

Investigation to date has determined that no record could be located with the Kansas City, No. Police Department regarding a robbery of SAMUEL SCHNEIDERMAN, and investigation at Richmond, Ill., has indicated there is no such address as 6535 Hoad Rd., and no record of a SAMUEL SCHNEIDERNAN. 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





The following investigation was conducted by SA ROWEN B. AYERS and IC WILLIAM C. MC DONALD:

At Jefferson City, Missouri:

On 7/8/68, MARY MOODY, Secretary to Warden HAROLD SWENSON, said a bound book reflecting visits by attorneys, law enforcement officers and others on official business for September, 1960 had bee located. She noted that no regular visit record is maintained, except in individual prisoner's files and these are for persons authorized by the prison to visit inmates and these records do not apply to persons on official business.

On 7/9/68, the Control Center, Official Visitors' Book was examined. There was no person by the name of GRAY making a visit to a prisoner during the months of August, September, or October, 1960.

Although there was no record of a visit by an FBI Agent to a prisoner in September of 1980, entries are not always made where officer is known to prison official.

An examination was made, in the Classification Office, of prisoners received. They are given a book number in consecutive order as they are received. A total of 231 inmates were received into the penitentiary during the months of August and September of 1960.

Mr. DONALD BUNKER, Classification Director, said the average inmate stays in "receiving" or "classification section" from four to six weeks as a general rule, but he said some conditions might arise which would result in turning a prisoner into the population before four weeks and also some reason might exist for not completing their classification in six weeks.

Senior Resident Agent SA ROWEN B. AYERS and SA THOMAS H. WEAVER, assigned to Jefferson City Resident Agency during pertinent period have no recollection of such an interview and no SA GRAY has been assigned to the Kansas City Division. It is more likely that the writer was interviewed by an agency other than the FBI.

In view of the admitted hazy recollection and above facts, it does not appear that an indices search of all inmates received during the three moth period would be warranted.

UACE no further action being taken by the Kansas City Division regarding this letter.

PAUL J. DENNIS, Vice-President, Vicksburg Mid River Service, Inc. advised on 7/5/68, that (FNU) WILLETT owned a houseboat known as the "Nell Willie", a diesel-powered ship capable of travel on the Mississippi. (FNU) WILLETT was described as an elderly man who was crippled and used a cane. He and his wife, whose name is believed to be NELL, took vacation trips on his houseboat approximately twice a year, securing the services of a Mississippi River pilot to operate the boat for them. (FNU) WILLETT is believed to have died approximately two years ago. He is believed to have been a resident of the State of Arkansas and to have docked his houseboat at the Greenville, Miss. Yacht Club.

WILLIE SMITH, a Negro male employee of the Greenville, Miss. Yacht Club, advised on 7/5/68, that the correct name of the houseboat is the "Nell Willis" and that it was owned by a (FNU) WILLIS, who died about two or three years ago. NELL WILLIS, wife of (FNU) WILLIS, is still living and

HE ADVISED HE KUEL HE WAS BEING INTERVIEWED CONCERNING STATEMENTS HE FADE IN A LETTER HE HAD HAILED TO HA. SANDERS OF RECNY WASFZIWE. CURTIS STATED HE WAS MERELY TRYING TO SELL A STORY TO REGNY FOR APPROXIMATELY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS TO HELP HIS MOTHER PAY OFF A MORTGACE ON HER HOME, WHICH SHE MORIGAGED TO CETAIN ATTURNEY FELS FOR HIS DEFENSE. AT FIRST HE STATED, WITH REFERENCE TO THESE STATEMENTS, THATSER HE AND JAMES EARL RAY PULLED A CRIME IN FIFTYFOUR, WRICH WAS A BURGLARY IN JULIET, ILL., IN COT, OR NOV., FIFTYFY AL Idls Polki II WAS POINTED OUT TO CURTIS THAT CHRTA/MIN

STATEMENTS NADE BY HIM IN HIS LETTER TO FBONY COULD POSSIBLY INVOLVE HIN IN A CONSPIRACY WITH MAY CONCERNING THE KILLING OF LARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. CURTIS CATAGORICALLY LENIED THE FOLLOWING STATEMENTS WHICH WERE IN HIS LETTER TO EBONY OF GAZINE:

- 1. THAT HE AND JAMES EARL RAY PULLED A CRIME IN
  - 2. THAT RAY WANTED THE JOB OF KILLING KING.
- 3. THAT HE AND RAY TALKEL ABOUT KILLING KING FOR THREE YEARS.
- A. THAT THEY TALKED TO THE MAN FROM MISSISSIPPI THAT MNIM ALL ABOUT THE KK BUSIMESSMANS ASSOCIATION THAT WAS TO PUT UP THE MONEY TO KILL KING.
  - 5. THAT HE KNEW THE MEN FROM MISSISSIPPI.
- S. FOR THREE YEARS, THAT HE AND RAY MADE MAPS JUST TO FIND THE RIGHT PLACE TO KILL KING AND THAT HE HAD MADE THE MAPS OVER HIMSELF.
- 7. HE AND RAY KNEW JUST WHERE THEY WOULD GO AFTER THE KILLING OF KING.

