Two Vital Characteristics

The arrest of James Earl Ray, accused assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, serves not only justice but emphasizes two of the most important characteristics of successful police work.

Those characteristics are painstaking attention to detail amid infinite patience and wholehearted cooperation.

BEFORE RAY was apprehended at London airport Saturday, the police in four countries had cooperated in a manner worth unrestrained commendation. These agencies were the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the United States, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in Canada, Scotland Yard in England and Portuguese authorities.

As part of this cooperation, more than 300.000 passport photographs were examined in Washington and Ottowa, Canada. This part of the operation attained success when a Canadian Mounted Police officer turned up Bay's picture under the name of Damon George Sneyd. With this information, plus a "tip," possibly from the FBI or the Royal

Canadian Mounted Police, Ray was nabbed as he was going through customs after arrival on a flight from Lisbon, Portugal.

Of course, there is a great deal more to this story which cannot be told at this time. But time should bring it out, especially as to where Ray obtained the money which made it possible for him to travel overseas. Here indeed is suspicion of conspiracy.

HERE IS shown the value of the international police organization, Interpol, whose Portuguese section was involved in Ray's capture.

The two characteristics of successful police work — painstaking attention to detail and cooperation — mentioned earlier often are evident in Wilmington and other communities with the result that justice is served well. Perhaps the public takes this situation for granted too often. But we shouldn't. Instead, good citizens should show their gratitude to all honorable law enforcement officers. As they do, they should pledge wholehearted support to them as they strive for one of the nation's greatest needs — the prevalence of justice at all times.

This was the last contact he has had with ROBERT and stated he definitely did not receive any long distance telephone calls during the week of 6/9-16/68 from ROBERT or anyone else from the State of Wisconsin. He stated he worked several nights until around 11 P.M. and on Friday night, 6/14/68, visited his father, IVEY SANDERS of Lenoir. PAUL SANDERS pointed out it was possible his wife may have received a call from his brother, ROBERT FRANKLIN SANDERS from Wisconsin.

Subsequently on 6/17/68 PAUL SANDERS advised that he had discussed this matter with his wife and she stated she did not receive any long distance telephone calls during the week of 6/9-16/68. She stated ROBERT SANDERS had called PAUL's home on Sunday evening either 6/2/68 or 6/9/68 from an unknown location and this was the last contact she had had with ROBERT SANDERS. She definitely received no calls from Wisconsin to her knowledge during the week of 6/9-16/68.

On 6/17/68 SAMUEL JERRY SANDERS was recontacted and advised he had discussed this matter with his wife and youngest brother, JACOB DOUGLAS SANDERS and they both advised him they had not received any telephone calls from ROBERT FRANKLIN SANDERS or anyone else from the State of Wisconsin during the week of 6/9-16/68.

For the information of the Bureau and all offices, PAUL and JERRY SANDERS were interviewed at length and at no time displayed any animosity toward minority groups of the Federal Government and indicated a high regard for the FBI.

They both advised their father, IVEY SANDERS, had tried to help their oldest brother, ROBERT FRANKLINGSANDERS, for a number of years but finally gave up. They stated there were 13 members of the immediate family and on numerous occasions had sent ROBERT money to pay fines or lawyer's fees when actually the money was needed to buy food and clothing for other members of the family. Both brothers also indicated they and other members of the family had helped ROBERT on numerous occasions but for the past several years have refused to assist any financial aid and no longer accept any collect telephone calls from him. They both stated they had unlisted telephone numbers for this reason in order to prevent any unnecessary calls from ROBERT or any of his associates to their homes. They stated that ROBERT had traveled extensively over the U. S. and the family never knew where he was or when he would next appear in Caldwell Co., N. C., PAUL indicated that he could not place any confidence in any information that ROBERT gave him and he might tell you he was going to Calif. when actually he would be going to the next county.

ROBERT SANDERS' brothers indicated that they knew EARL HALL as a used car dealer only and have no personal association with him. RUBY ANDERSON is a known to thembbut

they have a first cousin by the name of RUBY CRUMP who has been married several times and whose whereabouts are unknown.

They advised they did not lie as to ROBERT's whereabouts and if he were responsible for the theft of a car or passing bad checks or any other crime, he should be caught and punished.

Investigation in Lenoir indicated that all members of IVEY SANDERS' family are law-abiding citizens with the exception of ROBERT FRANKLIN and they are a working class people with good reputations. There is no indication that SANDERS are engaged in any klan activities. EARL HALL operated a used car business in Lenoir for a number of years but sold out but just recently re-established this business. He has the reputation of being a shrewd car dealer not known to engage in any illegal activities.

He stated that sometime, exact time which cannot be exactly specific, on the morning of 7/23/68, a male in what appears to be a normal voice called the hot line and furnished the following information:

"I'd rather not give my name under the circumstances because I know JAMES EARL RAY is innocent because at the time, he was in Greensboro with me but I knew he was a fugitive. I cannot get involved. According to Mr. DAVE ALEXANDER, City Editor of that newspaper, this tape contains the recorded message of an unidentified male who called the newspaper on 7/23/68 and indicated that he knew JAMES EARL RAY was innocent because RAY was in Greensboro, N. C. at the time of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

The Bureau in referenced airtel instructed the Charlotte Office to obtain this tape and submit it to the FBI Laboratory inasmuch as the Laboratory may be able to use this tape in a voice comparison matter at a later date.

At this time no specific request is being made of the Laboratory. The decision as to what action should be taken is being left to the Bureau and Memphis. For the information of the Bureau and Laboratory, the tape being sent as an enclosure is played back on a "Code-A-Phone," Model 770, manufactured by Ford Industries, Incorporated, Portland, Oregon.
