Prefers Western and Country Music and has been described as "crazy about dancing";

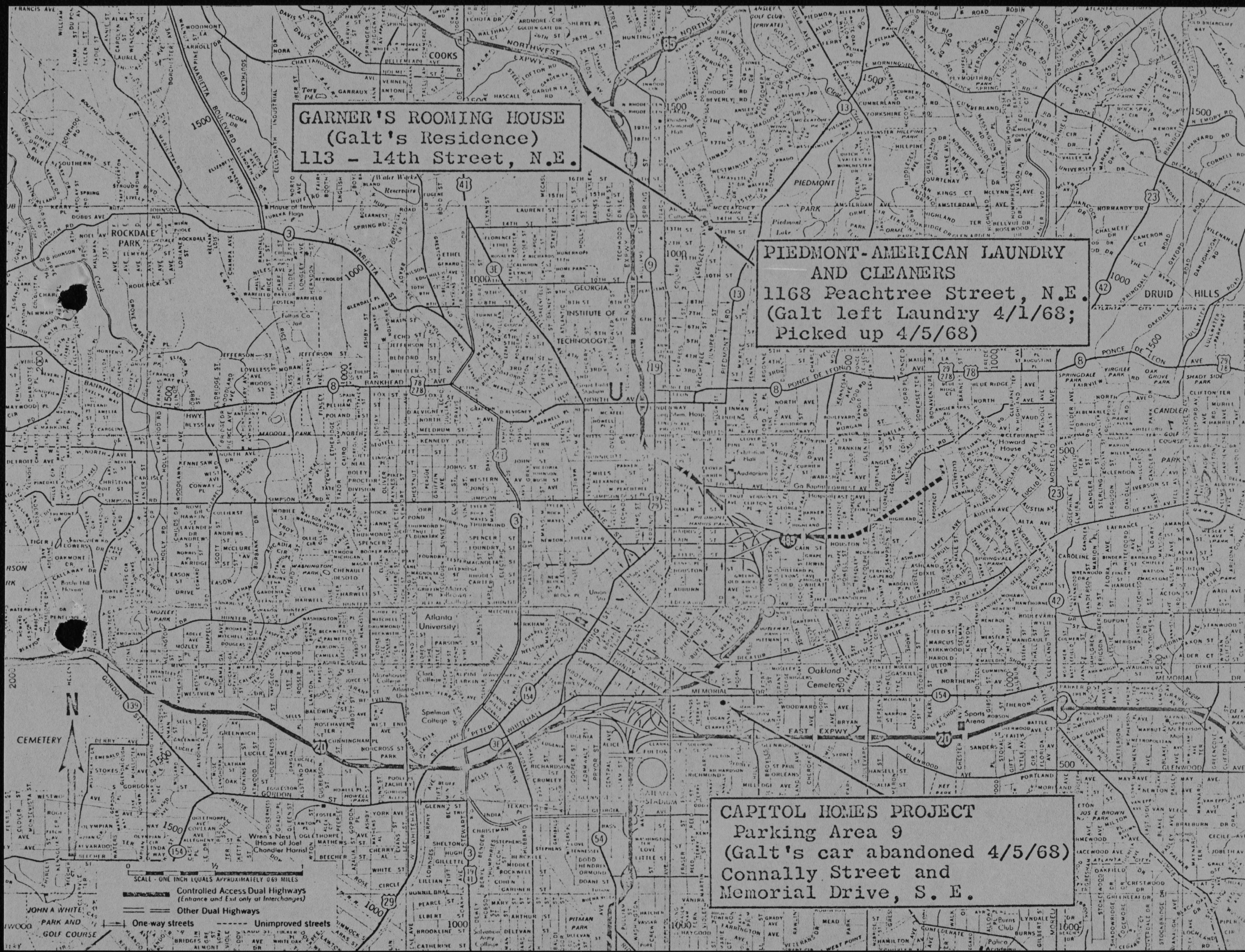
Has been described as very shy, quiet, reserved, evasive and generally known as a "loner";
