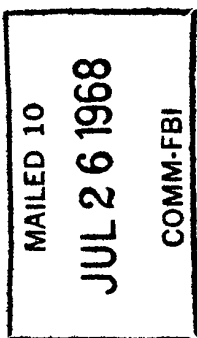

The letter was returned by postal authorities to the telephone company.

On 7/15/68, Mr. CALAB HALSTEAD, Security Division, Southern Bell Telephone & Telegraph, was advised of the Bureau interest in this letter.

On 7/25/68, Mr. HALSTEAD advised that they had traced the letter and that it was a pay-phone refund of ten cents, regarding a local call placed on 7/9/68 from pay phone 525-9251 by an individual giving his name as JAMES RAY. No other info of value contained in the telephone company records. Above pay phone located in the lobby of the Gordon Hotel, 211 Mitchell, Atlanta.

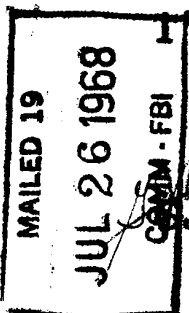

It is noted that in the original interview with Mrs. FOXIE, she advised that the unknown caller paid for his phone calls and also apparently was calling from a coin-operated telephone.

Re Chicago airtel to Memphis dated 6/11/68; Bureau teletype to Dallas dated 6/14/68, and Dallas airtel to Bureau dated 6/18/68, all relating to possible involvement of GENE BASS in conspiracy to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On 7/3/68, LLOYD GENE BASS was interviewed by SA WILLIAM B. HOLLOMAN at Dallas, Texas. BASS denied knowing any present or former inmate of the Washington State Penitentiary. He stated he certainly did not give anyone any amount of money to have MARTIN LUTHER KING killed. He said he has been almost destitute himself for many months and has had to resort to writing bad checks and petty thefts to sustain himself. He denied that he has any knowledge of any conspiracy to kill KING or has ever made any statement to anyone concerning having KING killed. He stated he does not own any meat packing company but has worked as a meat cutter and delivery man for meat packers in the Dallas area. 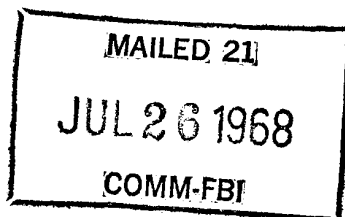

Hanes, defense counsel for James Earl Ray in the local Tennessee prosecution of Ray for King's murder, has advised SAC that in the near future he intends to talk to the Director. Hanes stated that this case is of "grave national concern." He also stated "the thrust came from the Left." Hanes indicated he owes a duty to his client, however, he considers himself an American first and believes that the Bureau should not let up in its efforts. He did not elaborate nor expand on these statements and in response to questions indicated that he would at some future date furnish additional information to the Director.

ACTION:

In the event Hanes attempts to establish contact with the Director, he will not be afforded this opportunity. Hanes will be advised that he should furnish any information that he has to the SAC at Birmingham.

At request of contacting Agent, CI 568-R verified the fact that Mrs. ELOISE WITTE currently resides at 11886 Lick Road in Cincinnati, Ohio, however, she no longer has a telephone.

Informant advised that it is highly doubtful that Mrs. WITTE would be cooperative in an interview with FBI Agents and in all probability would not allow herself to be interviewed at all. Informant explained that in the past nine months Mrs. WITTE has completely disassociated herself with the Klan and related white hate group organizations in all respects.

On 7/24/68, Mrs. WITTE was contacted and advised that she had no information to furnish the FBI at this time about anything.
