





WASHINGTON - The FBI, which used electronic skulduggery in an effort to discredit Martin Luther King, Jr., tried to employ similar illegal tactics to catch his killer.

Long-buried FBI documents reveal that then Director J. Edgar Hoover personally approved a break-in and illegal electronic bugging aimed at innocent relatives of James Earl Ray, who was later convicted of killing King.

For years, Hoover had conducted a vicious smear campaign against King. The FBI peddled malicious anti-King stories to the press and had sent doctored tapes concerning King's personal life to his wife. When King was slain in 1968, whispers about possible FBI involvement put Hoover under great pressure to find the assassin.

While the FBI agents were not on Ray's trail, a May 10, 1968, memo, prepared for top Hoover aide J. P. Mohr, outlined elaborate illegal plans to catch the murderer.

AS PART OF the overall investigation, code-named MURKIN - an acronym for murder and King - a memo was written which declared: "Consideration is given to microphone installations on certain properties of Albert and Carol Pepper," the brother-in-law and sister of James Earl Ray.

"The proposal," cautioned the memo, "raises a question concerning the legality of any action taken against the subject of this case on the basis of information obtained from the microphones." If Ray called the Peppers and the bugged conversations were used to arrest him, the memo said, Ray "then could claim that the surveillance violated his right of privacy." This could prejudice the court case against him.

But if certain precautions were taken, the memo continued, "the worst that could happen" is that the arrest could be declared illegal. Using tortured logic, the document insisted that Ray could still be convicted despite the FBI lawbreaking.

The FBT plotters bluntly admitted that the whole scheme was unconstitutional and a "technical violation" of the law. "Be aware," the memo warned, "that since the search and seizure is unconstitutional as to the Peppers, they have at least a theoretical cause of action for damages against those who installed the (bugging) devices by trespass." "Trespass" is FBT lingo for a break-in.

We have been unable to determine whether the FBI actually bugged or burglarized the Peppers' home. Indeed, assassinations expert Harold Weisberg has developed evidence indicating the Justice Department vetoed the plan. But inside sources insist the FBI did use dubious and possible illegal means to capture Ray, who later pleaded guilty to murdering King and was sentenced to 99 years in prison.

The FBI has acknowledged that abuses occurred in the past. Since 1973, however, the present director, Clarence Kelley, has halted most of these practices. We were unable to reach the Peppers.

Reference is made to your memorandum dated April 14, 1978, wherein you requested to be advised of our findings concerning a letter you received from Albert Pepper, who requested information as to whether, the FBI ever illegally entered his home or other properties and installed a microphone surveillance.

A review of our MURKIN file 44-38861 (the civil rights assassination investigative file), shows that by a letter dated May 13, 1968, to the Attorney General captioned "Assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr.," the Director of the FBI advised that extensive investigation had been conducted concerning James Earl Ray and no information had been developed indicating his present whereabouts. This detter pointed out that in order to possibly assist in locating and apprehending Ray, that it would be of extreme value to know if Ray had made any contact, either Expersonally or by telephone, with his sister, Carol Pepper, Fas well as his brother, John Larry Ray. The Director therefore requested in this letter that the Attorney General authorize the installation of an electronic surveillance on the residence of Carol Pepper (married to Albert Pepper and residing at 2025 Belleview, St. Louis, Missouri, telephone number 645-2948), on the residence of John Larry Ray and at the Grapevine Tavern (1982 Arsenal, St. Louis, Missouri, Eelephone PR6-9417), owned by Carol Pepper and operated by John Larry Ray. The Director advised that these installations could assist in the early apprehension

There is no indication in our files that the Attorney General responded to this May 13, 1968, request of the FBI and by letter dated June 11, 1968, captioned, "Electronic Surveillances." the Director of the FBI advised the Attorney General, in part, that inasmuch as Ray had been apprehended, the request for electronic surveillance mentioned in the FBI letter dated May 13, 1968, was hereby withdrawn.

An internal FBI memorandum dated May 10, 1968, in the MURKIN file discusses certain legal ramifications regarding this May 13, 1968, electronic surveillance request and portions of this memorandum are quoted in the newspaper article by Jack Anderson and Les Whitten, enclosed by Mr. Pepper. For your information, the material in these MURKIN communications was made available to Harold Weisberg (mentioned in the Anderson/Whitten article), under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act.

As you may recall, the Task Force from your office, which reviewed the FBI's investigation of Martin Luther King, Jr., had access to these above described MURKIN communications.