9. THAT THERE ARE NEW IN FIVE STATES THAT ARE BEHIND THE KINE KILLING AND THAT DO NOT KNOW WHAT HE KNOWS.

DURING THE INTERVIEW, CURTIS DREW CHUDE MAPS SETTING OUT HOW HE THOUGHT RAY WOULD STALK KING. THIS MAP SHOWED THE FOLLOWING TOWNS WHERE HE SAID KING MADE MOST OF HIS SPEECHES: ATLANTA, LITTLE ROCK, BIRKINGHAM, MOBILE, SELWA, JACKSON, VICKSBURGS, "MISS., AND MARKS, MISS. HE FURTHER POINTED OUT THERE WAS A MAN LIVING ON A HOUSEBOAT IN VICKSBURG ON THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER (WHOSE FIRST NAME HE KNEW BUT WOULD KCT DIVULGED. THIS MAN WAS TO TAKE RAY DOWN THE RIVER. ON HIS EVAT TO NEW ORLEANS AFTER THE KILLING. HE STATED IN THE PAST HE (CURTIS) HAD PULLED SEVERAL BURGLARY AND ARMED ACEBERIES (HE WOULD NOT COMMENT ON PARTICULARS) IN YOURS ALONG THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER AND WHILE POLICE WERE LOCKING FOR HIM ON THE HIGHWAY HE WOULD BE ON A BOAT DOWN THE MISSISSIPPI. HE FUNTHER STATED HE HAD WRITTEN A STORY CONCERNING THE KING KILLING WHICH WAS CURRENTLY CUT BEING TYPED AND IT WAS THE STORY HE MENTIONED IN THE LETTER TO BEOMY AND INTENDED TO SELL TO EBONY.

SHERIFF G. T. MAULDIN, NA, WHO IS SHERIFF OF WHITFIELD CG., GA., AND OPERATES THE COUNTY JAIL, ADVISED CURTIS HAD SENT NO LETTERS OR COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE JAIL WHICH WENT OVER THE JAILERS DESK. HE SAID CURTIS WOULD PROBABLY SEND ALL MAIL OUT WITH VISITORS AND JAIL TRUSTEES AND WOULD PACEABLY NOT HAVE BEEN OBSERVED BY MEN OF HIS DEPT. IT IS FURTHER POINTED OUT THAT CURTIS' ATTORNEY, ERWIN MITCHELL, FORMER U.S. CONGRESSMAN FOR THE SEVENTH DISTRICT OF GA., IS OF THE OPINION THAT MOST OF CURTIS' COMMENTS CONCERNING HIS KNOWLEDGE OF RAY'S ASSASSINATION OF KING ARE PURE FABRICATIONS ON THE PART OF CURTIS OR AS A RESULT OF SOMETHING CURTIS HAS READ IN LOCAL PAPERS.

APPROXIMATELY ONE HOUR AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE INTERVIEW WITH CURTIS, HE SENT A NOTE TO SHERIFF G. T. NAULDIN REQUESTING TO AGAIN SEE AN FEI AGENT, THAT HE NOW WANTED TO TELL THE ENTIRE TRUTH. CURTIS WAS AGAIN INTERVIEWED BY SA THOMAS R. HENRY, JR., AND AGAIN FURNISHED A FIGHTS FORM WHICH HE REFUSED TO SIGN. HE THEN STATED THAT APPARENTLY IN HIS LETTER TO EBONY HE USED. THE WORK "JE" INDICATING THAT HE AND JAMES TAEL FAY HAD PLANNED THE KING MURDER WHICH ACULD INVOLVE HIM IN A CONSYLRACY AND FOR END PAGE FOUR

