Enclosed for the FBI Laboratory are four samples of Thermo Seal tapes, two on pale yellow and two on goldish-yellow, obtained from the Deluxe Laundry, 1745 East 14th Street, Oakland, California.

On April 24, 1968, ANSELM GOUIG, Owner, Deluxe Laundry, made available the above samples, two from Thermo Seal Machine Model H5K2, Serial Number 30942, and two from Model H5K2, Serial Number 30948. The samples from Serial Number 30942 are "20P-3" rather than "20R-3" inasmuch as the letters for that roll from R through Z will not print. GOUIG stated he does not know how long ago this happened.

Deluxe Laundry uses the code "20R-3" which is a system suggested by the Thermo Seal Company at the time of installation of the machines. The "20" indicates the lot number, "R" indicates the week of the year, and "-3" indicates the package number. Under the system there are two weeks each year when R is used. The last "R" week was the week of January 15 - 20, 1968, at which time a goldish-yellow Thermo Seal tape was used. GOUIG indicated this firm uses 14 different colors of Thermo Seal tape.

"20R-3" was used around January 17 - 18, 1968. It was processed through a load of sheets and pillow slips which were subcontracted from PETE TAYLOR, a driver for Sparklizing Cleaners

and Laundry, 3217 Danville Highway, Alamo, California, Ticket Number 45333. The customer for this load was "BOTTO" with address "Estabueno" and the ticket was not dated.

The laundry usually indicates on the ticket which articles of the load are colored and from the ticket it would indicate the sheets and pillow slips were white in color.

On April 25, 1968, LEE TAYLOR advised AL BOTTO, 40 Estabueno, Orinda, California, has been a customer of his for over ten years. He stated that BOTTO is one of his best customers and that his laundry and cleaning bill is usually somewhere between \$125 and \$200 a month. BOTTO owns Art's Buffet Bar and Restaurant, 4023 Broadway, Oakland, California, is now semi-retired, and spends most of his time on his yacht and BOTTO's oldest son, DICK, operates the bar and restaurant. BOTTO has a younger son who is attending college and works nights as a bartender at the restaurant. Both sons are married and do not live with their parents.

On April 25, 1968, AL BOTTO was contacted at the Bridge Marina Yacht Harbor, Antioch, California, and advised that to his knowledge he is not missing any bed linens from either his home or his boat. He also stated that he has not had any burglaries in either his home or his yachtwherein any bed linens were taken.

He viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, aka, and stated he does not recall ever having seen him.

Indices of the San Francisco Office indicate BOTTO is identical with ALBENO LOUIS BOTTO, born 1914 in California and has CII Number 2481361. He was arrested by the Oakland Police Department, their Number 166334, on January 17, 1964, for enticing a minor female for prostitution.

Enclosed for the Bureau are three pieces of cloth containing sample tapes from three Thermo-Seal machines.

On 4/24/68, WARREN TYSON, Manager, White Star Laundry and Dry Cleaners, 4535 Cole, Dallas, Texas, furnished the enclosed sample laundry marks from the three Thermo-Seal marking machines operated by his concern. He advised the "20" is a lot number, the "R" is the week, and the "3" is the customer invoice. He uses eight colors of Thermo-Seal tape each week and a light yellow color is therefore used 1/8 (approximately) of each week.

The enclosed samples are gold colored tape as opposed to the light yellow color he uses. Gold is used exclusively for one day specials. He stated he would put tape markers on sheets and pillow cases only when they are brought in for one day special service. He does not use any marker on normal flat work such as sheets and pillow cases, handling that by the bundle.

TYSON advised he makes records of the identity of customers only if they have a charge account. Almost all, if not all, of his one day service is done on a cash basis.

TYSON informed that he had two one-week periods within the last year during which the "R" symbol was in use. During each of these two weeks, the light yellow tape was used for one series of numerical lots. He advised a search of his records failed to disclose any record of identity for a customer #3, Lot 20, yellow tape series and from this, he assumes the customer must have been a cash customer. The first week was in June, 1967 and the second week was from February 26 to March 2, 1968.

TYSON advised machines 2 and 3 are used constantly and the ink ribbons on them must be changed at least once every ten days. Machine #3 temporarily has the "R" symbol broken off. Machine #1 is used only for overflow work and would be used only a fraction of each week.

Enclosed herewith for the Laboratory is a piece of white cloth containing samples of Thermo-seal laundry markings of the Clinton Laundry and Cleaners, Clinton, Oklahoma, and two pieces of paper containing Thermo-seal laundry markings of the Stillwater Laundry, Stillwater, Oklahoma.

On April 23, 1968, RICHARD SUTTON, Assistant Manager, Stillwater Laundry, 402 South Main, Stillwater, Oklahoma, advised SA PAUL R. KEISER that Thermo-seal laundry mark 20R-3 is employed in his business. SUTTON stated that the letters of the alphabet are used to designate a particular week and that each letter could be used only once every 26 weeks. The digets used in the code before the letter are used to designate a load number and digets used after the letter designate a particular order in that particular load. The color is changed at random and ten colors in all are used. SUTTON produced laundry receipt number 13824 dated 1/30/68, in the name of JAMES DEAN, no address, for two shirts, which had a Thermo-seal tape attached, red in

color and imprinted with code number 20R-3. SUTTON advised that DEAN is a regular customer and is well known to him. SUTTON further advised that code number 20R-3 has not been used since 1/30/68, and would have been used prior to this in August of 1967, but due to the fact that no records are available, it would be impossible to determine who might have been assigned this code at that time or the color of the code used. SUTTON furnished samples of Thermo-seal tape used in his business for submission to the FBI Laboratory.

SUTTON was exhibited Wanted Flyer number 442-A for JAMES EARL RAY, at which time he advised that he could not identify this individual as being identical with anyone he has observed in the past.

On 4/23/68, ROBERT POOLE, manager, Clinton Laundry and Cleaners, Clinton, Oklahoma, advised SA WILLIAM R. FARRIS that his firm uses a code such as 20R-3. The letter in the code is changed weekly and the entire alphabet is utilized. By calculating on a calendar POOLE was able to determine that the symbol 20R-3 would have been in use from noon, 9/22/67 through noon on 9/29/67. Prior to this time the code would have been used in March, 1967. In March 1968, the code would have been used again but in March, 1968, POOLE's firm was not using a Thermo-seal marking machine. Prior to September, 1967, the firm was using a Thermo-seal marking machine which is no longer in operation but this machine produced a wider tape. . This particular tape was a wider tape than the current machine being used and the tape used was gold in color. POOLE stated his firm does not retain records on home delivery transactions over 3 months. They do have available records on cash items at the counter. These records were searchedfor the period 1/1/67 through 4/1/68 without locating any having the symbol 20R-3. Symbols 20R-2 and 20R-4 were located and POOLE stated this indicates 20R-3 was a home delivery on which no records are available. of the Thermo-seal laundry markings were obtained from POOLE for submission to the FBI Laboratory.

REQUEST OF THE FBI LABORATORY

The FBI Laboratory is requested to compare the enclosed samples of Thermo-seal laundry markings with the questioned

Due to the limited nature of the questioned hand printing on Q124 and because of unexplained variations, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether the hand printing on Q124 is identical to the hand printing appearing on documents attributable to Eric S. Galt, submitted in this case. A number of significant differences were noted indicating


