He stated that another reason for maintaining the confidential nature of this information was the fact that he feared if it became known, it would jeopardize his family's safety and would also cause him considerable problems in business.

TERRELL stated that he left Atlanta on business approximately a week after WILLARD started his employment that his wife remained at the Atlanta office in his absence.

TERRELL stated that his accountant was a Mr. RAYMOND J. ISLEY, 8100 Seventh Street North, Birmingham, Alabama and that ISLEY would have records of all employees who were working during the period of time WILLARD was employed.