A review has been made of the indices and files, including our electronic surveillance indices at FBI Headquarters regarding this request of Mr. Pepper. (During this review, the MURKIN file showed that in May of 1968, Albert and Carol Pepper had their home telephone number changed to an unpublished number of 645-9152, at the same address of 2025 Belleview). In addition, since Mr. Pepper states "... so the records, if any, may be located in the St. Louis F.B.I. field office," this same type of review was made at our St. Louis FBI Field Office.

Based upon this review both at FBI Headquarters and our St. Louis Field Office, no record could be located showing that any electronic surveillance was conducted by the FBI on the persons of Albert or Carol Pepper or that any entry or electronic surveillance was conducted by the FBI on any properties or telephone numbers listed under their names, or on the specific addresses and telephone numbers previously set forth: the home of Albert and Carol Pepper (2025 Belleview), telephone numbers 645-2948 and 645-9152; the Grapevine Tavern (1982 Arsenal), telephone number PR6-9417; or at the present address of Albert Pepper (523 Franru Lane).



On June 22, 1978, Assistant Legal Attaches
DENNIS R. DICKSON and ROBERPA. KEANE, traveled to Cambridgeshire,
England, to contact Mr. ALEXANDER EIST, Willow Cottage, 9 High
Street, West Wratting, Cambridgeshire, England, at his request.
EIST is the publican at the "Green Man" pub, Six Mile Bottom,
Cambridgeshire, England. EIST advised that he was formerly
employed by the Metropolitan Police, London, and has recently
retired.

During his employment with the Metropolitan Police, one of his assignments was to guard and escort JAMES EARL RAY who was arrested in London, England, in connection with the assassination of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING. EIST stated that during the approximately four months when RAY was incarcerated in England awaiting extradition to the United States it was EIST's assignment to be present in the cell with RAY and to escort him weekly to the court for remand hearings.

EIST advised that as a result of having spent so much time with RAY he developed a very close rapport and RAY became very talkative with him. RAY admitted that he had escaped from a Missouri prison by hanging on to the undercarriage of a prison laundry vehicle or garbage truck.

With regard to the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, RAY on many occasions admitted that he killed KING and on no occasion did RAY ever indicate that there was an accomplice with him, but rather he expressed and even bragged that he was proud of the fact that he alone was able to kill KING. RAY stated that the only mistake he made was that upon leaving the boarding house he was carrying the rifle he used to kill KING and spotted a police officer in the area. He subsequently dropped the rifle in the doorway to a shop and continued on his way, knowing full-well that his prints were on the weapon and that the investigation would subsequently lead to him.

RAY indicated that he was a loner and did not associate with anyone else and that the only person he received assistance from was his brother, believed by EIST to be his elder brother, and according to RAY his brother accompanied him on several robberies subsequent to his escape from the Missouri prison.

EIST stated that he had recently been in conversation with a U. S. Air Force major who is stationed in England and upon hearing that EIST was involved in the RAY case suggested that EIST should sell his story to a newsman. EIST advised that during his assignment with RAY he reported to his superiors any comments made by RAY and thus the appropriate authorities were in possession of all pertinent information. He did not desire to contact any newsmen regarding his story, however, was willing to be interviewed by any official authority regarding his association with RAY in England.

The above interview was conducted by Assistant Legal Attache DENNIS R. DICKSON, in the presence of Assistant Legal Attache ROBERT A. KEANE, on June 22, 1978.

Reference is made to Tampa memorandum dated July 2, 1974.

On December 12, 1975, Robert Thomas Wehunt, Jr., 3109 Hartnett Avenue, Tampa, Florida, telephonically contacted the Tampa Office of the FBI and advised that on December 12, 1975, Angel Castillo, a reporter for the "St. Petersburg Times," a daily newspaper published in St. Petersburg, Florida, had contacted Wehunt and had requested that Wehunt telephone collect to John Crewdson, a reporter for the "New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York. Mr. Wehunt advised that Castillo indicated that Crewdson should be contacted by telephone number 202-293-3100.

Wehunt advised that he subsequently contacted John Crewdson at the above-listed telephone number at which time Crewdson indicated that he desired to come to Tampa, Florida, to interview Wehunt concerning information that Wehunt had previously furnished to the FBI concerning three signed statements that Wehunt's father had obtained from convicts in the Fulton County Jail, Atlanta, Georgia, indicating that these convicts had been approached by very influential businessmen to kill Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. for \$100,000. Wehunt stated that from his conversation with John Crewdson it was obvious to him that Crewdson had obtained the results of the interview of Wehunt by an FBI Agent of the Tampa Office which interview took place on July 1, 1974. Wehunt advised that he did not give a definite answer to Crewdson but indicated that he would recontact Crewdson at which time he would furnish a definite answer.

