KELLER advised that WAUGH is a promising trainee and that because of his alien citizenship, be was encouraged by the company to participate in correspondence courses such as handwriting in order to better equip himself as an employee. KELLER had no specific knowledge that WAUGH may have enrolled in a commerce handwriting course.

KELLER described WAUGH as being 5'11", 165 pounds, reddish hair, cut short.

R. J. GONZALEZ, 225 South Salcodo, New Orleans, La., on 6/26/68, advised that he is the owner of the residence at 2928 Tulane Ave., New Orleans. GONZALEZ advised as follows:

During early 1968, he ran ads advising of the availability of rooms for rent at 2928 Tulane Aye., which neighborhood is a low class transient type area.

WAUGH telephonically contacted GONZALEZ in response to one of these ads and advised that he was from England, was learning the oil business, and needed a room. GONZALEZ met WAUGH at the 2928 Tulane Avo., address and WAUGH rented Apartment #3 at that address. The effective day of rent was on February 19, 1968 and WAUGH remained at that address until 4/19/68 when he moved elsewhere with a forwarding address not known to GONZALEZ.

GONZALEZ displayed his rental book and it disclosed that DEREK A. WAUCH was a renter from 2/19/68 through 4/19/68.

GONZALEZ described WAUGH as a pleasant individual, who was about 30, 6', 175 pounds, slender build, and blond hair.

He stated that WAUGH furnished no information about his background other than to indicate he would probably be working in Baten Rouge, La., from time to time in connection with the oil business. (KELLER mentioned that WAUGH had taken some training in Baton Rouge for his company).

Both KELLER and GONZALEZ viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY with negative results.





WALTER LEON SPAIN, #3 Glen Iris Parkway, Birmingham, Alabama. furnished the following:

In the Spring of 1967, SPAIN's son, WALTER E. SPAIN, gave Mr. SPAIN a .38 caliber Liberty snub-nose revolver, which his son had purchased in late 1966 or early 1967 from a gun dealer near Atlanta, Georgia. His son owed Mr. SPAIN some money and the gun was a partial payment of this debt.

In the Fall of 1967, after having been hospitalized in August, 1967, at Huntsville, Alabama, for an illness and being in need of money to pay bills. Mr. SPAIN sold many personal items by means of placing want ads for these items in the "Birmingham News." Among the items sold was the .38 caliber Liberty snub-nose revolver. Mr. SPAIN recalled he placed an ad for this gun in a Sunday paper, and that same Sunday he received a call from a man who asked about the gun, the price, and the directions to get to SPAIN's residence. The caller said he was in the western section of Birmingham. About an hour after this call, and while SPAIN's wife and daughter were at church, a man came to the front door and said he had called about the gun. He looked at the gun, stated he had been looking for a gun of the same type, and when told again that the price was \$65.00, he gave SPAIN two twenty dollar bills, two ten dollar bills, and a five dollar bill, after saying he would take it. SPAIN did not give the man a receipt for the money, nor did he record his name or see any identification of the man, and he did not obtain any information as to his name. The man left carrying the gun in his hand. SPAIN furnished neither ammunition nor any papers for the gun.

When the man first arrived, SPAIN observed he had parked his car, described by SPAIN only as a late model, white or light-colored, on the street in front of SPAIN's house, a distance of about 150 feet. SPAIN did not pay any further attention to the car. SPAIN did recall the buyer saying he lived in the western section of Birmingham, but he did not mention any specific address or employment.

The buyer said he wanted the gun to keep around his house. Mr. SPAIN described the buyer as a white male, about forty to forty-five years of age, 5'8" or 5'9" tall, 170 to 175 pounds, dark hair slightly graying at the temples, with a local (Alabama) accent. The man was wearing a sport shirt and slacks, colors unrecalled, and he did not have glasses.

Mr. SPAIN was shown five different photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, and he chose one which had been taken in California during January or February, 1968, as "resembling the man" who bought the revolver; however, Mr. SPAIN would not make a definite identification of the photograph of RAY as the buyer.

Mr. SPAIN recalled he was contacted by FBI Agents on April 7, 1968, and shown an artist's conception of an individual the FBI was attempting to locate. At that time, he advised Agents the drawing reminded him of someone he may have seen previously, but was unable to furnish any other identifying information. After viewing the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and being questioned about the sale of the revolver, SPAIN said he was now able to connect the sale of the revolver with the drawing in that the person depicted in the drawing reminded SPAIN of the person to whom he had sold the revolver.

Sometime in December, 1966, SPAIN went to Atlanta, Georgia, with his father, WALTER LEON SPAIN, so his father could attempt to obtain employment. While in Atlanta, WALTER E. SPAIN saw an advertisement in a newspaper for a .38 caliber Liberty snub-nose revolver, which was being sold by a gun dealer in a small town outside Atlanta, believed to be Mapleton, Georgia. SPAIN, accompanied by his father, went to this gun dealer and bought the gun and SPAIN returned it to his residence in Birmingham, Alabama.

