KATZWINKEL was then asked if she normally gave her name and address to her customers. She stated that she did not. She then advised that it was possible that she had given her name and address to a Negro male by the name of TOM WASHINGTON, whom she met at a bowling alley on two occasions. This bowling alley is located on Hollywood Boulevard. Both she and NANCE used to hang out at this bowling alley and this Negro man bowled in a league on either a Tuesday or a Thursday evening. He also drove a white Mustang convertible. KATZWINKEL further described this man as about 30 years of age, light complected, but she did not know where he was employed. She also advised that she never dated this man but did think it possible that she might have given her name and address to him.

KATZWINKEL was then shown an artist's conception of ERIC GALT and photographs of J. VERNON. She stated that she has never seen either of these two individuals. She was then shown the colored photograph of a green colored bedspread and stated that this did not mean anything to her.

When asked if she could furnish any further information regarding the above matter, KATZWINKEL stated that she could not; however, if she did recall anything as a result of these interviews, she would immediately contact the FBI Office.

His parents were occupied for a few months during the summer of 1967 as managers of the apartment building at 1831 North Gramercy Place, Los Angeles. He said he previously resided at Bemidji and Leech Lake, Minnesota.

He said that he did not recognize the names of "GINGER," ANITA KATZWINKEL, ERIC GALT, or JEROME WALLIS VERNON (or JAY VERNON), as anyone that he had ever heard of, much less as residents of 1831 North Gramercy Place, Los Angeles.

Photographs of JEROME WALLIS VERNON were exhibited to him, and he was unable to make an identification.

JENNIE MORGAN, Apartment 6, 1535 Serrano, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed in connection with her knowledge of ERIC GALT. She provided the following information:

She stated she is the wife of GERALD ALTON MORGAN, Warrant Officer, United States Army, presently in Vietnam. She stated she and her four year old son, JERRY, moved into Apartment 6 at this address on February 12, 1968. She stated the apartment was not clean in that various Los Angeles newspapers were lying around on the floor. A telephone was in the apartment but was not in service. No letters or other material were left lying around indicating the identity of the former tenant. Only one letter was received by her at this address which was not addressed to her. This letter, apparently addressed to a former tenant, was returned to the Post Office Department. She stated she did not know if this letter was from out of state nor can she recall to whom it was addressed or the name and address of the sender. She denied knowing ERIC GALT or ever hearing of him. She stated that she and her husband did own a 1965 Pontiac Le Mans, which was recently repossessed by the Security First National Bank. She stated she is employed as an Inhalation Therapist at the Physical Therapy Department of Westside Hospital, 910 Fairfax, Los Angeles, California. She denied being known as GINGER, claiming that only one person has ever called her by this nickname, that was the wife of a serviceman in Germany. She denied knowing anyone by the name of ANITA or SUE.

Her home telephone number is 213-462-8353. She said that she had resided at this location, in an apartment on the first floor, for about one year. She said the name of ERIC GALT was completely unfamiliar to her. She knew of no one by that name as having been a resident of Apartment #6, 1535 North Serrano, which apartment is across the hall and slightly to the left of her own apartment.

She said that about six months previously she had observed a dark-haired adult male white man residing in Apartment #6. She estimated that it had been at least six months since she had seen him. She said that once since that time she saw a white woman wearing a white uniform, which appeared to be a nurse's uniform, come from that apartment. That woman had a small boy with her. It was BOHENING's impression that this youngster was in need of medical attention. She did not know the names of any of these individuals.

She said she had never seen the above-mentioned white male at the swimming pool.

LILLIAN BOHENING stated that she herself was not employed at the present time. She stated that she shares this apartment with her fiancé, ROBERT TAYLOR (who was not present during this interview).

Mrs. MARGARITA (FRANK) POWERS, 6421 Western Avenue, Buena Park, California (telephone 714-522-7440), was interviewed at her residence on April 12, 1968, at which time she furnished the following information:

She was, together with her husband, FRANK POWERS, the manager of the apartment building at 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles (Hollywood), California, from July 1967, to December 15, 1967. During the time she managed the apartment building, she and her family resided in apartment 12-A, on the first floor of the building.

