PURPOSE:

To advise that more personnel have been added to the Task Force of the Department's Office of Professional Responsibility (OPR) and to request additional office space in the JEH Building for Task Force personnel to continue review of our King investigation.

SYNOPSIS:

The Attorney General has ordered a thorough review of our investigation of Martin Luther King, Jr. and his assassination. Appointed to do this review is a Task Force under supervision of the OPR of the Department. This group has been given total access to our King related tiles. This Task Force, consisting of six persons, has been utilizing Room 4171 of JEH Building since May 1976. Three more analysts have been added to the Task Force and its leader has requested additional space. Since Room 4171 is inadequate to accombate the entire Task Force, and since all Task Force members have Top Secret clearances and appropriate building passes are being processed for new Task Force members, it is felt this matter should be referred to the Space Management Unit of the Administrative Services

Memorandum J.G. Deegan to R.J. Gallagher Re: Martin Luther King, Jr.

DETAILS:

The Attorney General has ordered a thorough review of our investigation of Martin Luther King, Jr. and his assassination. Appointed to conduct this review is a Task Force working under the direction of the OPR of the Department. This Task Force, consisting of six persons, began its review 5/10/76 utilizing Room 4171 of the JEH Building. This room is assigned to the Intelligence Division and was previously used by staff members of the Senate Select Committee.

Task Force leader Fred Folsom has advised that three analysts, Dana Boyd, Veronica Keith, and Renee Holmes, have been added to the Task Force. Folsom requested additional space since Room 4171 is inadequate to house all nine members of the Task Force.

All Task Force members, including the new additions, have been cleared for Top Secret information and security offices of the Department and Bureau are handling appropriate building passes for the new Task Force members. Since Room 4171 is inadequate to accommodate all members of the Task Force, it is felt this matter should be referred to the Space Management Unit of the Administrative Services Division in effort to obtain additional office space needed.

ADDENDUM OF THE SPACE MANAGEMENT UNIT, ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION, RLO:efl, 9/3/76

There is no unassigned space in the FBIHQ available for reallocation to the Task Force for the Department's Office of Professional Responsibility (OPR). Additionally, the recent organizational changes involving the transfer of responsibilities and personnel between the Intelligence and the General Investigative Divisions further aggravates an already distressing space situation for the Intelligence Division.

Conference Room #3075 (a joint use facility previously allocated to the Laboratory and Special Investigative Divisions) in early June, 1976 was made available for the temporary needs of the Intelligence Division. It is at present not fully utilized. The three additional analysts recently added to the OPR Task Force may be temporarily accommodated in Room #3075.

The Space Management Unit (SMU) recognizes it may not be desirable to comingle the activities of the OPR group with the functions being carried on by the Intelligence Division in Room #3075. No other viable alternative is apparent to the SMU unless consideration is given to making the Intelligence Division Conference Room available to the OPR group.

GID, with concurrence of the Intelligence Division and Records Management Division, does not recommend the OPR Task Force's utilization of either the Intelligence Division's conference room or temporary use of Room 3075 which houses the Classification Review Unit of the Records Management Division. On 11/5/75, representatives of the Intelligence Division provided Senator Frank Church and selected members of the SSC a highly sensitive briefing concerning our informant operation which provides information on liaison between Communist Parties in the United States and the USSR With s briefing was intended, in part, to serve in lieu of any written information in response to SSC's request for communications documenting Stanley David Levison as a secret member of the CPUSA. It was King's association with Levison that served for basis of our investigation of King.

As you are aware, the Attorney General (AG) has ordered the OPR to conduct a review of our investigation of King. This Task Force consists of seven individuals who have been reviewing our files since May 1976. After reviewing all King assassination files and security files in a few Field Offices, the group plans to begin review of King security files at FBIHQ. This group has been given total access to our King related files at the direction of the AG. U.

Task Force leader Fred Folsom has requested his group receive the same oral briefing provided the SSC. Folsom feels this briefing will provide valuable background information bearing on initiation of the King investigation. Folsom believes absence of such a briefing will leave a void in his group's review which is to be as thorough as possible. Folsom has stated that Michael E. Shaheen, Counsel of the OPR agrees with his view. U

Since this briefing has been provided the SSC and in order to be completely open and cooperative with the OPR review, it is believed that it is in the best interest of the FBI to provide the briefing. Representatives of the Intelligence Division will conduct the briefing during the week of 8/23/76.