In the Spring of 1967, SPAIN gave the gun to his father in partial payment of a debt he owed to his father. SPAIN was later told by his father that he had sold the gun after placing a want ad for it in a Birmingham newspaper. On 7/7/68, Lt. Col. EARLE L. DENTON, U.S. Army, #45 Vestavia, Northport, Ala. furnished the following information:

He advised he heard that "RED" FARRIS, owner, Farris Pest Control, Inc., Tuscaloosa, Ala. has said that he met a man in a bar in Birmingham, Ala. prior to the shooting of Dr. KING who said he was going to "shoot KING" and that he had a "gun in the car". He advised he understands that FARRIS met the man a day or two prior to the shooting in Memphis.

On 7/8/68, the following investigation was conducted by SAs A.L. KING and CLARENCE E. WRIGHT at Tuscaloosa, Alabama:

WALLACE WADE FARRIS, President, Farris Pest Control, Inc., U.S. 11 By-Pass was interviewed and furnished the following information:

He advised on April 2, 1968 he was in the Escape Lounge in Birmingham, Alabama with CHARLIE THOMPSON, manager of the Birmingham Office of the Farris Pest Control, at approximately 9:00 pm. He advised a Dr. CHARLES MULLINS or DAVE MULLINS accompanied by a white ma le, 35-40, 5'9", dark hair and wearing sport clothes came in and s#at down at their table. He advised Dr. MULLINS is well known in Birmingham and known to CHARLIE THOMPSON and further, he believes THOMPSON met the unknown white male on a previous occasion. He advised after they sat down they began to talk about MARTIN LUTHER KING and how much the Klan would pay to "kill KING". He advised Dr. MULLINS did most of the talking and remarks such as "would you take \$15,000 or \$25,000 to go along and act as a decoy etc". He advised Memphis, Tennessee was mentioned and he told them that KING was more useful being alive and further he would not go along on # any such plan. He advised they mentioned going to Memphis to shoot KING but stated he could not remember the exact words used. He further advised they talked about getting one of of his own people to get him out where they could "get at him".

FARRIS advised he took the above as bar room talk and this was his reason for not saying anything previously. FARRIS further advised CHARLIE THOMPSON, tel # 328-0492, could be reached at his office in Vestavia Park Office of FARRIS PEST Control and he could further identify Dr. MULLINS in Birmingham. He advised Dr. MULLINS appeared to be a radical segregationist and gave the impression of being under the influence of liquor.

Mr. Charles H. Thompson, Mgr., Farris Pest Control, 623 Graymont Ave.. West. stated as follows:

On the night of 4/2/68 he was having drinks in the Escape Lounge, 900 2nd Ave., No., with Mr. Farris of Tuscaloosa who ownes the business. After a few minutes another friend, Dr. Charles E. Mullins, came in with a mutual friend, Dave Reeves, who brought their drinks over the the table occupied by himself and Farris. General "liquor talk" followed for about an hour but he, Thompson did not hear any conversation concerning King. A few days after King's murder Farris had inquired of him concerning Dr. Mullins car since news reports had indicated that a Mustang was involved. Thompson stated that Dr. Mullins drives a Mustang, but his is black.

Thompson related that Dr. Mullins is a native of the BH area whom he has known for several years and operates the Longview Hospital, 1100 Bankhead Highway, Graysville, where he is also engaged in the practice of medicine. His companion on that evening, Reeves, is a local resident who sometimes accompanies Dr. Mullins in drinking. Reeves is employed by a large pharmaceutical supply company of BH, and prior to that was employed as a salesman for Nelson Weaver Real Estate Co.

After viewing photos of subject Ray, Thompson stated definitely that Reeves and Ray are not identical. BH indicies negative as to any Doctor Mullins.

At 5:55 PM, 7-27-68, SA CHARLIE GILLESPIE, Division 6, SOG, telephonically advised that news reports received at SOG indicated Attorney ARTHUR HANES in the RAY case was making statements to the press that he had received threats and that his family had received threats. SA GILLESPIE requested that Birmingham send a communication to Bureau advising whether Birmingham did or did not have any information on this matter.

SAC GAMBLE was connected with SA GILLESPIE at which time SAC informed SA GILLESPIE that Birmingham had sent this information to the Bureau and that I would call SA GILLESPIE and furnish him the date of the communication.

I called SA GILLESPIE at 6:11 PM and read him Birmingham Tel to Director, 7-23-68, 6:17 PM, and also told him that after receipt of this tel by Bureau, SAC received call from Division 6 instructing that Birmingham not do anything and to not maintain liaison with local PD in this matter. I told SA GILLESPIE that Birmingham would advise Bureau if any further information was received. He said this answered his original inquiryof 7-27-68.