She recalled that during a day of bad weather in November 1967, Mr. ERIC GALT came to the building and said that he was seeking an apartment to rent. He said that he had seen a vacancy sign out in front of the building, and was seeking an apartment that he could rent immediately. She said that a bachelor apartment (apartment number 6) on the first floor of the building was available. She showed it to him and he said he would take it.

Mr. GALT explained that he was normally employed as a salesman; and that he had left applications for positions as a salesman with several firms. He asked if it would be permissible for him to use her telephone until he could get one installed. She said that it would. He did not receive any telephone calls over her phone; nor did he ever use it following that first encounter, to the best of her recollection.

Mrs. POWERS said that as his apartment only had one chair in it; she made arrangements to get another chair for him. The day she took the extra chair to his room she saw he had a telephone installed in the apartment.

Mrs. POWERS said that Mr. GALT paid her in cash, one hundred dollars basic monthly rent, plus twenty-five dollars fee for cleaning the apartment, plus a two dollar and fifty cent key deposit. Mr. GALT was instructed, by Mrs. POWERS, that he could use the apartment building's utilities for the first three days; but that during that time he should go to the utility companies and make personal arrangements

to have the utilities for his apartment installed in his own name. Some time after the three day grace period had lapsed, Mrs. POWERS learned that Mr. GALT had not gone to the utility companies and had not made the arrangements for installation of utilities in his own name. Mrs. POWERS said when she learned this she contacted Mr. DALE DYKEMA, the court-appointed receiver managing the financial affairs of the apartment building, and obtained permission for Mr. GALT to continue use of the building's utilities upon payment of an additional ten dollar payment. It was her understanding that Mr. GALT would be expected to make such an additional payment above his basic \$100.00 basic rent on a monthly basis.

Mrs. POWERS said she never saw GALT have any visitors, nor did he have anyone living with him in Apartment #6, to the best of her knowledge. She did not know him to have any employment; and he did not mention to her the names of any of the firms he allegedly had placed applications with for jobs. He was a very quiet tenant, and did not mix with the other occupants of the building. She did not recall Mr. GALT ever using the swimming pool at the apartment.

He drove a small white car, make or model not recalled by Mrs. POWERS. He parked it in the basement and usually walked to the nearby shopping areas. Mrs. POWERS said she had the distinct impression that his car did not have California license tags; as she recalls seeing it on several occasions when there was some discussion as to whether it was parked in the space in the basement garage allotted to Apartment number six.

Mrs. POWERS said she recalled putting Mr. GALT's name up on the apartment directory posted near the front entrance to the building. He did not object; but she said it was possible that he never noticed it posted there.

Mrs. POWERS said that she had filled out a rent receipt for Mr. GALT, when she first rented him the room. She said that she and her husband moved from the apartment building on Serrano approximately December 15, 1967, and so did not take any more rent payments from Mr. GALT, who was still residing in Apartment 6, when they moved to Buena Park, California.

Mrs. POWERS furnished the green "Stub-Tite" Receipt Book (made by the Springfield Photo Mount Co., Holyoke, Massachusetts), which

contained stubs of rent receipts for 1535 Serrano, Los Angeles, covering the period of May 1, 1967, through November 25, 1967. She pointed out that the receipt stub for November 19, 1967, made out in favor of Mr. ERIC GALT, was prepared by her. This particular receipt stub contained the following information:

She said she had no records for this residence regarding former tenants as the building has been in receivership and these records are maintained by DALE L. DYKEMA, 3335 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles. She stated she recalled seeing the tenant of Apartment 6, 1535 North Serrano Avenue on several occasions during January 1968 but did not know his name nor did she ever collect rent from him. When she purchased the building and prior to assuming ownership, she moved to 1530 North Serrano Avenue to oversee the building at 1535 North Serrano Avenue for her best future interest.

Mrs. BERNHARDT described the individual who resided in Apartment 6, 1535 North Serrano Avenue during January 1968 as 5' 10", thin face, high cheek bones, triangular shaped face, dark brown hair, 28 to 33 years of age, and "forlorn" in appearance.
