Verson has been on probation since 8/31/67 on a local forgery charge. He purchased the Heme Service Laundry 1/15/68 and removed all cash and records, 3/25/68, failing to keep an appointment the same day to discuss payment for the laundry with the former owner. Although his present whereabouts are not yet known he has been placed in Les Angeles on 4/6/68.

The white hiustang owned by Eric S. Galt was located in Atlanta, 4/11/68, as a result of an inquiry made by local authorities to the FBI National Crime information Center. The car was in the parking area of a low class white housing project adjacent to the intersection of hiemorial Drive and Connally Street. The project has 795 apartments containing a total of 3,245 rooms.

Investigation established that the car was parked in Atjanta between 8:30 a. m. and 9:00 a. m., 4/5/68, by a white male, 5' II", 165 pounds, neatly dressed in a suit, possibly blue. He walked away after locking the car. He had no hat, did not wear glasses, and carried no luggage. One witness saw him refer to a small notebook about three by five inches in size.

When Galt purchased this car in Birmingham, \$/39/67, the edometer reading was about 26,000; it is now 39/100. Stickers on the car show it was serviced by Cert Fex Ford Company, Hellywood, California, no date given; was serviced by Beckman Chevron Service, Les Angeles, 2/13/68, mileage: 34/85; and an efficial Mexican tourist sticker indicates the car has been in Mexico.

In the trunk were various items of clothing and bedding, four floor coats, an air filter cartridge, a heating knife and toble. Also found in the trunk was a piece of cardboard tern from a paper tissue box on which is written "Ginger and Anita Katswinkel, 1535 Surane, Apt. 6." Below the address appear two words believed to be "Olkahombe" and "Broult." The word "day" is written above the words "Ginger and Anita."

I informed the original manager so I am enclosing the keys. I made a deposit on keys but as I lost one will forfit deposit. Sincerely." The letter was signed Eric S. Galt. This letter is being flown to the FBI Laboratory.

Apartment six at the above address is presently rented to Jennie Morgan who has lived there since 2/12/68. She has no knowledge Galt or the Katswinkels. The information operator at Los Angeles reported a listing for Anita Katswinkel, 1831 North Gramercy Place, but it has been determined this telephone was disconnected 4/8/68. The ceross listing directory shows Anita Katswinkel as residing in apartment 303. This apartment was occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas M. Flikeid beginning in October, 1967. They paid rent 4/1/68 saying they were moving within thirty days and on 4/5/68 the manager found a note in the apartment indicating they had moved out.

Every possible lead is being immediately covered in Los Angeles to locate the Katzwinkels and to develop further information on Galt. Atlanta is also baking every possible effort to trace Galt's movements.

There is no record of Ginger or Anita Katzwinkel in Bureau indices or the Identification Division.



The general observation of these Agents following the above review is that there is no strong evidence to date to rule out the possibility of the suspect as some type of "illegal." In fact, there are many parallels in the known activities of Eric Starvo Galt, the suspect that coincides with the modus operandi of an "illegal agent." Mainly these are: 1. Suspect has led a "nomad" type of existence, selecting low-class rooming type residences. 2. He apparently did not settle in one remidence for a prolong period of time. His personal belongings are of a type suggesting a "travel light" existence. 4. In contrast to the above he had no money problems. His extensive utilization of twenty-dollar bills. 6. His renting of a safe deposit bestound infrequent visits to the box. 7. His general behavior, in that his conduct was such not to draw attention to himself. 8. His documentation to identity of Galt and backing this up with a driver's license and registration of automobile. 9. His reference to past employments, et cetera, all of which lead to a dead end. Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan RE: WURKIN

The known facts in regard to the movements and activities of suspect, Galt, strongly suggest premeditated planning, back-stopping of identity and financing as of at least August, 1967.

In the event subject is an "illegal" type, the following investigation should be considered, if in fact it has not been to date.

- 1. Check at points of entry (or departure) from U.S., with Immigration and Haturalisation Service, Customs, airlines, ot cetera, for documentary evidence or personal rememberance of all known usnes of suspect as well as description and artist conception. This check should cover a period of at least 90 days prior to August. 1967.
- 2. Check of rental car agencies and driver schools in cities and environs of points of entry.
- 3. Check of low-class rooming-type establishments in above areas.
- 4. Check of banking institutions for personal accounts and safe deposit box rentals.
- 5. Check of transportation facilities for outgoing transportation from point of entry cities to Birmingham, Los Angeles or Philadelphia.
- 6. Check of gun retailers in point of entry cities and other known cities where suspect might have visited.
- Check of banking institutions in cities known or suspected suspect visited.
  - 8. Check of restal car agencies is above locations.
- 9. Comparison of known movements of King to known movements of suspect.
- 10. Thorough and exhaustive Laboratory examination of all physical evidence to determine origin and distribution of this material including time factors is regard to distribution.
- 11. Display of artist conception and description of suspect to all security-type informants, particularly those aware of Cuban-Castro elements.
- 12. Request RCMP and Mexican authorities to check points of entries (and departures) of suspect (names, artist conception and description).
- 13. Check Passport records, Department of State, on suspect's names.

The photograph of John Wilson, believed to be an illegal agent, was furnished to Division Six for display to individuals who have had personal contact with suspect.

It is further recommended that all pertinent information developed on suspect be furnished to Division Five for review until such time as facts suggest suspect is not an illegal intelligence agent.

# LATENT PRINT EXAMINATION

At 10:30 P.M., on 4/10/68, a Birmingham agent delivered safe deposit box #5517 from Birmingham Trust National Bank, together with a rifle box and box of ammunition from Aeromarine Supply Company. Also delivered were finger-prints of six bank employees.

Three latent fingerprints and two latent palm prints were developed on safe deposit box. No latent prints on other items.

Latent prints on safe deposit box are not identical with latent prints previously reported this case or with fingerprints of bank employees. These latent prints are being compared with prints of all suspects named to date and you will be advised of results.

Latent fingerprint previously reported on Birmingham National Bank form "Contract for Safe Deposit Box" has been identified as a fingerprint of bank auditor Charles T. Smith. Latent fingerprint on bank form "Record of Access to Safe Deposit Box #5517" is not identical with fingerprints of bank employees.