Webunt advised that he desired to bring this to the attention of the FBI and he indicated that he planned to contact Angel Castillo and have Castillo contact Crewdson to notify Crewdson that Webunt did not desire to be interviewed inasmuch as Crewdson apparently had all of the information that Webunt had previously furnished to the FBI. In addition, Webunt advised that he was going to notify Castillo that he is fearful of his life if it becomes public knowledge that he furnished information to the FBI to the effect that very influential businessmen had plotted to kill Dr. King.

On December 17, 1975, Wehunt telephonically contacted the Tampa Office and advised that upon instructions from his attorney he had contacted John Crewdson telephonically and had advised Crewdson that he did not desire to be interviewed by Crewdson.

ROBERT THOMAS WEHUNT, JR., 3109 Hartnett Avenue, Tampa, Florida, personally appeared at the Tampa, Florida, Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was advised of the official identity of the interviewing Agent, the nature of the inquiry and that any information he furnished could be used in a court of law. He did not desire to furnish a signed statement but orally furnished the following information:

WEHUNT has been in the U. S. Air Force for the past six years, and he is presently a Staff Sergeant in the First Munition Maintenance Squadron at MacDill Air Force Base (AFB), Tampa, Florida. He recently read in the newspaper that JAMES EARL RAY, who was convicted of killing Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in 1968, is attempting to get a new trial and is stating that he wants to tell who was involved with him in this killing. This article reminded WEHUNT of information that he had received from his father, ROBERT THOMAS WEHUNT, SR., in 1968. WEHUNT furnished this information to his Commanding Officer, Major OZOL. Major OZOL referred WEHUNT to Colonel HOLMES of the Legal Office of MacDill AFB, who in turn referred WEHUNT to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Office in Tampa.

WEHUNT's father was a criminal investigator in the U. S. Army for 20 years. After his father retired from the Army, he worked as an investigator for Fidelofax, later for a bonding company and then for eight years as a guard at the Fulton County Jail, Atlanta, Georgia, up until his death in August, 1973.

Approximately two months after KING's death in 1968, WEHUNT's father showed WEHUNT, WEHUNT's mother, ALMA LOUISE WEHUNT, maiden name RALSTON, and WEHUNT's sister, JANET UPSHAW, maiden name WEHUNT, at least three signed statements that WEHUNT's father stated he had obtained from "hard-core" convicts in the Fulton County Jail. Each statement stated that these convicts had been approached by "very influential businessmen" to kill Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. for \$100,000.

At this time WEHUNT's father was a jailor and he told WEHUNT that these criminals furnished him this information and he took it from them in the form of signed statements. The father told WEHUNT that on one occasion he attempted to turn these statements over to proper authorities for investigation but that the father's life and that of his family were threatened, and the father told WEHUNT that he had decided to keep his mouth shut. The father did not tell WEHUNT to whom he had offered the statements or who had threatened the father.

The father formerly had these statements and other related papers at his house in Atlanta, Georgia, but after the father died in August, 1973, WEHUNT and his mother attempted to locate these papers but to date they have not located them. WEHUNT assumes that it is possible his father had a safe deposit box that no one has yet discovered and that possibly the statements and papers are contained in the safe deposit box.

WEHUNT cannot recall names of the individuals who furnished the statements or names of the "very influential businessmen", but these names were all contained in the statements.

WEHUNT doubts that his mother or sister would recall any additional information about the statements or that contained in the statements, and WEHUNT does not know of anyone else who has any information concerning these statements.

WEHUNT noted that shortly before the death of his father his father was an alcoholic and he had many girl friends and more money than he could have possibly been earning as a jail guard. WEHUNT, therefore, at that time surmised that it was possible that his father had been paid off by unknown individuals to remain quiet about the statements.

WEHUNT mentioned this story to his commanding officer about two months ago but the commanding officer did not give WEHUNT any response to it and WEHUNT dropped the matter at that time. WEHUNT brought this matter up at this time after reading the newspaper article about RAY and after thinking that if RAY talks possibly WEHUNT and his father's name might be brought up and there might be some danger to WEHUNT and

his family. WEHUNT noted that another reason that he never mentioned this story to anyone before is because he did not feel that anyone would believe him. WEHUNT advised that if he recalled any additional information or was able to develop any additional information he would immediately recontact the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
