Sgt. DIETSCH advised that the car Dr. JOHNSON was driving when last seen is a white 1967 MGB-GT two-door hardtop with Arizona license NAA-664.

When first reported missing, Dr. JOHNSON had last been seen at 8:20 a.m., 3/29/68 when he left his office in Tucson to go to St. Joseph's Hospital in Tucson to confer with other doctors on a case. He did not return to his office and apparently has contacted no one since then.

On 4/6/68 Dr. S. R. KEMBERLING, Tucson physician, after seeing a newspaper article concerning Dr. JOHNSON's disappearance, told Sgt. DIETSCH that he and his wife had seen Dr. JOHNSON 3/31/68 at the parking lot of St. Joseph's Hospital in Tucson. He said he and his wife both are well acquainted with Dr. JOHNSON and are positive of the identification. They waved at Dr. JOHNSON who acknowledged their greeting. Dr. JOHNSON was sitting in his white MGB sports car and appeared to be in good health and spirits. As of 4/16/68 this is the last report of Dr. JOHNSON's whereabouts.

Sgt. DIETSCH said their investigation had developed that Dr. JOHNSON disappeared suddenly for several days in November, 1967, and was found only after he had wrecked his Austin Healy sports car near Benson, Arizona. When found he was believed to be under the influence of some type of narcotics. Sgt. DIETSCH said Dr. JOHNSON had been reported as a missing person on that occasion.

Intensive investigation by the Tucson PD and other local law enforcement agencies to locate Dr. JOHNSON continues. The desert area of southern Arizona is being searched in view of the possibility that Dr. JOHNSON might have driven into the desert and either suffered a heart attack or committed suicide.

He said he and his wife both are well acquainted with Dr. JOHNSON and are positive of the identification. They waved at Dr. JOHNSON who acknowledged their greeting. Dr. JOHNSON was sitting in his white MG-BT sports car and appeared to be in good health and spirits. As of 4/18/68 this is the last report of Dr. JOHNSON's whereabouts.

Sgt. DITSCHE said their investigation had developed that Dr. JOHNSON disappeared suddenly for several days in November, 1967, and was found only after he had wrecked his Austin Healy sports car near Benson, Arizona. When found he was believed to be under the influence of some type of narcotics. Sgt. DITSCHE said Dr. JOHNSON had been reported as a missing person on that occasion.

Intensive investigation by the Tucson PD and other local law enforcement agencies to locate Dr. JOHNSON continues. The desert area of southern Arizona is being searched in view of the possibility that Dr. JOHNSON might have driven into the desert and either suffered a heart attack or committed suicide.

Close liaison is being maintained with the Tucson PD concerning their investigation to locate Dr. JOHNSON. Any developments will be immediately reported to the Bureau and Memphis.

Sgt. DIETSCH pointed out that in showing Dr. JOHNSON's photograph to any possible witnesses in the KING case, it should be borne in mind that at the time of his disappearance, 3/29/68, his hair was cut in a short crewcut style, which according to acquaintances was a noticeable feature of Dr. JOHNSON.

Although there have been no facts developed to indicate that Dr. JOHNSON, by his background, profession, or actions, would normally be considered a likely suspect in this matter, investigation to date has not completely eliminated him. The general similarity between his description and that of Unsub, the date of his sudden disappearance and the fact he was driving a white sports car when last seen would appear to make him worthy of consideration as a suspect in this matter.

Exhibition of Dr. JOHNSON's photograph to pertinent witnesses and other appropriate investigation being left to the discretion of Memphis.