THAT REASON HE DENIED THE STATEMENTS IN LETTER TO EBONY. THEN ADVISED HE HAD WRITTEN A STORY WHICH HE INTENLED TO SELL TO SUME MAGAZINE FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING MONEY FOR HIS LOTHER WHICH STORY WAS STILL IN HIS POSSESSION AND WHICH HE HAD NOT YET SENT OUT TO BE TYPED. HE ALLOWED SA HENRY TO READ THIS APPROXIMATELY TWENTY PAGE STORY, HANDWRITTEN, THE PAGE AT A TIME. HE DECLARED THIS STORY WAS TRUE. THE FIRST FIVE OR SIX PAGES OF THIS STORY MERELY SET OUT HIS EARLY LIFE IN CRIME AND THE PRISON SENTENCES HE HAD SERVED AS A RESULT OF THESE CRIMES FROM THE AGE OF FIFTEEN. THE REMAINDER OF THE STORY IS THE SAME AS WAS SET FORTH IN THE ONIGINAL INTERVIEW WITH CURTIS IN APAIL, SIXTYEIGHT CONCERNING HIS KNOWLEDGE AND ASSOCIATION WITH RAY. THIS STORY DOES REFLECT THAT HE FIRST EECAHE ASSOCIATED WITH RAY IN FIFTYFOUR WEN THEY PULLED A PAYROLL HEIST IN QUINCY, ILL., WITH A TANK THIRD INDIVIDUAL. SHORTLY THEREAFTER, HE LOST CONTACT WITH RAY WMEN HE AND THIS THIRD INDIVIDUAL WERE CAUGHT IN A FIFTY-SIX THOUSAND DOLLAR BANK ROBBERY AT SOUTHWEST CITY, NO. AFTER THAT HE AGAIN BECAME ACQUAINTED WITH RAY IN PRISON AND WHILE IN PRISON THEY BOTH LEARNED OF THE DEATH OF END PAGE MIVE

PRESIDENT JOHN F. KERNEDY. RAY THEN STATED IT SCURDED LIKE A BIG JOB AND HE WAS ALWAYS ON THE INSIDE OR A PRISON WHEN BIG JOBS AND BIG MOREY WERE TO BE HAD.

SHORILY AFTER. THE EEATH OF JOHN F. KENNEDY, MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR ., SECAME PROMINENT AND RAY STATED ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS THAT SCHEBODY WAS GOING TO KILL KING. THE STORY WENT ON TO REFLECT THAT DURING THIS PERIOD AN INDIVIDUAL CAME INTO THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY AT JEFFERSON CITY FROM VICKSBURG, 1155., AND WHC, UPON LEARNING OF JAMES EARL RAY'S FEELINGS TOWARD KILLING KING, ADVISED HIR OF THE KK BUSINESSMEN ASSOCIATION OF THE SOUTH AND OF THE FACT THAT PEOPLE IN FIVE STATES WERE PUTITION UP LONEY FOR KING'S ASSASSINATION. THE STORY PURTHER POINTED GUT THAT RAY INFORMED HIM THAT HE INTENDED TO HAVE EVERY-THING SET WHEN HE KILLED KING AND THAT RAY, THROUGH MAPS, LEARNED OF KING'S MOVEMENTS SO HE COULD LATER STALK HIM TO THE POINT OF ASSASSINATION. THE STORY FURTHER POINTED CUT THAT RAY ADVISED HE WOULD LEAVE A FALSE GUN. AND FALSE TRAIL INMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE MURDER. RAY WAS SUPPOSED TO EKD PAGE SIX

GO TO VICKSBURG FOLLOWING THE MURDER, CONTACT THE MAN FROM VICKSBURG, MISS., WHO HAD THE HOUSEBOAT, AND THIS MAN WAS TO TAKE HIM FITHER TO NEW ORLEANS OR CANADA VIA THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER.

HE MCULENOT TESTIFY TO ANY OF THE ABOVE. HE DID ADVISE IN STRICTEST CONFIDENCE THAT THE NAME OF THE INDIVIDUAL ON THE HOUSEBOAT IN VICKSBURG, MISS., WAS CAMED THE THE MASSESSIPPI WHO SERVED WITE IN THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY.

THE STORY ALSO MENTIONED A MAN FROM NEW CREENS WHO COULD CETAL ANY KIND OF IDENTIFICATION AND CURTIS

LATER IDENTIFIED THIS DAN AS JOE COTA, WHICH INFORMATION HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN SET OUT IN AN INTERVIEW WITH CURTIS.

THROUGHOUT THE INTERVIEW WITH CURTIS, AND WHILL READING CURTIS' STORY, HE CONTINUED TO EMPHASIZE THE FACT THAT HE WOULD NOT TESTHEY AGAINST RAY AS HE FEARED FOR HIS LIFE.

HE INDICATED THAT ANY STATE PRISON HE WAS SENT TO WOULD PROBABLY HAVE INDIVIDUALS WHO WOULD KILL HIM AS A RESULT OF PREVIOUS INFORMATION HE FURNISHED THE PRESS AND TO MEDIA AND IT IS FELT HE WAS USING THIS AS AN EXCUSE AS TO WHY HE END PAGE SEVEN
