Result of examination:

The three pink tape strips in K8 and K9 are similar to the Q69 and Q70 laundry tapes in color, construction and composition.

The twelve laundry tapes (K10) are similar to the Q69 and Q70 laundry tapes in color, construction and composition.

Five of these tapes have the same length (1 1/16 inches) as Q69 and Q70. The other nine are longer, either 1 3/32 inches or 1 1/8 inches in length.

The K8 and K9 tapes were found to differ in printing from the tapes appearing on Q69 and Q70.

The tapes comprising K10 are of varying lengths; however, no significant differences were noted between the Q69 and Q70 laundry tapes when compared with some of the K10 tapes indicating they may have originated from the same machine.

Specimens K8, K9 and K10 are retained.

For the information of the Bureau, referenced telephone call from SAC HANCOCK, Albany, indicated that information from the Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, revealed that only two machines, one located in the Los Angeles area, and the other, bearing Serial No. 30769, owned by the Holly Laundry and Cleaners, 48 Broadway, Chula Vista, California, were likely to have produced a laundry mark similar to that found in the abandoned clothing of unknown subject in instant case.

The Albany Office requested that the Holly Laundry and Cleaners be immediately contacted and the owner interviewed concerning their use of the thermo seal laundry mark, and, further, to obtain a sample of this mark.

Mr. R. J. HALPERTY, Manager, Holly Laundry and Cleaners, 48 Broadway, Chula Vista, California, made available thermo seal machine, Model No. H5J1, bearing Serial No. 30769, and samples of this machine were made by ALMA FORD, operator, who normally operates this machine.

Upon viewing the colored photograph of the clothing abandoned by unknown subject, Mr. HALFERTY advised the code "02B-6" was not similar to the code used at the Holly Laundry and Cleaners.

Mr. HALFERTY also advised, as did Mrs. ALMA FORD, that the color red appearing on the laundry mark in this colored photograph was in no way similar to the tape used at the Holly Laundry and Cleaners. According to them, they have never used this color of red, and the nearest shade is a light pink, upon which were made the sample laundry marks.

Enclosed for the Bureau is a white handkerchief containing samples of Model No. H5J1, Serial No. 30769, in the identical code "02B-6" as are pictured in the colored photographs received from the Bureau. Also contained on this handkerchief are sample laundry marks similar to those used by the Holly Laundry and Cleaners.

The enclosure is being forwarded to the Bureau for comparison with the laundry marks on abandoned clothing. It is not necessary that the Bureau return the enclosure to the San Diego Division and may dispose of it as it so desires.





Enclosed for the Bureau is original and one copy of letter in the handwriting of JAMES E. RAY dated 10/24/66. Also, two copies of a two-page report of psychiatric examination dated 10/24/66.

Two copies each of the above are also being enclosed for the Memphis Office.

It is requested that the FBI Laboratory compare the handwriting samples in this letter of JAMES E. RAY to handwriting samples already furnished the Bureau of any other suspects in this matter.

The letter from JAMES E. RAY is to Dr. EARL C. KEPLER, Biggs Building, Fulton, Mo., and was furnished to SA ROWEN B. AYERS by Dr. G. B. PETERSON, Fulton State Hospital No. 1, Fulton, Missouri, on 4/19/68. Dr. PETERSON also furnished the report of psychiatric examination to SA AYERS at this time. Dr. PETERSON advised that the psychiatric examination was confidential for the FBI only and could not be released outside of the Department of Justice without a court order. Dr. PETERSON further requested that the original letter from JAMES E. RAY dated 10/24/66 be returned to the hospital when it is of no further value to the FBI.
