

RAYNS or RAYMS at his hotel at 9:05 a.m. (Saturday), August 26, 1967. Mr. KOONCE identified his initials as being the desk clerk on duty at that time and stated that ordinarily throughout the work week, he is on duty at night but on Saturdays, he works the day shift. He stated he had no independent recollection whatsoever of the guest whom he had registered as RAYNS or RAYMS on August 26, 1967, but that his notation indicated the guest did not have luggage, and occupied Room 210 at a rate of \$4.50 per day, with only the guest being indicated as in the party. No telephone charges were made to the room and the method of arrival of the guest was unknown. The time of departure was not indicated in the records of the Granada Hotel.



L. L. PERSONS, 1056 32 nd Street South, Birmingham, Alabama, telephone number 328-0630, who had been previously interviewed in captioned case, appeared at the Birmingham FBI Office and confidential furnished the following information:

He stated approximately ten days ago THAD HOLT, former owner of WAPI telephonically contacted and asked/how he could get in touch with his brother, ALBERT C. PERSONS, as WILLIAM BRADFORD HUEY wanted to contact him. He advised he furnished HOLT with his brother's address and telephone number. He advised one or two days later HUEY contacted his brother and asked him to work for him on the JAMES EARL RAY case. He advised that his brother is presently working for HUEY on the RAY case.

He produced a book written by his brother entitled the "Bay of Pigs", printed by SWALLEY Printing Company, Birmingham, Alabama. He stated that SWALLEY printing Company has printed material for ASA CARTER a Super Racist and former public relations man for former governor GEORGE WALLACE. He further brought in the name of HENRY YESTOK as friend of CARTER's and the Winn Oil Distributor in the Birmingham area. He stated that YESICK put up the money to have this book printed, which cost \$10,000.00.

He stated that he is of the ppinion that there is a possible conspircay between CARTER and RAY in the killing of MARTIN LURTHER KX KING and that is originated in Birmingham. He stated that he believes there is some connection with this book and the RAY Case, since the book contains numerous Spanish names. He stated that he also believes there is connection with the RAY case and this book, because HUEY wants his brother to work for him on the RAY case. He said the way HUEY spends money that he could find out all he wants to knows about the activities of RAY with out having his brother, AIBERT, work for him.





On Monday, 1/20/69, Mr. DON WOODS. Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Ala., was contacted by SA NEIL P. SHANAHAN in connection with another matter. During this contact, WOODS advised that on the Saturday before Christmas, 12/21/68, at about 5:30 p.m., WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE entered Aeromarine and asked to speak with him concerning information relative to JAMES EARL RAY. WOODS stated that he told HULE he sdad not care to discuss anything concerning this case with him, as he intended to testify as a witness in the trial of JAMES EARL RAY. HVIE then stated that he wished to purchase a Model 760 Remington, Caliber 30.06 Rifle, identical to the one allegedly purchased by MAY. He requested that the same type scope he mounted on this rifle as was mounted on the rifle previously purchased by RAY. WOODS sold HUIE this gun and scope; and while mounting the scope, he was further questioned by HVIE concerning the method of mounting and bore sighting this scope. WOODS advised that he ausvered RUE's questions to a degree but did not reveal any information concerning his previous transactions with James Rari. RAY. Hule also requested WOODS to furnish him with a Browning rifle box similar to the one carried by RAT, but WOODS did not furnish him one. HUE offered to buy such a box, and WOODS stated he would have sold it to him if he had one but did not have one of that type. He did furnish HUIE with a Browning box designed for a Browning shotgan but much shorter in length than a Browning rifle box.

During this conversation. HVIE advised WOODS that his purpose was to take this rifle with scope attached and box to Memphis. Tenn., where he could re-enact the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

MR. DON WOOD, Aeromarine Supply Company, Airport Road, Birmingham, Alabama, was contacted in connection with another matter, and during this contact, related the following information:

Mr. WOOD advised that on Saturday, December 21, 1968, at approximately 5:30 p.m., he was visited in his store by WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE, noted author from Hartselle, Alabama. Mr. HUIE requested conversation with Mr. WOOD concerning certain facts surrounding the purchase of a rifle by JAMES EARL RAY, the alleged assassin of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Mr. WOOD stated that he told HUIE initially that he intended testifying in this matter during the trial of JAMES EARL RAY in Memphis, Tennessee, and did not wish to discuss any of this information with HUIE. Following the transaction involving this rifle, Mr. HUIE asked Mr. WOOD for a Browning Rifle box similar to the one furnished JAMES EARL RAY at the time he purchased the rifle. Mr. WOOD stated he told Mr. HUIE that he did not have such a box but did furnish him with a Browning shotgun box which was much shorter in length than the box Mr. WOOD furnished to JAMES EARL RAY. During the evening of 3/12/69 AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR telephoned me to say he had watched the Huntley-Brinkley report on television earlier, during which program ARTHUR J. HANES, SR. was interviewed concerning captioned TAYLOR said HANES made reference to having information and names concerning organizations connected with this case which he had offered on several occasions and no one had accepted his offer or seemed interested. TAYLOR said HANES did not mention any agencies and in particular did not mention the FBI; however, TAYLOR felt the impression was left by the interview that official agencies had turned down HANES' offer of additional assistance in this case. It was TAYLOR's feeling the record should be set straight and he asked me if the FBI had been contacted in the past by HANES concerning this matter. At the time of the telephone call I did not have the file at hand; however, I told TAYLOR it was my recollection HANES had contacted the FBI and offered information in exchange for information from the FBI and that he had been told that we would be interested in receiving any information he had bearing upon this case. I told TAYLOR I would check into the matter and call him after I had an opportunity to review the file.

On 3/13/69 I telephoned TAYLOR and briefly discussed the contact HANES had with us on 10/22/68 and the fact that we had written HANES and specifically told him we would be interested in receiving any information in his possession concerning this mase. TAYLOR said that in view of the FBI letter which recorded an offer to HANES to receive information in his possession he, TAYLOR, felt he should call HANES and tell him the USA's Office also would be interested in receiving any information in his possession in view of the inferences on the Huntley-Brinkley report.