Reference is made to your memorandum to the Attorney General captioned as above dated August 2, 1976. memorandum enclosed a proposed memorandum of understanding which set forth the procedures and standards for providing /materials previously given to the Senate Select Committee (SSC) to the estate of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. is to confirm that the memorandum of understanding, with one exception, accurately reflects the Department's view of the standards and procedures by which FBI materials concerning Dr. King should be provided to the King estate.

The one exception is that derogatory information concerning Mr. Stanley David Levison and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Wachtel contained in the documents provided to the SSC should not be excised before transmittal to the King estate. That exception is made at the request of Mr. Levison and Mr. and Mrs. Wachtel. At our request their consents to our providing such materials to the King estate will be put in writing, a copy of which will be provided to the Bureau. This exception was decided upon after the proposed memorandum of understanding was drafted by the FBI which is why it was omitted from the memorandum.

We appreciate your expeditious treatment of the request of the King estate.

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Reference is made to your letter of July 14, 1976, captioned "Request of the Estate of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.," instructing that certain material concerning King previously furnished to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence furnished to the Committee) now be furnished to the King estate.

Because of the complicated and sensitive nature of this matter as well as the large volume of material involved, discussions have been held between representatives of the Department and this Bureau for the purpose of establishing Department and this Bureau for the purpose of establishing necessary suidelines and resolving many obvious problems related to the implementation of these instructions. These related to the implementation of these instructions. These are dealt with in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which are dealt with in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which is submitted herewith for your concurrence. Persuant to your request we are coordinating this matter with the office of Mr. Hichael E. Shaheen, Jr., Special Counsel for Intelligence Coordination.

In addition to those matters covered in the MOU, it is believed that recognition should be taken of the following:

During a discussion of this matter on July 20, 1976, with Shaheen, he observed that this matter was not to be handled as a Freedom of Information Act or Privacy Act request and that the usual appeal procedures provided for by those Acts would not be available to the King estate.

On July 27, 1976, Mr. Steven Blackhurst, Assistant Special Counsel for Intelligence Coordination, advised a representative of this Bureau that although it was first believed that the King estate would provide some written consents from individuals whose names appear in the King documents (referred to in paragraph 1 of referenced letter), such consents are not now expected and we may address the matter of privacy in the manner indicated in the MOU.

One concerns the two civil suits pending regarding the electronic surveillance of King (referred to in paragraph 2 of referenced letter). The other concerns the review of the King case and related matters by a Departmental task force under the direction of Mr. Fred G. Folsom, Jr. These endeavors are engaging most of our personnel who are familiar with and have the expertise to handle the latest request of the King estate. Nonetheless, you are assured that we will give the latest request a high priority for expeditious attention.

Initial conference with Department on this matter, 7/20/76, in Shaheen's Office. Present for Department were Shaheen; his assistant, Blackhurst; and James Kieckhefer and Joseph Gross, members of Folsom's task force. Representing the Bureau were P. T. Blake, Legal Counsel Division; T. H. Bresson and D. L. Smith, FOI - Privacy Acts Section, Records Management Division; and for INTD, J. T. Aldhizer, III; P. E. Nugent and S. F. Phillips.

It was agreed at this meeting that a draft of an MOU encompassing results of discussions would be drawn up by the Bureau, informally reviewed by Shaheen's Office, and thereafter formalized through this correspondence. Such was done and after further discussions between Blackhurst and Phillips, the final version of the MOU was prepared and is now being presented to the Attorney General for his official concurrence.

At the 7/20/76 meeting Shaheen indicated that the reason the King estate was asking for materials from FBI files was that the interested parties desire to develop chistory or chronology of the civil rights movement and since King was under such intensive investigation by the FBI, it is believed by them that material in our files will serve to fill out the historical Shaheen was asked if the Department had anything in record. writing from the King estate relating to this request and he stated it did not. When it was indicated that the Bureau might expect there would eventually be something in writing, Shaheen nodded However, when Phillips raised this matter with Blackhurst on 7/27/76. Blackhurst indicated that the Department does not have anything in writing from the King estate and the Department would "just as soon not" have a written request. The Department's reasoning is that it wants to leave the matter informal in order to avoid a law suit and that it would not be in the Department's interest to have the King estate formalize its request.

When asked the basis for the urgency of this matter, Blackhurst being reminded of the other King matter inquiries now tying up our personnel, Blackhurst said it was probably because the estate had originally initiated negotiations with the Department for King materials even prior to the Church Committee entering the picture.

It was also brought to Blackhurst's attention that according to a letter of 6/3/76, from Shaheen to Assistant Director Mintz, the King estate requested Department's permission for access to King materials. Blackhurst was asked whether the "access" request had been changed to one of "delivery" and he stated that it had.
